#### NEWSLETTER FOR JANUARY 1977

A number of Members have queried the progress of the Long-Range Plan which had earlier been scheduled for presentation in October. Apologies are due to the Membership for the unfortunate delay caused by difficulties in getting information, designs and estimates in on time. The overall task has proved for more complicated than originally envisaged.

It is now hoped that the Sub-Committee's conclusions and recommendations will be put to Members in January 1977, Without going into details here, the overall renovation and development cost, taking into account all suggestions and requests made by Section Sub-Committees, has been estimated in excess of Bht. 6 million at present-day prices. This clearly indicates that the work, if agreed upon, will take a number of years to complete and the cost suggests that, in any case, there will need to be an upward revision of Membership dues to ensure that we are in a position to finance and repay sums borrowed. The time scale will depend on the annual surplus cash funds generated.

In the meantime, following investigations made for the Long-Range Plan it is clear that renovation of the main Club building has to be a priority. Rising damp and dry rot have previously been mentioned, and it is now clear that the electrical wiring must be renewed for safety reasons: these can fortunately be handled on a "room-by-room" basis. Since we have to strip each room on the ground floor it would be preferable to re-decorate in accordance with any Long-Range Plan adopted. It must be apparent that the state of the floor indicates that the Main Bar needs urgent renovation: as January is historically the slackest month of the year, the General Committee has decided to start on that room in January to cause least inconvenience to Members; the Bar will be relocated while this work is being completed.

Other priority considerations are the kitchen facility in the Clubhouse and the serving facility at the Poolside. Both facilities are currently stretched to their limit and early action must be taken to provide better work-flow if the standard of service is to be maintained or, hopefully, improved.

While considering what collateral the Club might have to provide to borrow funds for development and what authority the General Committee might have from the Members to borrow sums required, our "internal" legal advisors discovered that the Thai version (the only legal version) of the Club Constitution and Rules and Bylaws registered with the Authorities apparently goes back to 1940: while the various amendments since that date have been sent to the Registrar in an English version, the Thai language version has never been updated. It is proper that we should correct this and this will necessitate holding an Extraordinary General Meeting and confirmatory EGM. Details will be given to Members in due course, along with additional changes to the Constitution which the General Committee wish to propose.


