



# PAST PARTICIPLE Auspicium Melioris Ævi

We look back to the history of our Club in 2007 ...

As reported last month, 2006 ended with the closing of the old Lord's Dining Room, an event which started alarm bells to ring with some members over the integrity of the entire Development project. On January 1st (at exactly 5pm as requested) a motion signed by seven members was presented to the Honorary Secretary calling for an Extraordinary General Meeting of members under rule 25. The motion read: "No development works are to be commenced on site until a proper, transparent and competitive tender has been carried out to engage a contractor". The rationale put by the concerned members outlined that in their view the design and construct contract was deficient in very many respects (for example being without a firm contract sum or a completion date), was unreasonably biased in favour of the contractor, had few of the usual liability clauses which were necessary to protect the Club's interests and was awarded without a competitive tender.

The Chairman of the General Committee met with two representatives of the concerned members and allowed them access to club documentation but the GC insisted that work having started must continue. The EGM was thus called for Wednesday 31st January and despite good presentations and careful arguments on both sides, a massive 141 proxies had been mustered which outnumbered the 79 members present and thus the motion fell by 175 votes to 45.

The first part of the development to open was the 'new' Churchill Bar on Monday 19th February 2007 with H.E. David Fall, the British Ambassador, invited to do the honours. It quickly became apparent however that the Bar would not be ready at 7pm, nor 7.30pm, or 8pm ... in fact as an attempt to open the Bar was made at 8.15pm, builders were still laying carpets, sticking tiles to the bar surround and drilling holes in






the bar-top for beer taps [see insert]. For those members who knew David Fall he was guite a fun guy, renowned for his 'Modern Major General' performance and thus he spent the embarrassing period on the microphone telling jokes .... Did you hear the one about Winston Churchill and his principal private secretary?

The Churchill Bar did finally open to the aromas of glue and fresh paint and members were welcomed to their collective total amazement by ... a flight of steps ... contrary to the drawings, which had been signed off by the project manager, the bar floor had not been lowered to its pre-1967 flood level ... and that was only the first of many surprises ... members were greeted by a ply-wood bar-top with black & white tiled surround, red bar stools, TV antenna style wine glass holders above two sides of the bar, temporary curtains, red panelling decorated by a few of the old bar pictures [see insert] but none of the ship and club plaques or other memorabilia that made the old Churchill Bar and missing also were the wonderful Chesterfield sofas that graced the old Bar (the Chesterfields were eventually found rotting where the contractor had left them, in the old 'rubbish area' to the back of the clubhouse kitchens). The bar was so incomplete, in fact, was that it closed for two days on 27th February, again in April and in June and finally in July for remedial works to be undertaken.

Members were exceedingly unhappy with the bar and to many it was the final blow against the century long male domination of the Club. One member not to take it lying down was the late Steve Eaton ("Swampy") who insisted on a beer on the 'real' Churchill Bar the next day despite it being demolished around him [see insert].

In the light of the EGM and the disastrous opening of the Churchill Bar and with no sign of 'stage two' being close to ready the General Committee accepted a number of constitutional changes at the Annual General Meeting to help prevent any future repeat of the situation:

• A limit was placed on the amount that could be signed off by the General Manager and the General Committee on any project and these limits had to be agreed annually at each AGM.



- A new rule was created to ensure all large contracts resulted from a fair, transparent and competitive tender with a minimum of three companies wherever possible.
- A second rule stated that if the above conditions cannot be met, the General Committee must record in the minutes the reasons for an exception being made, and notify members accordingly by posting on the notice board.
- And finally a list would be held in the office of all capital expenditure contracts awarded by the Club, and this shall be open to inspection upon request by any member

These rules apply today and have been adhered to on all projects since then (as far as the author can ascertain). The General Committee, however, was still feeling miffed at the Extraordinary General Meeting being called and had put forward and passed the raising of the minimum number of members required to call an EGM to 20 members (up from seven) and thus, and sadly, no Extraordinary General Meeting under rule 25 has been called since that date.

Stage 2 of the Development was the new contemporary, bright, clean, family outlet which was named 'The Verandah' on 4th February after a member's competition. This also failed to meet its 'ready to open deadline' of 20th April. It was quickly discovered that it too looked nothing like the agreed drawings and much additional works were needed. A revised 'opening date' of 31st May was missed and it was then found out that Khet Bangrak (our local government district) had refused Building Control permission for the proposed extension onto the back lawn due to submission of inadequate paperwork by the contractor. June came and went, and by mid-July the whole contract was in crisis with the contractors demanding more money and most of the work still not done. In fact by this point in time 90% of the maximum budget stated had already been paid by the Club but no actual valuation of the work had been carried out.

Fortunately for the Club a number of qualified members came to the rescue including ironically several members who authored the January EGM motion warning the Club that 'things were incredibly wrong'. A highly charged meeting between all parties concerned soon realised that we had been conned. The General Committee thus agreed to dismiss the contractor and the consultant project manager and appoint two new companies to complete the works. The plan was to create from the mess the best format that could be rescued and so The Verandah in a useable format finally opened on 30th October.

In 2008, after all had died down, a report entitled 'The Expensive Learning Curve' commissioned from a qualified member highlighted that the Club had over-paid for work done by 2,350,000 Baht, that 507,770 Baht had to be paid out to 'rescue' The Verandah and an additional 1,001,276 Baht paid out to replace substandard materials and workmanship e.g. the Churchill Bar's ply-wood counter and tiled floor, and finally 430,757 Baht was spent replacing the unusable furniture already paid for in The Verandah. To misquote Winston Churchill "This was not our finest hour".

Of course, 2007 was a not one big disaster as lots of good things did happen ... the Tanglin Club and the Singapore Cricket Club both challenged our Club to play the dice game Balut, almost unheard of by us, and we managed to win both home tournaments and so founded the Club's Balut section; and in March Dr. Stuart Blacksell, an Australian, became first non-British Chairman of the General Committee.

A mass of other matters also happened in 2007: in April the Snooker table was replaced by a Pool table as a oneyear trial; the CEO resigned in July and was replaced in the September by Michael Silcock (previously at the Mulgrave Country Club, Victoria, Australia); the 'new' Churchill Bar opening hours were reduced to 1am due to lack of patronage; all nineteen volumes of post-WWII minutes were bound and copied for reference purposes; membership declined to 1,029; and finally there was uproar in the Tennis Section over repeated failures to repair lighting, maintain the Astroturf on Courts 2 & 3 and properly fund the section ... but boy were they in for a shock in 2008 .... and you'll have to wait until next month to see what happened!





#### **Everything You Should Know About Playing Tennis**

by Harold Mollin

#### THE RETURN OF SERVE

This is one of the most important strokes in tennis, and to "win more" you will need this information. Whether you are a beginner, intermediate, or tournament player, follow this advice and I quarantee you more "wins under your belt".

First of all, remember the following "saying" when you are starting to return serve during the match.

"PLAY OR PAY"

Which means when your opponent hits his 1st serve, you must get it "in play", but when your opponent hits his 2nd serve, "make him pay for it"!

That means attack the 2nd serve, but keep the return out of the net!

Now, as your opponents hit their practice serves during the "warm up" watch them carefully to get some idea of the "timing" of their toss (how high), and any "clue" as to direction they are hitting the serve.

You should watch the server's toss, and the way the racket meets the ball - then see the direction the ball went! This might give you a clue from the toss and motion as to where the ball is headed in the service box.

Try to "return" a few to get the "bounce" correct on the court you are playing!!

Then, always remember to ......

- 1. Move your feet when you are returning serve. Try to get your body moving forward on each return. This will also help you relax and not "freeze" on important returns (break points).
- 2. Bend your knees getting ready for the serve.

- 3. Make sure before the server hits the ball, pick a spot you want your return to go. This way, it takes one decision away immediately - and makes it easier just to make contact.
- 4. When in doubt go crosscourt! This is the lowest portion of the net (over the middle), so the easiest to have the return clear the net, and you have "more court" to hit!

And, if you find yourself having to return a huge booming serve, do the following:

- 1. Change where you are standing: You should try to return serve "way back" behind the baseline - and I do mean "way back. What moving back also does is "change the servers" perspective of the court size and probably will make their serve
  - "go off" (start to miss 1st serves). Not only that, but when they see you standing "way back" they will slow the pace of his serve since he feels he can't serve it by you.
- 2. Perfect, because you have accomplished what you wanted!! You've gotten you opponents to not only hit the serve slower, but where you are now standing permits you to have more time to return the serve.
- 3. Remember, anytime you get your opponents to "change a winning game plan" during the match - you are already moving towards victory!


# **BCGS GOLFING NEWS**
