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

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MESSAGE FROM the Chairman

The beautiful cool season weather has continued well into January and the Club has been buzzing with activity, especially at weekends. 420 Members turned up for Christmas lunch and on a balmy afternoon several tables were still celebrating on the Back Lawn as guests began arriving for dinner in the evening.

The temporary family facilities on the Front Lawn have been very busy creating a cheerful atmosphere boding well for the new poolside development now underway.

Silom Wing: Although, perhaps not unexpectedly, there were a few problems with concrete deliveries and some labour shortages over New Year, our contractors have been cracking on with the Silom Wing over the holiday period. Ali's article shows the foundations being built and in the coming weeks the new buildings will soon be taking shape. So far the quality of the work by our contractors has been excellent and inconvenience to Members minimal. All still looks good for a June opening.

The Silom Wing was approved at an EGM in January 2017 and is the first phase of hopefully redeveloping the entire poolside buildings. The General Committee is keen that work continues on the second phase as soon as possible and believes that the whole project could be complete in 2019. The Silom Wing contains new squash courts and mainly young family facilities

whilst phase two includes a new fitness centre overlooking the swimming pool, an exercise room and a sports bar with views both over the pool and the tennis courts.

With constricted access, construction of phase two will be more challenging than the Silom Wing and of course we have to be sure that the funding is available. Detailed planning is underway on how best to achieve this and later this year it is hoped to bring the project back the Members for approval at another EGM.

Annual General Meeting: The AGM is set for 20th March and the Honorary Secretary has written a few words later in this edition of Outpost, encouraging Members to consider standing for the General Committee. It looks as though most of the current committee are willing stand for election again this year and for

those who like the direction the Club is going it will be important to have continuity. However, new blood and new ideas are always welcome and if you are keen to contribute to the Club's wellbeing please consider standing. Paul's article gives an idea of what is involved.

Constitutional Review: This year could break all records for General Meetings because even before the AGM we are calling two Extraordinary General Meetings to consider the draft revised Constitution. The main debate will be held at an EGM on Monday 19th February and a short second EGM will be held to ratify changes to the foundation articles just before the AGM in 20th March.

This is a complicated process involving a huge amount of paperwork, which most Members will probably find somewhat tedious and overwhelming. But we do urge all voting Members to cooperate. It is important that we have a quorum for these meetings and that those attending or voting by proxy read the paperwork before voting. The Sub-committee has spent hundreds of hours preparing this draft and has tried to make the process as smooth as possible.

A lot of the changes are just improved use of language, removal of duplication and reordering, reducing the length of the Constitution from 77 to 57 Articles, making it a much more user-friendly document. All rules were reviewed however, and a vote will be taken on 21 policy changes. Most of these are relatively minor, dealing with known anomalies or reflecting what has become current policy, but a few are more controversial.

Chairing these meetings will be a challenge and if we are to get through the agendas, debate will of

necessity be brief. I would ask all attending to read the papers and approach the meetings positively. The changes proposed are what the GC feels are in the best interest of the Members but if you disagree then this is the opportunity to vote as you wish.

Clubhouse: Although the Silom Wing is demanding most attention, the rest of the Club continues to need care and maintenance. Following hard on after our ancient walk-in freezer giving up the ghost in October, this month our almost-as-ancient walk-in chiller in which we store

all our fresh vegetables etc has also decided to call it a day and has had to be replaced.

The biggest task however is the 5-yearly repaint of the Clubhouse which will be done over the next month or so. The colour scheme has not changed since at least when I joined the Club 40 years ago and this time we asked our architects for their views on what might be most appropriate given the history of the building and look the best. The General Committee considered several options and of course chose none of them, combining instead features from two. The main change will be exposure of brickwork detail around the porch which was part of the original design and used until the 1960s. The picture illustrates the new look. No doubt this will be controversial, but we hope most people enjoy the change

Member's Gathering: One of the gentler events of the year is the 'Members Gathering' which will be held on 7th February. All Members who have been with the Club more than 20 years are invited, plus all Members who joined the Club in the last 12 months. This is always a lovely evening, a chance for long-term Members to meet up and for new Members to make friends. I look forward to seeing old and new faces.

Annual Staff Outing: Normally the Club is closed just one day a year for the Annual Staff Party and it was my pleasure to call in for a few hours on January 15th at the Royal Varuna Yacht Club in Pattaya where this year's event was held. Of course I am not going to spill the beans but it was a very happy occasion, everyone had a great time and, just possibly, service might have been a little slow on the 16th! Apologies for the inconvenience but thank you to everyone for making sure this was a special day for our hard-working and loyal staff.

DEVELOPMENT UPDATE Silom Wing

The results of the Dynamic load and Seismic testing of the piles prepared for handover to our main contractor J.K. Builders were satisfactory. These tests checked that the concrete mix was correct and the piles were strong enough to take the building weight. The project fell a few days behind over New Year because of a shortage of workers and of concrete but the time lost will be made up very quickly.







Concrete pouring for the foundations is now complete and the soil has been back filled. The next step will be the laying of the ground beams and slabs, which will carry the main construction, and lean concrete has been poured in preparation. The steel for the ground beams and slabs has been delivered to the site.

Weekly Project Meetings have been held on site since construction began and now weekly safety meetings are held with the workers.

Members are invited to view progress through portals cut in the site entrance and the time lapse video on the Club Website is being updated.





Upon election a Letter of Affirmation is required from your Embassy and the General Committee is registered with the Bangrak District Office.

The General Committee is hard work and plays a very important role in setting policy and guiding

the management of the Club. Serving on the General Committee is a serious commitment and Members considering standing for election should only do so if they are willing to dedicate the necessary time. Over the past 18 years or so the author has noticed that each year Members - with all the goodwill in the world - stand for the General Committee, get elected, and then simply do not have the time to do the job! Time is required every week to read or write reports, as well as committing to the monthly two-hour main meeting currently held the third Monday of the month. Most General Committee Members also Chair or sit on Sub-Committees, and are variously asked to meet membership applicants, attend events such as New

Member Nights, Long Service Awards, and represent the Club at external events.

Nomination Forms will be sent out with pre-Calling papers early in the month and will be available from Reception. Nominations received will be displayed in the Clubhouse and at the Poolside and posted on the Club website (from February 28th). It is not mandatory to submit a Nomination Form. Nominations may be made at

any time before the AGM on 20th March 2018, and also from the floor during the meeting ... so please give some thought to standing but please do so only if you are willing to commit the necessary time.

The worst thing about last year was seeing Peter dressed up as a woman. What a Trollope! (Neil McArthur)


