

#### CRICKET REVIEW

With the season now rapidly drawing to a close the obvious lesson to be learned is that slow bowlers alone do not win matches, and in particular 25 over matches; seam bowlers do. The harsh and cruel fact is that we no longer possess a quicker bowler with the necessary pace and penetration.

Batting averages in the forties and fifties would appear to be significant and one could hardly be wrong in assuming another successful season for the British Club. This however has not been the case. The Cavaliers XI won four out of five, falling in the final to Allied Newspapers, whereas, neither the Crusaders XI nor the combined Club side gained a single success.

It follows that the two trophies for which the Club are eligible to play and which have graced our lounge bar for the past twelve months are now destined to seek new homes. The Marshall Trophy, British Club property last season for the first time in eleven years, will now return to the RBSC after a display of pretty dismal batting and innocuous bowling against a keener Sports Club side who were content to leave out a couple of their star players. The Thailand Cricket League Cecil B. Hawker Trophy this year went to last years beaten finalists in what proved to be a tense and exciting game; John Davis' Cavaliers being edged out on bowling strength alone.

The Cavaliers successes this season have been based on the extent of their batting power, epitomised by John Davis' own splendid average of 55 backed up by John Dickerson with 38. The bowling has mainly fallen on the shoulders of Mike Bucknall and Roland Stevens, neither of whom have bowled as well as last season, and Russ Hignett whose early promise never really came to light.

The Crusaders XI with very little in the way of batting have lost the two matches they have played. Ironically the bowling honours for the season must go to Crusaders' players, and in particular to Rod Carter for his 5 for 7 against Nakhon Sawan CC. Graham Blumfield, the quickest in the Club at the present has also bowled well and with more consistent practice would have been rewarded with greater success.
