

ANZAC (GALLIPOLI) DAY 1978

The annual ANZAC Day service and wreath laying ceremony will be held at the Kanchanaburi War Cemetery at 10.00 a.m. on Tuesday, 25th April. All members of the New Zealand, Australian and British communities in Thailand are invited to attend.

The service will take the following form:

- (a) Prayers and address by the Chaplain.
- (b) Laying of wreaths by representatives of
 - The New Zealand Government
 - The Australian Government
 - The British Government
 - The Turkish Government
 - The Thai War Veterans Organisation
 - The Governor of Kanchanaburi
 - The New Zealand Society
 - The Thai/Australia Association
 - The Custodian of the War Cemetery
- (c) Sounding of 'Last Post'.
- (d) Two minutes silence.
- (e) Sounding of 'Reveille'.
- (f) Prayers and Benediction.

After the service refreshments will be provided and tables will be available for those wishing to have lunch before returning to Bangkok.

The Kanchanaburi Cemetery is 130 kilometres from Bangkok on good roads. Those attending the service should leave Bangkok between 7.00 and 7.20 a.m. depending on how far they have to travel through city traffic.

If there is sufficient interest amongst Bangkok residents, an airconditioned bus will be arranged to leave the Anglo-Thai Building at 7.00 a.m. for Kanchanaburi. After the service and the serving of refreshments, the bus will proceed to the Kwai River railway bridge and will leave for Bangkok at 2.30 p.m. This will give passengers time to pay a short visit to the Chungkai cemetery - some twenty minutes up the river by long-tail boat. Anyone interested in travelling by bus should advise the New Zealand Embassy Receptionist as soon as possible, leaving a contact telephone number. The cost will be Baht 60/seat.
