Dear Members,

First of all I would like wish all Members a great Songkran Holiday season. During the month of April there will be a Centennial Event which will be an exhibition of "Old photographs of Bangkok from the reign of King Rama IV to Present" in the Billiards Room. 


Jo Goodliffe picked up the ladies' long drive

The winning

One of the first things

people notice about others is their smile. So maintaining that gorgeous flashing set of pearly-whites is important in business and for personal relationships.



When in Rome do as the Romans do, so says the old English proverb, so living in Thailand we expats must smile as the Thais smile. Beaming a big, bright smile is a great way to start the day and it goes a long way to smoothing rocky paths. But achieving that beaming smile takes time and effort.

We were all taught from infancy that we should brush our teeth after breakfast and before bedtime, but there is more to possessing a healthy smile than this. To dazzle with a blinding

smile you will need to upgrade your cleansing routine. But the hectic pace of today's life may prevent us giving as much attention to personal dental health as we should.

Brushing is still the mainstay of the process, but dentists now recommend brushing after the mid-day meal or dinner. If this is not possible then chewing gum will stimulate the process of salivation, neutralising acid and washing away the bits and bobs of food that the toothpick cannot reach.

No one wants to wander around with a plug of spinach spoiling that perfect smile, toothpicks dislodge food detritus that lodges in the spaces between the teeth. But be careful, vigorous use of toothpicks can damage gums, causing tears and bleeding. Toothpicks should be used with care and caution.

Flossing too is an essential part of the dental health regime. Brushing alone will not clean the whole tooth surface, flossing will clean the spaces between the teeth and even at the gum margins. Like the famous beer, flossing gets to the parts that the toothbrush can't reach, again be careful as vigorous flossing can cut and tear gums and damage the delicate structures that keep teeth in place. Even if you have been flossing for years, check with your dentist that your technique is good and correct.

As charming as is a dazzling smile, the benefits of adequate dental health go beyond the purely cosmetic. Everyone knows about the anti-social effects of halitosis (if you have halitosis, then please consult your dentist, as it can be caused by other health problems), but poor dental care can cause gastritis and stomach upsets, and even in rare cases gastric ulceration. Rarely life-threatening blood and cardiac conditions can result from poor dental hygiene.

Most people use too much toothpaste, a pea-sized blob is sufficient, and will not foam too much. Don't use a brush with a big head and hard or even medium

bristles. Brushing using a small head and soft bristles is just as effective. The small head will allow you to get into the back of the mouth and soft bristles will not damage your gums.

You know of course that you must brush for two minutes, next time you brush, time yourself. You may be surprised how long two minutes is.

The dentist will not just check for tooth and gum disease, they also examine for signs of cancer, salivary gland disease, the 'bite', the effects of tooth grinding and much more.

To keep that bright smile dazzling for years, the dentist is your mouth's best friend. A twice annual visit to your friendly BNH dentist is a must to maintain a clean mouth and an eye-catching Thai-style smile.

Safety

Bleeding gums are a sign of periodontal disease - visit your dentist soon.

More teeth are lost through diseased gums than dental caries brush gums as well as teeth.

Use a small head toothbrush with soft bristles.

Use a pea size bit of toothpaste.

Floss in the morning and before bed.

Use disclosing tablets weekly to check for effective brushing.

Chewing gum is a good way to reduce acid and to dislodge food debris.




