### Introduction of Appointments for Notarial Services in Bangkok

From 23rd March 2015 British nationals needing to visit the Consular Section of the Embassy in Bangkok in person for notarial and documentary services must make an online appointment in advance. The online booking service will replace the current first-come first-served queuing system.

The new, easy to use online booking service will enable you to book an appointment in advance for notarial and documentary services where we need to see you in person, such as to swear an affirmation or for the certification of documents.

Information about the notarial and documentary services we provide can be found at *www.gov.uk/notarial-and-documentary-services-guide-for-thailand* With a description of each service is a clear indication of whether you should apply by post or in person. From 23rd March if you need to apply in person instructions about how you should make your online appointment will be included. Check carefully – you will be surprised at how few services require you to attend in person! If you have questions you can telephone us on +66 (0) 2 305 8333.

For the notarial and documentary services that require attendance in person we provide a same day service subject to the application being correctly completed. To avoid delays, please make an appointment and apply in good time and ensure you have all the necessary documentation and the appropriate fee for the service you require.



# **PAST PARTICIPLE** *Auspicium Melioris A*Evi



We look back to the history of our Club in 2009 ...

The year started with a series of financial concerns. Food & Beverage income was down, some outlets by as much as 30% year-on-year, membership was slowing and costs were rising. Cash balances in the Club had shrunk to 11m Baht (from some 25m Baht held three years before) and drastic action was needed.

The first major event of the year was thus 'letting go' the Chief Executive Officer, Michael Silcock. Mr Silcock had been CEO since 2007 thus with a very generous settlement he was terminated in his role. The subsequent General Committee, after the AGM, then took on a long and meticulous search for a replacement CEO but this did not conclude in 2009. In the meantime Barry Osborne, the General Manager, acted up the CEO role.

As indicated last month a structured Master Plan was conceived by the new "Executive Committee" of the Club to reverse the damage in the Clubhouse and upgrade the poolside facilities. This "Executive Committee" consisted of the office bearers of the Club whose role was to assist the Chairman in his role within the Club.

The 2009 AGM took on the role of explaining the development proposals and the proposed new General Committee/Executive Committee structure. Unfortunately the presentation did not go down well and after a heated meeting, significant changes were made to the General Committee, with five sitting GC members not re-elected. The outgoing Chairman immediately resigned from the Club.

The incoming General Committee saw Membership as their key priority in getting the Club back on the road to recovery thus in June set out two proposals at an Extraordinary General Meeting to boost membership. First of all a 'Stage Membership' was introduced whereby prospective members pay in instalments over six years but with a majority of the payment loaded up-front (similar to 'Hire Purchase'). This was designed to cater for those on short-term contracts or lower incomes as they did not have to fork out a huge initial lump sum.

Secondly it was agreed to increase the number of Associate Members allowed in the Club. The General Committee proposed changing from the one-third percentage (first set up in 1998) to 42%. Sadly an unforeseen amendment was unanimously approved without any legal consultation which increased the limit to 48%. This figure, whilst still giving a majority of membership to core nationalities, undermines the very nature of the Land Chanote which afforded the Clubhouse land from King Vajiravudh to the British peoples.

A first stepping stone was created in settling the on-going dispute with the Tennis Section (see last month). The General Committee set up a new structure of management support for the Tennis Section with an elected advisory committee. In addition a professional coach was employed to enhance the play of the game at the Club. Unfortunately all other sections were still run by members and by year end it had not still been agreed which method worked best.

**5** Lots of other things happened in 2009: a termite infestation in The Verandah cost 500,000 Baht to remedy and replace the panelling – a sum which should possibly be added to earlier 'cost' figures (see February Outpost); The Food & Beverage Work Group was founded in the May; Dougal Forrest, chairman 1995 to 1998, was elected as an Honorary Member; and finally an arithmetic error seriously disrupted the Club .... but as usual you will have to wait until next month to find out what!

The role and mandate of the "Executive Committee" was discussed. stressed that this was one of his election mandates as Chairman, to convene an "office bearers" or EC to act as an advisory to the Chairman, and assist the CEO.

# AS WE WERE





I have recently scanned thousands of slides I took during my early years in Thailand, some at the British Club. I will share a few these over the coming months and with big changes coming up for the poolside I'll start with three pictures taken from the Club House balcony in about 1980, 1990 and 2015.

The swimming pool was only about 15 years old when the first picture was taken and features the original wooden Suriwongse Sala. The grey roof appearing above the changing rooms and squash courts was a school where the AIA building now stands and a kiddie's paddling pool was under the awning, behind the fence, in front of the kitchen. The area under the changing rooms was open with a table tennis table, and access to the changing rooms was via a staircase behind the kiddies pool. There were just two squash courts and the Silom Sala and today's children's pool area had yet to be built. The Narai Hotel had long been open for business but there was no Pullman Hotel, giving an open view down Silom Road. The Bangkok Bank HQ is under construction, one of first high-rise office blocks in the area.

The 1990 picture features a 'new' orange-tiled Suriwongse Sala. The 'matching' Silom Sala and Squash court 3 were built in about 1980 just after the first picture. There was still an awning for seating where the kiddie's pool used to be but the new children's pool area was now open. The AIA had been built in the 1980s and The Pullman (originally Sofitel) Hotel was under construction.

The third picture is the view today showing the new Suriwongse Sala with the old kiddies pool awning finally removed.

### 4th Pattaya Inter Club ITF Senior Open – report by Tiss Bunwong

Between February 7th to 12th, the first International Tennis Federation (ITF) event of the year was held at the Pattaya Tennis Inter Club. Five representatives of the British Club were there to contest seniors' world ranking points and a few came away with top honours.

Attending my first ITF event as a spectator with Mineko, it was a great few days to be able to watch an extremely high standard of tennis. There were several ex- Davis Cup players and world #1 players including Chris O'Meara 40+ (AUS), Paul Smith 55+ (NZL), Egan ADAMS (former 50+ #1 - USA) and the Pakistan Davis Cup Team Captain and Coach, Rahsid Malik, one of the greats to watch. Seeing the level of fitness of (almost) all of the players was also educational.

Congratulations to Harold Mollin who won the Men's 60+ singles, outlasting the highly ranked Helmut Ritter from Austria (#12 in the world in 2014) in the final with both consistency and determination (Harold lost only four games in three rounds). Played in the midday sun, Harold would then play two more matches on that last day, winning all three, including the Men's 40+ doubles. With his British Club partner (and student) David Padgham, the pair won the 60+ doubles in a thrilling final match as well.

Phairoj Chanveskul was the runner up in the Men's 55+ doubles, but went down to a very consistent, highly ranked Czech Republic player Jiri CERMAK (world top 20 in 2014 - CZE) in the second round of the singles. Patiphan DANSIRICHAISAWAD and Phairoj Chanveskul also competed in the 50+ Mens Doubles losing the quarter final to the eventual winners. David Padgham (now ranked 127 in the world for 60+ doubles), partnered with Scott Cunliffe in the Men's 55+ doubles round robin event.

At his first ITF tournament (given a wild card by the organizers), Scott's highlight was managing to hold his serve once against the world number one player Paul Smith (and doubles pair) in the Men's 55+.

It was great to see Marc Nussaume back in competition again, winning a strong first round match but losing to the third seed and world #99 (and eventual runner-up) Christian Wind from Austria in the second round. There are three ITF sanctioned events each year in Thailand, the next in Phuket starting 20 April. Phairoj and Scott have already signed up for 55+ doubles and I may try to play my first mixed doubles tournament if I can get time off work.

# BCB 1910 FANTASY FOOTBALL



# HARD BALLS

This month we have a bit of nostalgia and some hard stuff ... BC's first venture into League Cricket for almost 20 years.

Marshall Trophy 50th Anninversary: In 1963, then HSBC General Manger Johnny Marshall donated a trophy for a cricket match to be played annually between the Royal Bangkok Sports Club and the British Club Bangkok. On 15th February the RBSC hosted a special "50th Anniversary" match, inviting players from the past to play and celebrate the oldest Club cricket competition in Thailand.

At least 10 of the players had played in these matches in the 1980s and the organizers, Jackson of RBSC and Jack Dunford of the BCB decreed that it should be played in the spirit of the 1960s, as an 'old-fashioned gentlemen's game with a declaration, and stumps to be drawn after four hours' Thus ensued a most enjoyable match on a glorious sunny afternoon. One septuagenarian and several sexagenarians played alongside some of the younger players of today with Ray Harries, another BC septuagenarian most elegantly umpiring. The British Club, batting in descending age order and declared on 192 for 5 after some lusty hitting from the lower order. When stumps were drawn, RBSC were 142 for 8 ... an honorable draw.

Two Octogenarians who played in the 1960s were on hand for the speeches, Edward Thangarajah, former Bangkok Post Sports Editor, and BC Member Lochie Thompson who regaled everyone with entertaining stories of his early days in Bangkok and meeting with Johnny Marshall.

In the old days this was a keenly contested match and one of the highlights of the season. As fortunes



have waxed and waned. 32 matches have now been played with RBSC winning 19, BCB 11, and 2 draws. Basking in the evening sun there was glowing sense of camaraderie and history. As the teams mingled it seemed assured that this match will continue to be played for many more years to come.

After some debate it was agreed to enter the BC in RBSC's new T20 tournament this season with all matches to played at the magnificent Polo Club and RBSC grounds. After all we are just a social side fielding a team with an average age in the 40s or even 50s, while the league teams have some seriously good cricketers, mostly a lot younger and some semiprofessional. First time round we would be happy to put on a good show and hopefully not embarrass ourselves.





T20 League Vs Siam Parrots, 7th Feb: First time out things went well, BC posting a respectable score of 133 for 8. Dale has been in sparkling form this season and led the way with an aggressive 28 off just 17 balls. Rahul 18, Aseem 20 and Andrew 19 kept the score ticking over and the innings ended with a flourish with both Ben and Dilip hitting 15 off 10 balls in a merry unbroken 9th wicket stand.

BC were in the game for most of the Parrots innings but a dropped catch when their opener was on 2 ultimately proved fatal as he went on to 48 and held things together as wickets fell at the other end to Dilip (1 for 25), Aseem (1 for 26), Rahul (1 for 22) and Andrew (3 for 23). The RBSC skipper Dave Currie was then able to see RBSC home with a guickfire 33 not out off 17 balls and victory with 135 for 6. There was no embarrassment here, a good game of cricket which could have gone either way.

T20 League Vs BFF, 22nd Feb: Next up were 6-aside specialists BFF and BC were quietly confident. This time Dale lost the toss and BC had to field first. After a reasonable start during which Dilip (1-24 off 4 overs) an Anil (2 for 25 off 3) bowled well, the wheels came off as BC's dreaded affliction of bowling wides returned. A partnership of 117 for the 4th wicket off 72 balls saw BFF to an impressive total of 183 for 4 including 25 extras.

BC were always behind the required run rate the only glimmer of hope coming with Rahul (33 off 27 balls) and Dale (36 off 21), once again in full flow. Others perished trying to maintain the momentum leaving it to the one and only Sarq to play out an eccentric maiden over at the end of the innings to leave BC 56 short on 129 for 6. This wasn't a great performance but at least we didn't feel outclassed and should have done better.

RBSC T20 League Vs Southerners, 28th Feb: Hopes were not high against the Southerners, Thailand's top Premier League team. 


