
the Chairman

One of the problems holding the AGM at the end of March is that April is a hopeless month to get anything done, everyone either bolting down for a Songkran dousing or escaping to dryer climes. The new General Committee has yet to formally meet and I am writing this as I myself prepare to go Down Under to see my granddaughters.

Silom Wing: After the delays of March, work has been cracking on with the Silom Wing project. The contractor has had to deal with yet more unseasonal deluges and then plan around the Songkran holiday when concrete deliveries dry up for a couple of weeks. However, by the time you read this, the superstructure will be complete and the various trades moving in to complete the project. We are still a few weeks behind, but making up ground. Our bird's-eye view time-lapse VDO on the website is not great quality but gives a good idea of what has happened so far.



I think most Members will be surprised at the scale and scope of this development. Touring the site after the last Sub-Committee meeting it was exciting to see the quality space being created for families and young adults ... as well as the two new squash courts. The general vista with landscaping and architectural features will be impressive and our new buildings will screen out most of the more ugly backside of the Narai Hotel.

There is a lot of detailed work to be done to ensure that all the finishing touches are in place in time and to plan the new service operations. Our intention is to have a

soft opening once the main work is complete and then a Grand Opening a few weeks later once everything is running smoothly and any snags have been fixed.

Further developments: A major task for the new GC will be to prepare an on-going development plan. As we have stated, we are keen to proceed with the rest of the poolside development as soon as possible and are engaged with our architects and contractors to review the costings and logistics. During the course of the year we will also be looking at the feasibility of building some quest rooms.



Nothing can happen without full approval of the membership, and rumours circulating about the achievability of these plans are premature. We have a well-qualified GC, particularly in financial management, and we will only present our recommendations for debate and consideration when we have fully reviewed costs and cash flow projections.

Clubhouse Painting: Regular rain played havoc with the Clubhouse repainting schedule but again this will be finished by the time you read this. The new look has been very well received although there have been a few comments about residual paint on some of the



lower bricks. This is due to unwanted moisture in the brickwork due to rain from outside, rising damp from below and maybe condensation from within the structure. Although this is minor and arguably adds character to what after all is an historic building, once the bricks have had a chance to dry out we will consult with specialists to see whether more can be done.

Neilson Hays Library: Work on the Neilson Hays Library car park and gardens is still ongoing and the grounds will look beautiful when it is all done. It looks like it will now be June before we can move back to run the café but in the meanwhile we are looking forward to hosting their next Book Sale on 26th/27th May. This is another opportunity to choose from thousands of books for both adults and children at great prices.

Pictures: For the last three years I have been sharing in Outpost a selection of pictures from my 1980s/1990s slide archive. Last year I published a few that I took in the Cambodian, Lao and Vietnamese Refugee camps and recently I have been uploading them on Facebook.

I have been amazed at the response with thousands of 'shares', 'likes' and 'comments' from former refugees and their dependents all over the world, with a few dozen actually finding pictures of themselves more than 30 years later. THEY THINK IT'S ALL OVER

A MEMBER passing me at the recent Annual General Meeting suggested that we must be happy that all the Constitution work is finally finished after almost three years of work, three dozen meetings, two rounds of Member consultation and scores of draft versions drafted, redrafted, corrected, amended, secondarily re-drafted and then language checked. In fact several members were quite complimentary of the work that the Constitutional Review Sub-Committee had done and thought we deserved a rest but unlike the immortal words of Kenneth Wolstenholme ... we have to say ...

WELL IT ISN'T YET

After the AGM the 'newly re-constituted' Constitution & By-Laws Sub-Committee started on the work needed to bring our revised constitution to life. Firstly we consolidated the effects of the Annual General Meeting's amendments plus those of the two previous Extraordinary General Meetings held on 19th February and 20th March. Good turnout on both ... many thanks dear Members.

Once all the amendments were in one place we had to recheck the numbering sequence, then the internal sequencing of Articles (the 'new word' for Rules) if they refer to each other, then edit out the references to Bylaw numbers (which change too frequently to be kept up to date) then finally check that it was spelt correctly ... one would be amazed how many times 'spellcheck' turns itself off or reverts to English (USA). So far, so good.

Now for the translation ... Under the Civil & Commercial Code only the Thai version is a legally valid document so we had the consolidated revised constitution translated into Thai and then translated back to check it meant what we meant it to say. We then created a list of major changes and had one final read through.

On 28th March 2018, the British Club Bangkok revised constitution was submitted to the Ministry of the Interior for their registration. The revised Constitution will thus come into effect upon receiving the Registrar's signature.

AND PLAY CONTINUES

At its meeting in April, the Constitution & By-Laws Sub-Committee set forth the procedure for both simplification and modernisation of the By-Laws. Although the Constitution gives us our legal framework to exist and operate as a Members' Only Club, we need internal rules ... called By-Laws ... to give the Constitution its arms and legs.

Although updated regularly, there has been no major full review since 2005 thus there are still major areas of work that must be undertaken to ensure that the By-Laws actually work and are not just procedural junk or the script from an unused Yes Minister.

The first two major areas we are working on first are ...

- FUNDING OF CLUB SECTIONS: an essential process for ensuring Club Sections receive the funding needed to develop but as the Section accounts are no longer required to be published in the audited accounts the revised ByLaws needed an added level of openness and transparency to Members.
- DISCIPLINARY CODE: although arguably not used in the past two years, it is essential that this code is fair, transparent and above all simple ... currently it is 872 words contained in three By-Laws with 20 sub-sections.
- So we continue: The Constitution & By-Laws Sub-Committee hopes that the By-Laws will be ready to come into effective at the same date as the registration of the revised Constitution and that date will be ... <watch this space>.

DEVELOPMENT UPDATE

Silom Wing

This month I'm pleased to report that the Silom Wing construction works are back on track and JK Builders have started to make real and visible progress with the implementation of the agreed recovery programme. Labour has been at full strength and JK Builders continued working over the Songkran holidays.

We are still about a month behind the original schedule and hope to be able to make some of that delay back. The project team anticipates the project will be delivered in July of 2018.

With completion of the ground floor structural works, focus has moved to completion of the first floor, roof and all the main building and squash court concrete works. These works should be complete by the time you read this article. Work has also started on the new entrance and guardhouse piling works. The project continues to be on budget.




















HARD BALLS

V Kerala Strikers ESL @ BCG 4th March 2018
