# THE UNITED KINGDOM CHARITIES COMMITTEE

As so many Members of the British Club help the U.K.C.C. in their fund raising activities, the Committee felt that they owe the Members a brief report.

The accounts have already been posted at the Club and these detail total income during the year of Bht. 395,000, of which almost Bht. 300,000 was made at the 1975 Ploenchitr Fair. Donations made to various Thai Charities amounted to Bht. 232,000.

For this year the Committee have agreed to allocate Bht. 440,000 to deserving Thai Charities. Among these are:-

- i) Mckeans Leprosarium in Chiangmai a full years supply of Lamprene, an anti-Leprosy drug, and the provision of a piped music system and 2 T.V. sets.
- ii) Manoram Hospital a substantial grant to help with a new water supply system and funds for the treatment of 8 T.B. Patients.
- iii) Phutong Leprosarium the salary of a nursing aide and finance for new washrooms.
- iv) Father Joe Sequinotte's Karen Children funds for a new bridge, vital for the villagers communications.
- v) Klong Toey Medical Centre a grant for medical equipment.

vi) Buffalo Bank in the North East - help for a scheme providing Buffaloes to very poor and needy families.

In addition goods of British origin, where possible, will be given to:-

H.R.H. the Princess Mother's Flying Doctors.

# SWIMMING SECTION

The Club faced very tough competition in the Bangkok Aquatic Club (BAC) Bicentannial meeting, swum at our pool on May 1 and 2. Strong YWCA and Royal Bangkok Sports Club teams took first and second places in the four-way meet, and the British Club finished third, about 100 points behind the winners and more than 300 ahead of a sadly depleted BAC team. The points scores were YWCA 735, RBSC 718½, RBSC 718½, BCB 631½, BAC 320.

British Club swimmers put up a great display, excelling in the relays and breaking no less than seven club relay records.

Adam Donald and Iain Brown won Age Group trophies and eight other British Club swimmers won places in the Age Group high points tally. Eight Club records were broken — three falling to Iain Brown and two to Tony Aylward — while Adam Donald broke the Pool record for the 6 & under 25m butterfly. Twelve other Pool records went to YWCA and Sports Club swimmers, among them Thailand's possible Olympic entries, Rachaniwan Bulkul and Sansanee Changkasiri. Seven British Club swimmers won gold medals.

Coach Gordon Aylward reported that the 53-member British Club team turned in the highest improvement score it has ever recorded. More than half the Club's swimmers improved all, or all but one, of their times, and British Club swimmers improved their times in 190 out of 270 individual swims, or 70 per cent.


