JOURNAL Maintenance and membership are the main priorities ...

hope you have all had the opportunity to read the summary of our April GC meeting which sets out our plans and priorities for the year. In that summary we highlighted maintenance and membership as the main priorities and so I would like to expand a little on our thoughts and plans in these areas.

Clearly these two areas are connected as the Club needs to look its best to retain existing members and attract new ones. A general clean up is underway; rubbish and broken furniture are being removed and a fresh coat of paint applied to many areas. In parallel with this, larger projects are progressing in specific areas of concern:

- we are moving ahead with a tender for upgrading of our electrical systems;
- we are having all buildings surveyed for termite damage and will review our pest control contracts and protection in the light of the survey findings;
- we are completing contractual reviews of works done on the tennis courts, back lawn etc as they are scheduled to move out of defect rectification into warranty and maintenance phases;
- . we have identified problems with the drainage system under the Suriwongse Sala and will investigate appropriate solutions; and
- we will renovate the men's changing rooms.

Membership is the other of our top priorities. With a largely expatriate membership, people come and go as their postings or contracts are completed and in a good year about as many people join the club as leave it.

The British Club is a unique institution with a privileged location in central Bangkok.

Our total membership has remained steady between about 1,000 and 1,100 members for several years. However, as we all know, this is not a good year and the GC anticipates a higher number of leavers than usual in 2009 and 2010. So like Alice in "Through The Looking Glass", our membership team will have to run very fast just to keep in the same place. We have asked Barry to take a leading role in new member recruitment and have re-assigned some of his workload in areas such as maintenance and sports to other members of the management team in order to allow him to focus on this. But we need your help too. The British Club is a unique institution with a privileged location in central Bangkok.

We all love the Club and should be its most passionate advocates so please talk to your friends and colleagues who are not yet members and encourage them to join – and remember we are still operating a Member Get Member Programme. In the event that your friends are unwilling to join we would also like to hear their reasons – it will help us understand what we have to do better to attract new members.


As with all parties the day was rounded off with a happy birthday sing-a-long and a cake in the shape of the Club House.







PAINT A BATCH OF BEETLES

Decorating a colony of brightly colored beetles. We usually spread out our bugmaking over two afternoons – one to mold the beetles and one to paint them. To start, mix a cup of plaster of Paris according to the directions on the box. Pour the mix bit by bit into disposable plastic spoons and let them dry overnight (we usually make 20 to 40 at a time and save some for later).





The next day, pop the bugs out of the spoons and have your kids paint them with acrylic or tempera paints. An insect guide can offer some fun inspiration for colors and designs. Painting the bugs can take up the better part of a rainy afternoon, but you can also extend this project in other ways.

For example, make your beetles more functional by gluing them onto magnets. Or challenge everyone to create an interesting beetle cage from any supplies around your house (toothpicks are a good jumping-off point).

PAPER DOVE CRAFT

You won't mind this critter invading your next picnic: a high-flying dove made from paper plates and plastic spoons.

Craft Materials:

- Paper plate
- Scissors
- Tape
- Two plastic spoons
- Pebble
- Rubber band
- Markers

- Cut the plate in half, then cut one half into three equal wedges. Tape one wedge to the bottom of the intact half.
- Draw the bird's face on one spoon with the markers. Then sandwich the pebble between the two spoon bowls and bind them with the rubber band.
- Tape the spoons to the bottom of the paper plate half.

Tips: To fly, throw like a paper airplane. Adjust the pebble size to improve flight.


