BEVERAGE PRICES

Price increases are never popular but of course are essential from time to time to maintain margins. This month the GC has approved some modest increases in drinks prices, mainly to reflect recent Government changes to alcohol excise tax. This affected some drinks more than others, but resulted in a higher cost of sales overall.

In reviewing the current drinks price list the F&B sub-committee also corrected some inconsistencies in pricing on some items, removed drinks with no or very low sales, and of course took off drinks for which supplies are no longer available. The exercise will result in a modest increase in revenue and help sustain our budgeted margins. We trust all Members will understand the necessity for this.



OUTPOST

This month the Club has taken production of Outpost back in-house. The management team has lots of ideas for adding features and making it actually profitable. That has never been easy in the past but I am looking forward to seeing how it works out.

F&B Morsels

Our kitchen have been heating up throughout the month of June serving you all your favorite dishes and supplying you with a scrumptious Sunday Buffet each week. Now, we look towards the summer months and all our in-season food promotions. Wimbledon starts in July, so we have sourced and imported the best fresh strawberries available for traditional strawberries and cream during match times.

My featured dish of the month comes from our Thai Menu. A classic and all around favorite Thai dish "The Pad Thai" (full name "kway teow phat Thai"). How to make it:

Place the rice noodles in a bowl and cover with lukewarm water and set aside for 1 hour. Drain then set aside.

Heat 2 tbsp of the oil in a wok or large heavy based fry pan over medium heat. Add the prawns and cook until they just change colour. Remove from the wok and set aside.

Add the shallot and stir fry for 2 minutes. Then add the tofu, dried shrimp, fish sauce, palm sugar and tamarind puree and cook for 1 minute until the sugar has dissolved.

Add the rice noodles, vinegar and 2 tsp chili powder and stir fry for 2 minutes.

Turn the heat down to low and push the noodles to one side. Add the remaining 2 tbsp of oil into the wok then the egg.

Push the noodles over the egg and stir, scraping the base of the wok so the egg scrambles and mixes in with the noodles.

Remove from heat. Add half the peanuts, most of the bean sprouts, garlic chives, prawns and toss gently.

Transfer to serving platter. Sprinkle with white sugar and remaining peanuts. Serve immediately with lime wedges on the side and sprinkled with extra chili powder, if desired and enjoy.



Ingredients:

5 oz / 150 g dried Pad Thai rice noodles (Note 1) 4 tbsp vegetable oil 12 raw shrimp (prawns), shelled and deveined (Note 2) 1 small red shallot , finely sliced (Note 3) 3 oz / 80 g firm tofu , cut into small matchsticks 1.75 oz / 50 g dried shrimp (Note 4) 1/4 cup fish sauce 2 tbsp palm sugar (or brown sugar) 2 tbsp tamarind puree (Note 5) 1 tsp white vinegar 1/2 tsp + chili powder , to taste (Note 6) 2 eggs , lightly beaten 1.5 oz / 45 g roasted unsalted peanuts , finely ground 5 oz / 150 g bean sprouts 2 tbsp garlic chives, cut into 3/4" / 2cm lengths 1 tsp white sugar Lime wedges, to serve

It's time to check into the Hotel Artemis.

Taking place 10 years in the future with the backdrop of a dystopian Los Angeles, it's a story about a private member only emergency room / hotel that only has criminals for patients and it probably has one of the best casts of all the summer movies out there. Jodie Foster runs the establishment, but hen realizes that one of it's patient's is there to kill her.



Article 43 allows them to have complimentary membership whilst they are here with Food & Beverage charged either to your account or to their own credit card. Just ask at Reception/Membership Desk. T&Cs apply.
