WITH FORMER ALL BLACKS COACH JOHN MITCHELL

Aside from Coaching New Zealand's All Blacks, possibly the toughest job in rugby union, John Mitchell was a former All Black himself and also a stalwart for many years with the Waikato province including a number as their Captain. He moved to the UK in the mid 1990's and performed with distinction as first a player, then player-coach before Sir Clive Woodward selected him as his forwards' coach in 1997, playing a major role in the development of England's finest ever and RWC 2003 winning back row. He is currently coaching the Waikato NPC team.



ANYONE FOR LUNCH - THANKS VINNO!

Vince Swift kindly assembled a number of Bangkok's finest rugby scrotes, which could easily resemble a "dirty dozen" and hosted a lunch at The Barbican on Friday 28 May. All enjoyed a lively debate on rugby with Mitch. Returning from a brief business trip to the UK, Scribe travelled direct from the airport and joined as the after-lunch drinks and port was commencing! Since his departure he has taken up a full-time coaching role at NPC level at his beloved Waikato.

BC Rugby hopes to catch up with John Mitchell in New Zealand during the Lions 2005 tour as he has promised show us around the bars of Hamilton. We look forward to the rendezvous! Aside from his very fine company, I think the memory most of us will keep from his visit was the sight of a former All Black and All Black coach, giving up his Saturday morning, gratis, coaching many of our children whilst on a brief three day visit.

JUMPED SHIP!

I'd never jumped ship before 18 June this year. I did it on that day along with Mark Smith on the way to completing his Rescue Diver course open water skills.

First, I'll give a little background information. We were on a dive boat I often use, headed for the small island of Koh Sak (north of Koh Larn, the largest inner island neat Pattaya). It is normally a 30 minute ride, but this day the waves were already being whipped up to 1-1.5 meter by the wind. We'd assembled our scuba equipment for a busy day's diving and Mark was looking forward to using his new (and very good) scuba gear. When we were within 400 meters of the island I heard a not so good sound coming from the boat's motor and so looked into the motor compartment and saw lots of water sloshing back and forth below. The boat had just been through some routine dry dock maintenance, but this was not a good sign! Further inspection showed that one of the fuel lines was slowly leaking fuel and the bilge pump in the motor compartment was not working correctly. Not a good sign! The rescue course could become very practical. It was getting more exciting by the minute!

Our trusty captain, who I have known for several years, took one look and announced that we were heading back to Pattaya immediately. Right decision! But what about our Rescue course? They called to another dive boat that would be following us to the same dive site to see if Mark and I could transfer over to them. As we were already heading back to Pattaya, we spotted another boat coming directly towards us.

Quickly we disassembled our scuba gear and packed it up for

transfer. The other boat soon came along side and we were able to have our equipment thrown over to their boat. Due to the strong winds and high waves, the two boats were scraping up and down each other's sides and it would have been very dangerous to attempt climbing over. So... they backed off about 50 meters and Mark and I jumped ship into the waves and slowly swam over to the other boat. We both made it safely and they had to pull us up on board. Our first

boat took several minutes to start back up again and continue on to Pattaya.

We were able to complete many of the Rescue course skills at Koh Sak in spite of very limited underwater visibility (2-3 meters) caused by an algae bloom.

Upon returning to Pattaya pier at the end of the day, Mark and I stopped by our first boat to check on its repairs. They had taken the engine apart and I was not too sure if it would be ready for the next day. However, I received a call a couple of hours later that it would be finished in time for diving the next day.


The next morning, sure enough, the boat was ready and we made it out to Koh Sak without having to jump ship again.

Underwater visibility had improved to 5-6 meters and we were able to complete all the Rescue course skills, practice some underwater navigation skills and do some pleasure diving where we spotted a large Hawksbill turtle sleeping in the coral.

Mark is now officially a certified Rescue Diver and wants to continue later with some speciality courses

TOWARDS BETTER GOVERNANCE - A YEAR O

IT TOOK ALL THAT TIME TO GET THAT FAR AND IF EVER THERE WAS AN EXAMPLE OF THE INSTITUTIONAL AND ENDEMIC DIFFICULTIES THAT AFFECT THE GOVERNANCE OF THE CLUB, WHICH MAKE THE LIVES OF ITS OFFICERS FAR FROM EASY, THAT HOLD US BACK WHILST THE FABRIC OF THE CLUB DECAYS AND SHOW THAT CHANGE IS NEEDED, THIS WAS A SHINING EXAMPLE. WHILST MY PROPOSALS FAILED TO MAKE PROGRESS THE BALL HAS, IF NOTHING ELSE, STARTED TO ROLL AND A FLAME LIT, HOWEVER IT NEEDS TO BE KEPT ALIGHT IF WE ARE NOT TO FALL BACK INTO DARKNESS.

Members present that evening heard and were, I believe, generally supportive of the idea of greater representation of associate members; what form that eventually takes will be the subject of further work, but my additional proposals to directly elect the Chairman and Treasurer were not heard for entirely proper reasons, and whilst set out in draft form in an earlier article - a year ago - they are published below, as they stand now to further seed the argument.

In sum, I was going on to propose that the Chairman and Treasurer be directly elected by postal ballot of the entire membership and had four heads of argument.

FIRSTLY, THERE IS AND HAS BEEN FOR YEARS, CONFUSION ABOUT THE ROLE OF MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEE THAT HAS BECOME ENDEMIC, DEMONSTRATED BY AN UNDERSTANDABLE AND WELL INTENTIONED (BUT ENTIRELY COUNTERPRODUCTIVE) DESIRE TO BECOME INVOLVED IN THE RUNNING OF THE CLUB, RATHER THAN TO REPRESENT THE MEMBERS OF THE CLUB AND SET POLICY ON THEIR BEHALF, IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE MEMBERS' BROAD VIEWS. THE RUNNING OF THE CLUB IS THE GENERAL MANAGER'S RESPONSIBILITY AND FOR THAT HE SHOULD, I BELIEVE, HAVE ONLY ONE MASTER - THE CHAIRMAN.

THERE IS A SECTION IN THE RULES HEADED 'MANAGEMENT'. IT SHOULD READ 'GOVERNANCE'. AS THE CURRENT CHAIRMAN HAS OFTEN SAID, THE COMMITTEE IS ELECTED TO GOVERN - SOMETHING IT HAS NEVER DONE EFFECTIVELY IN RECENT YEARS, BECAUSE IT ALWAYS BECOMES TOO INVOLVED IN MATTERS WHICH ARE WITHIN NEITHER ITS REMIT, NOR, I RESPECTFULLY SUGGEST, ITS COMPETENCE. THE RESULT IS STAGNATION TOGETHER WITH UNHAPPINESS AMONGST OUR LOYAL STAFF, AS MORE THAN ONE PAST GENERAL MANAGER CAN TESTIFY AND RECENT EVENTS HAVE SHOWN.

A YEAR AGO, IN JULY 2003,
I FIRST SENT PROPOSALS
FOR CHANGING THE
GOVERNANCE OF THE
CLUB TO THE CHAIRMAN
FOR PUBLICATION. ON 29
JUNE 2004 AN
EXTRAORDINARY
GENERAL MEETING WAS
HELD TO DISCUSS THESE
AND OTHER MORE
ROUTINE AMENDMENTS
TO THE RULES.

SECONDLY, I PUT IT TO YOU THAT, HOWEVER WELL INTENTIONED COMMITTEE MEMBERS MAY BE, THE CURRENT SYSTEM IS ENTIRELY UNDEMOCRATIC. COMMITTEES ARE ELECTED, SAD TO SAY, BY DEFAULT. A FACT OF LIFE AND NO REFLECTION UPON THEM, BUT RARELY, IF EVER, HAS THERE BEEN A TRUE ELECTION. MANY PEOPLE WITH MUCH TO OFFER SHY AWAY FROM STANDING AND THEREBY CREATE A COMPETITIVE ELECTION, BECAUSE OF WHAT I SAID IN MY FIRST POINT; NAMELY THE FEAR OF WASTING TIME IN THEIR BUSY LIVES, THROUGH BECOMING BOGGED DOWN FOR ENDLESS HOURS IN MATTERS THAT ARE OUTSIDE THEIR PROPER REMIT.

More importantly, those on the COMMITTEE, WHATEVER THEIR GOOD INTENTIONS, PERSONAL AGENDA OR VISION, OR A MIXTURE OF ALL THREE, REPRESENT ONLY THEMSELVES AND NOBODY ELSE. WHILST MEMBERS MAY NOT REALIZE IT, THEY ARE PART OF AN ENTIRELY LINREPRESENTATIVE BODY THERE IS THE COMMITTEE AND THE MEMBERS - THE PROLETARIAT - AND SADLY ONE HAS TO REMARK, INCREASING ACCOMPANYING SECRECY. IT IS TIME FOR ANOTHER DOSE OF PERESTROIKA, WHICH RID MOST OF THE COMMUNIST WORLD OF THE STRANGLE-HOLD OF CENTRAL COMMITTEES AND ALLOWED THEM TO MAKE PROGRESS. THE DIFFERENCE IS THERE FOR ALL TO MARVEL AT; THOSE FEW NATIONS THAT CLING TO THE COMMITTEE CONCEPT SIMPLY FALL FURTHER AND FURTHER BEHIND. I SUBMIT THAT THE ANALOGY IS VALID. ADDITIONALLY, AND WITH GREAT RESPECT TO ALL THOSE WHO HAVE HELD THAT DIFFICULT OFFICE (WHICH THE CURRENT SYSTEM MAKES FAR MORE DIFFICULT THAN IT OUGHT TO BE)

THE CHAIRMAN OF THIS CLUB IS OUR FRONT DOOR, OUR PRINCIPLE REPRESENTATIVE, YET HE (AND IT HAS ALWAYS BEEN HE THUS FAR, BUT NEED NOT BE SO IN THE FUTURE) MAY WELL HAVE ARRIVED ON THE COMMITTEE ALMOST BY DEFAULT AND THEN BEEN ELECTED CHAIRMAN BY A MAJORITY OF THE NINE OTHERS, PERHAPS FIVE OR EVEN FEWER MEMBERS, OR UNDER 0.05% OF THE MEMBERSHIP. IN SHORT, THE CHAIRMAN HAS NO MANDATE FROM THE MEMBERS OF THE CLUB AND THOSE WHO ELECT THE CHAIRMAN HAVE ONLY THE FLIMSIEST OF ONES THEMSELVES, AGAIN, THE ANALOGY WITH THE OLD COMMUNIST BLOC, WHERE THE 'CENTRAL COMMITTEE' ELECTED THE LEADER AND NOTHING WORKED, ARE OBVIOUS.

HIRDLY, WHETHER YOU WORK FOR A LARGE PLC OR RUN YOUR OWN BUSINESS, HAVE A FAMILY OR ARE HERE ON YOUR OWN, YOU ALL KNOW ONLY TOO WELL THAT MANAGEMENT BY COMMITTEE DOES NOT WORK. IN THE END A DECISION HAS GOT TO BE MADE AND ONE PERSON HAS GOT TO MAKE IT. WE LAY GREAT EMPHASIS ON THE FAMILY NATURE OF THIS CLUB AND WE ALL KNOW THAT EVEN IN THAT ENVIRONMENT MUM OR DAD HAS GOT TO MAKE A DECISION AND THAT IT MIGHT NOT ALWAYS PLEASE EVERYBODY AROUND THE TABLE, BUT FOR THE GOOD OF THE WHOLE DECISIONS HAVE TO BE MADE AND THOSE THAT DON'T LIKE IT HAVE TO PUT UP WITH IT. IT IS A WISE HEAD OF THE HOUSEHOLD WHO LISTENS FIRST, BUT THEN MAKES A DECISION. THE SAME IS TRUE EVERYWHERE AND IN THE END THE BOSS MUST MAKE A DECISION: THOSE WHO CANNOT COME INTO LINE, OR AT LEAST ACQUIESCE, SIMPLY HAVE TO GO ALONG WITH IT.

THERE SHOULD BE NO DIFFERENCE HERE, BUT FIRST WE NEED TO CREATE A BOSS.

FINALLY, I ASK YOU TO LOOK AROUND THE CLUB. FORGET THE COSMETICS, THE PLACE IS FALLING APART, IT IS OLD, WORN OUT AND "GETTING TACKY". BECAUSE. INSTITUTIONAL REASONS, NOTHING GETS DONE. IT IS NO LONGER SMART, IT IS BECOMING THIRD RATE AND DECLINING. BUBBLES COME UP FROM THE BASE OF THE SWIMMING POOL AND IT IS LONG OVERDUE FOR REBUILDING, THE POOL SIDE IS IN AN APPALLING STATE, THE ENTIRE SQUASH COURT BLOCK NEEDS REPLACING, THINGS BREAK, THE 'LOBBY' IS ENOUGH TO PUT ANYBODY OFF, THERE IS NOWHERE FOR THE YOUNG - SOMETIMES NOT SO YOUNG - BUT LIVELY SET TO GO AND SING SONGS AND HAVE A 'KNEES UP' WITHOUT OFFENDING SOMEBODY, WHILST THE BILLIARD ROOM, TO NAME BUT ONE, IS AKIN TO STALIN'S TOMB ON A HALF DAY CLOSING. THE SCALE OF WORK REQUIRED IS TOO LARGE TO BE

R ON - AND TIME FOR PERESTROIKA

UNDERTAKEN USING EXISTING CAPITAL; NEW CAPITAL TO MODERNISE THE CLUB NEEDS TO BE RAISED AND INNOVATIVE METHODS TO DO SO WORKED OUT, BUT NOTHING MOVES.

IN SUM, MAJOR DECISIONS HAVE GOT TO BE MADE AND INITIATIVES TAKEN, AND SOON, BUT WHETHER OR NOT INDIVIDUALS ARE CAPABLE OF MAKING THOSE DECISIONS OR TAKING THOSE INITIATIVES, THE CURRENT ENVIRONMENT DOES NOT EVEN ALLOW THEM TO DO SO. WE ARE GRINDING TO A HALT - AND WITH VERY SOUFAKY BRAKES.

THE PROBLEM IS NOT PERSONAL, IT IS INSTITUTIONAL. WE HAVE NO LONG-TERM PLAN, INDEED AS FAR AS ONE CAN DETERMINE, WE HAVE NO PLAN AT ALL. THERE IS ALSO NO CONTINUITY. NOWADAYS THERE IS NO LISTENING TO MEMBERS, NO OPENNESS, INDEED THERE IS A WORRYING AND PERVASIVE CULTURE OF SECRECY, AS WELL AS AN 'US AND THEM' POLICY, WHICH, FOR WHAT EVER REASONS IT HAS APPEARED, IS UNHEALTHY. OPENNESS IN ALL OUR BUSINESS - AND IT IS OURS - MUST BE THE ORDER OF THE DAY. WHERE HAVE WE SEEN ALL THIS BEFORE?

SUGGEST THAT THE TIME HAS COME TO CHANGE AND CHANGE RADICALLY. THE RESULTS OF FAILURE TO DO SO WILL BE TERMINAL - AND I SUGGEST SOONER THAN MANY MAY REALIZE. THERE ARE MANY BETTER PLACES TO GO, EVEN NOW, AND THEY WILL GROW IN NUMBER. PEOPLE ARE SAYING 'WHY DO I BOTHER' IN EVER INCREASING NUMBERS. SO FAR THEY ARE GENERALLY ONLY SAYING IT, BUT IF THINGS GO ON AS THEY ARE, THEY WILL START TO SAY IT WITH THEIR FEET IN LARGE NUMBERS. THEY WILL, AS THE SAYING GOES, 'GO WEST'.

WE NEED TO PROVIDE A COMMITTEE THAT REALLY REPRESENTS THE MEMBERS' VIEWS AND NOT ONE THAT REPRESENTS ITSELF, STANDS ALOOF AND BECOMES TOO INVOLVED IN THE EVERY DAY MANAGEMENT OF THE CLUB. WE NEED TO PROVIDE OPENNESS IN OUR GOVERNANCE AND NOT A CULTURE WHERE THE COMMITTEE PUTS UP WALLS OF SECRECY TO RESIST CRITICISM AND KEEPS EVEN SOME OF ITS OWN MEMBERS IN THE DARK.

But centrally we need to provide the Chairman and his subordinate Treasurer with a proper mandate to get things done, without the anvil of the Committee holding them back, but at the same time listening carefully to its members' wise counsel. Even if the Chairman were to

CHOOSE TO GO AGAINST THE VIEWS OF SOME, OR ALL, OF THE COMMITTEE, HE WOULD HAVE BEEN MADE TO THINK CAREFULLY AND THE ROAD TO AN EGM, IS WIDE OPEN SHOULD THINGS EVER REALLY GO AWRY.

WE NEED TO ALLOW A CHAIRMAN TO SET OUT HIS PLANS IN AN ELECTION MANIFESTO AND TO ANSWER FOR THE SUCCESS OF THEM AT SUBSEQUENT GENERAL MEETINGS, WHERE HE MAY SEEK CONFIRMATION FOR A FURTHER YEAR. MANY MEMBERS OF CURRENT AND PAST COMMITTEES, TO WHOM WE MUST BE GRATEFUL FOR GIVING OF THEIR TIME, HAVE HAD THEIR OWN AGENDAS; BUT THAT IS EXACTLY WHAT THEY WERE - THEIR OWN AND NOBODY ELSE'S - AND THEY WERE AND STILL ARE, ELECTED, GENERALLY BY DEFAULT, WITHOUT ANYBODY EITHER QUESTIONING THEM OR KNOWING WHAT THEIR AGENDA IS.

WE NEED TO ALLOW NEW CANDIDATES FOR THE CHAIRMANSHIP, EITHER CHALLENGING THE INCUMBENT OR SEEKING TO ASSUME THE MANTLE, ALSO TO SET OUT THEIR PLANS AND SUBSEQUENTLY TO ANSWER FOR THEM.

WE NEED TO ALLOW THE CHAIRMAN, SUPPORTED BY HIS MANDATE AND ADVISED BY HIS TREASURER AND COMMITTEE - AND OTHERS IF NECESSARY - TO GET ON WITH MAKING DECISIONS.

WE NEED TO PROVIDE A COMMITTEE ENVIRONMENT WHERE A BROADER CROSS SECTION OF THE, CURRENTLY FULL, MEMBERSHIP CAN MAKE A USEFUL CONTRIBUTION AND WHICH A FAR BROADER SELECTION OF PEOPLE WILL BE WILLING TO JOIN, AS THEY WILL NO LONGER SEE THEMSELVES BOGGED DOWN IN THE ENDLESS MEETINGS DISCUSSING THE MINUTAE OF MICROMANAGEMENT.

We need to allow the General Manager to get on with his job, answering to an unfettered Chairman, and an unfettered Chairman alone.

MY PROPOSALS ARE SIMPLE, NAMELY A POSTAL A BALLOT OF MEMBERS, TO ELECT CHAIRMAN AND TREASURER.

FOR THE FIRST TIME MEMBERS OF THE CLUB WILL, IF THE OTHER MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEE DO THEIR JOB PROPERLY, BE PROPERLY REPRESENTED AND THEIR VIEWS EXPRESSED.

For the first time the Chairman, together with his subordinate, the Treasurer, will have a mandate to GET

THINGS DONE. IF THEY DO NOT THE ELECTORATE WILL SOON DEAL WITH THEM EFFECTIVELY.

FOR THE FIRST TIME THE GENERAL MANAGER WILL BE FREE OF INTERFERENCE AND WILL PERFORM WITH CORRESPONDINGLY GREATER CONFIDENCE.

SUGGEST THAT, IF NOTHING IS DONE AND WE CONTINUE AS WE ARE, BEFORE THE-CHILDREN CURRENTLY SPLASHING AROUND IN THE KIDDIES POOL REACH THEIR TEENS, THEIR PARENTS WILL DRIVE PAST THIS PLACE, POINT OUT THE LONG GRASS AND ASK THOSE SAME CHILDREN IF THEY REMEMBER THAT THIS WAS WHERE THE BRITISH CLUB USED TO BE.


FOR TOO LONG THERE HAS BEEN APATHY. MOST MEMBERS EITHER DO NOT ATTEND OR, IF THEY DO, SAY NOTHING AT, GENERAL MEETINGS. SOME HUFF AND PUFF AND HAVE A FEW, SOMETIMES NERVOUS, MOMENTS AT THE MICROPHONE, BEFORE DEPARTING AND SPENDING THE NEXT 364 DAYS COMPLAINING, IN NO PARTICULAR ORDER, ABOUT THE FOOD, THE COMMITTEE, THE GENERAL MANAGER, THE BAR FLIES, MOBILE PHONES, PRICES, UNCLE TOM COBBLEIGH AND ALL, BUT IN THE END DOING ABSOLUTELY NOTHING ABOUT IT AND ALLOWING THE INCIPIENT DECLINE TO CONTINUE FOR ANOTHER YEAR.

My proposals have three benefits: an easier life for the Chairman, and more effective life for the Committee and a far better Club for the members. Ask not what your Club can do for your ask rather what you can do for your Club.

COMMITTEE MEMBERS ARE NOT ALWAYS PRESENT AT THE CLUB, AND EVEN WHEN THEY ARE THERE THEY ARE NOT WALKING AROUND LOOKING FOR TROUBLE SPOTS, THEY RELY ON THE MEMBERS TO KEEP THEM INFORMED. BECAUSE THE COMMITTEE IS ELECTED TO REPRESENT THE INTERESTS OF ALL MEMBERS, THEY GENERALLY WILL NOT TAKE ANY ACTION AGAINST A MEMBER UNLESS THERE HAS BEEN A COMPLAINT MADE AGAINST THAT MEMBER BY ANOTHER MEMBER.

I DARE SAY THAT THE COMMENTS MADE BY BERT WITH REGARD TO THE LACK OF GOOD MANNERS, SPECIFICALLY ON THE PART OF THE COMMITTEE, ARE MADE AS A RESULT OF FRUSTRATION BORNE FROM AN APPARENT LACK OF ACTION. 


