

#### CASH COUPONS: SURCHARGE

Members were advised by circular that a surcharge was imposed on cash coupons sold to non-members from 29 August. The surcharge rate is ten baht per book.

Coupon books now contain coupons of various denominations to the total value of 90 Baht. These books will be sold at two rates as follows:-

- a. For Baht 100. To all visitors, guests and visiting members who have not paid a subscription.
- b. For Baht 90. To members and visiting members who have paid a subscription.

It is emphasised that books will be sold at the lower rate only if the purchaser can identify himself/herself as a Member or subscription paying Visiting Member by production of a Membership Card.

The sale of coupon books to the value of Baht 50 has been discontinued.

TOWELS

Since towels have been provided in the Clubhouse changing rooms there has been a fairly high disappearance rate. It would be appreciated by those who use the Changing Rooms if towels were not taken to the poolside and if towels taken home by mistake could be returned.

#### SWIMMING SECTION

Pool records tumbled at the British Club on 20/21 August as five clubs competed in the Club's annual International Gala. No fewer than 29 records were equalled or broken -- a tribute to keen competition among the clubs. Also, possibly, to the fact that many children were swimming in lower age-groups than normal because of the use, for the first time in the annual British Club gala, of the new FINA rules, which take the previous 1st January as the age-group qualifying date, rather than a competitor's actual birthday.

The Royal Bangkok Sports Club (RBSC) confirmed its dominance of Bangkok inter-club swimming yet again, scoring 715 points. Running a close second was the Suan Dusit club, with 612½ points. The Chiang Mai Club, with a much smaller team, put up a most creditable showing with 328½ points. The British Club, its squad depleted by several permanent or long-leave departures, came a solid fourth with 290. The Japanese Association of Thailand, competing in an international swim gala here for the first time, fielded a team of eager young swimmers. However, like the British Club, the Japanese had few swimmers in the older age-groups and got all their 225 points from the lower age-groups.

At a time when the International Club's squad was badly depleted by departures and leave, making it impossible for them to field a team, the appearance on the scene of the Japanese Association was most welcome. They are clearly set to provide strong competition to the other clubs in years to come.

Among the individual swimmers, brother and sister Vullop and Papanee Jirathornwatana of Suan Dusit are worthy of special mention. Each broke four British Club pool records. Patanaset Changkasiri and Sirirat Changkasiri of the RBSC each broke three, as did Pamela Cheuywawan and Chookiet Dejakul of Chiang Mai. Hiro Hioki became the first Japanese to enter the British Club's pool record list when he equalled the mark in the 7 & 8-year-old boys' 50 metre breastroke.

For the British Club, the biggest contribution of points came from the young age groups.

In the six and under group, Alexandra Weymouth gained three silver; Sarah Hughes two silver and three bronze; and Alexander Rogers came away with four gold and one silver. Of the 7-8 year olds, Apple Gwilliam won two silver and two bronze and David Bagley one bronze.

The 7-8 girls relay teams broke both team records for the medlay and the free relay.
