Letter from the Chair

Constitution. Rules and Bylaws



Dear Members,

Welcome back to those of you who have returned after the school holidays. This month I'd like to update you on our progress with the Constitution, Rules and Bylaws. We have now embarked on a complete review with two major objectives in mind:

- 1) To ensure that all rules are aligned with each other and to eliminate some inconsistencies, and
- 2) To bring the Rules into line with more modern practices and address what we perceive to be some current issues. The following are just a few examples (some more significant than others!):
 - Guest Rules At present our rules limit the number of times the same guest is allowed to visit the Club to three times per year and restrict us to three quests on each occasion. Do we enforce this rule or continue to allow some relaxation, which has been recent practice?
 - Temporary and Reciprocal members currently cannot bring in guests - other Clubs in the region differ - should we be more accommodating?
 - When the GC adopt new bylaws or make alterations to existing bylaws, should they continue to come into immediate effect or be displayed on the notice board for a period of one month ahead of coming into force? (To allow member comment if desired.)
 - At present if the member leaves a booked function, all guests must leave - should we relax this?
 - At present our Field Sports teams (mainly Rugby and Soccer) are restricted to five non-members. To encourage more competitive sports teams should we reconsider the number (and privileges) allowed as an "under-30, non-member sports player" in line with the 'non-member playing pass' proposed by a previous GC?
 - Our Club has been open for use on a regular basis by a number of 'Associate' and 'Community' groups (eg BAMBI, BCT, SPET, BWG, St. George's, etc). Should we formalise the relationship and establish rules to allow their continued use of the

facilities? Should we have these groups endorsed annually at the AGM? Current rules do not address use of the Club by these groups at all.

- As they are not members, should maids/ child carers be considered 'guests'? And therefore abide by the respective rules? Or should there be a special membership category adopted with its own set of rules/ restrictions? Should child carers/maids/ drivers only be allowed in the Club when the member is present?
- In the event of the divorce of a principal cardholder, should the divorced spouse (if they are an Associate member applying to join the Club in their own right) be allowed to join again immediately, without having to go to the bottom of the waiting list? (This is currently applicable for the spouse of a deceased member, children of Associate members and Associate members returning from absence).
- Should we allow members' next of kin, who are visiting Thailand, to use the Club's facilities free of charge for up to one month in any given year? This was actually agreed in principle by the GC last year, but never formalised.
- Should Associate members be allowed to attend and speak at General Meetings?
- Should there be reform of our GC composition and election procedure?

These are just some of the areas that in our view, and from member feedback, need reviewing. To help with the process, Barry and the membership team have been doing some research of other Clubs around the region to compare the various policies on some of these common themes. When the review is complete we will present it to members and ultimately take the proposals to an EGM. In the meantime, if you would like to comment on any of the above, or have any additional items that you think should be reviewed, please post your comments on the BCB Discussion Forum:





BRYAN BALDWIN O.B.E.

1937 - 2005

n 25th July Bryan Baldwin passed away only three days after his 68th birthday. Bryan was a great supporter of the British community in Thailand. He was Chairman of the British Club from 1991-1993 and most recently served on the Committee of the British Community in Thailand Foundation for the Needy (BCTFN), organisers of the Ploenchit Fair. He was also an Honorary Member of the British Chamber of Commerce Thailand (BCCT) and served as Chairman from 1992-1996.


Bryan was born in Lowestoft in Suffolk in 1937. He studied at Bromley Grammar School in Kent and, after school, completed National Service with the Royal Air Force before beginning his career with Castrol. Bryan undertook postings in London, Germany and Swindon before becoming Managing Director in Thailand only four years after the company was established here. It is a great tribute to Bryan that when he retired from Castrol some 20 or so years later, it was the fourth most profitable company in Castrol's worldwide network. He was awarded the OBE for 'Services to British Commercial Interests in Thailand' in December 1993.

I will always be grateful to Bryan for welcoming me to the British Club when I returned to work in Thailand permanently in December 1991. I remember well joining the Darts section at Bryan's invitation. He also appointed me as BCCT's Executive Director in December 1996. Admittedly I was a little concerned when he resigned as BCCT Chairman a few weeks later!

Bryan was a kind and generous man. A gentleman. He will be greatly missed by all who came into contact with him.



Recipes By JOHN

Mushroom and Barley Soup

1/3rd cup barley

7 cups water

1/4 oz dried porcini mushrooms

1 white of leek

1 tblsp olive oil

1 onion chopped

2 sticks of diced celery

2 whole chopped carrots

250 gram shitake mushrooms thinly sliced

2 tblsp tomato paste

2 tblsp medium dry sherry

13/4 cups beef broth

11/2 tsp salt

1/4 tsp black pepper



Cook barley in the water until tender, sauté the onion and celery until golden. Add carrots, shitake, leek and porcini and sauté until liquid disappears. Add tomato paste, sherry, beef stock, mushroom stock, cooked barley, salt and pepper and about three cups of water. Simmer for 10 to 14 minutes, until vegetables and barley, are cooked. Correct seasoning, add a knob of butter and some chopped parsley then serve.

Smugglers' Beef

200 grams beef tenderloin

Pinch of paprika

50 grams red bell pepper sliced

50 grams green bell pepper sliced

50 grams yellow bell pepper sliced

50 grams onion sliced

1/2 tsp garlic freshly chopped

3 tblsp red wine

2 tblsp oyster sauce

3 fresh oysters

3 tblsp chicken stock

3 tblsp gravy

1 tsp spring onions chopped

1 tsp basil freshly cut

Salt and pepper

1 knob of butter



In a hot wok, fry the strips of beef. Add the paprika, add all the vegetables and garlic, add the wine, add the chicken stock, add the oyster sauce, and add the gravy. Reduce down, being careful not to stew the beef. Add the oysters, chopped spring onions, basil and finish with the butter. Serve with rice.



Dear members

It has come to my attention that some members are unaware of the tennis cancellation rules. Cancellation of tennis court bookings must take place at least 24 hours prior to the booking time. Any member failing to give 24 hours notice will be fined the standard fee of 500 Baht, unless there are special circumstances, communicated to fitness staff or management prior to cancellation.

I would also like to remind all members that the tennis courts are available for members' use only. Although members are permitted to allow non-members to play tennis, any member is only allowed the same non-member into the Club three times per annum.

Below is the information on guests from the 'Constitution, Rules and Bylaws' booklet (Rule 62):

Each Ordinary, Country, Honorary, Non-Voting and Associate Member, and spouse thereof shall be entitled to bring guests into the Club with them so long as such introduction does not interfere with the convenience of members.

Such guests if they are residents of, or working in, Thailand may not be introduced to the Club more than three times per year without the prior approval of a Member of the Committee or the Manager. On each occasion a Member brings a guest to the Club the quest's name, nationality and address shall be entered in the book and kept in the Hall of the Club for this purpose. (Books are located at reception and in the Surawongse sala.) Such guests may not remain at the Club after the Member by whom they were introduced has left. Not more than three guests may be introduced by any one Member on the same day without the prior approval of a Member of the Committee or the Manager.
