



RBSC Invitational Meet (21/22 September)

The Thai Amateur Swimming Association topped the overall point score for the two day meet with 809 points. The host club, the Royal Bangkok Sports Club was a close second with 754 points. The Bangkok Aquatic Club was third with 362 points followed by the British Club team 139 points.

The British Club fielded its smallest team for years with only 37 swimmers but we were pleased to have eleven entries in the eight-years-and-under age group and with the continued participation in the training squad of these keen young swimmers the team will soon build up its strength again.

Julia Yetsenga was our outstanding swimmer winning two golds, two silvers, a bronze medal and a 4th and 5th place. She gained 29 points for the team. Hugh Rudder showed great improvement with two silvers, a bronze medal and three other places adding a total of 22 points to our tally. Both of these swimmers were placed in all six events they entered. Robyn Power scored 14 points with two bronze medals and three fifth places.

Other point scorers were Meredith Rudder (6) Tim Launder (3)
Debbie (2) Andrew (2) and Julie Hurrell (1). The girls eight-andunder team gained bronze medals for their third in the medley
relay. The places gained by our other relay teams added 64 points
to our score.

We extend our warm thanks to the RBSC for a well organised carnival and our congratulations to TASA and RBSC for their fine performance. Four of the awards for highest individual point scores went to TASA swimmers the other four were won by RBSC swimmers.
