


# FROM THE EDITOR

#### CRICKET

It may be hard to believe that with all the rain we have had reecently the start of the Bangkok cricket season is only a few weeks away. Weather permitting, we expect to have games arranged between November and March, including our usual participation in the cricket league. In previous seasons all matches have been at the RBSC only, but this year there is some hope that the new pitch at AIT at Rangsit may be available for the occasional game. Since last season we have lost several of our better players, including two persons who were responsible for running the cricket section in the last year, Lt Col John Davis and Neville Atherton. They will be hard to replace both for playing and administrative ability.

#### CRICKET LEAGUE

In the last two seasons, the British Club has managed to run two teams in the cricket league with reasonable success. However, it proved very difficult on occasions to choose full teams. This year we need to decide whether we can still maintain two league teams. It is sincerely hoped it will be possible since it does give members a better chance of getting a regular game. The league matches are played on Saturday afternoons 1.30 pm - 5.30 pm, 25 overs per side. Each team plays on average once every three weeks.

#### OTHER MATCHES

There are also several friendly matches arranged during the season against the RBSC and other teams and some of our members usually find places in the commonwealth matches which are played all day on Sundays. One or two social events too are held during the season culminating in the annual cricket dance at RBSC at the end of the season.

#### NET PRACTICE

In order to try to develop a passable team, cricket nets are organised on the area of the Club nearest the Narai Hotel. These have not been a great success and some thought into how they should be organised needs to be given soon. There are two nets available, adequate equipment and the turf is improving every year.

#### CHILDREN CRICKET

One of the reasons for introducing cricket to the Club a few years ago was to provide some additional sporting facilities for the children. The best time for arranging coaching is naturally during the months of July/August when so many children are returning from UK for their holidays. This year it was not possible to do much due to the early rains. Perhaps it would be feasible to arrange some coaching and matches against ISB and AIT during the Christmas/New Year period.

#### INFORMAL MEETING

All these matters will require some organisation and any keen volunteers will be welcome, whether they have just joined the club or are a seasoned members. We need to form a small cricket subcommittee for the season and to this end, an informal meeting will be held on Monday 6th October at the Poolside Bar at 6 PM. for all interested members. Whether you can attend or not or whether you are interested in playing for the club, but do not have time or inclination for the administrative side, please complete the enclosed questionnaire and drop it into the Club Manager's Office in the next few days. Your help will be very welcome either as a player, or a supporter.
