

TRAFALGAR DINNER

POOLSIDE WORKS STATUS

It is ten days since we mailed an update report from the Chairman of the GC, so below are notes on the situation as it was on 20th September with supporting photographs which illustrate the notes and give a general impression of how the area will look when all is completed.

We have asked the contractors to increase their manpower levels and start earlier in the morning as the current daily inclement weather means most works get halted in the afternoon.



• Fitness Centre and Kitchen extensions

These works are proceeding with the new windows already installed. Painting works have begun to be completed prior to the installation of the mirrors and more electrical equipment. The walls and sliding window for the kitchen extension have been finished and floor tiling is now taking place. The new space is bright and airy, with good views inside over the pool and Sala.





• Sala Roof and the Swimming Pool

The entire old roof has been removed and the trusses are almost completely in place. The bar is half complete. Our engineers have been running the electrical equipment and the plumbing will commence shortly.

The repair of the cracks is still on-going but should be completed a week before this magazine is issued. Part of the problems encountered included hidden plastic tubing and very old/large plastic water proofing.

The contractor has started tiling around the walls which are now watertight, and has prepared half the pool's base with cement ridges so tiling the base can begin as soon as the cracks are finally sealed.







Bangkok Community Theatre presents THE COUNTRY WIFE



The British Club is an oasis of peace and tranquillity in the heart of Bangkok. It echoes Britain of a bye-gone era when the British were renowned for good manners and gentlemanly behaviour in a green and pleasant land. But was it really so or is this a view through rose-tinted spectacles?

Judge for yourself between Wed 10th and Sat 13th October at 8pm in Surawongse Room, when Bangkok Community Theatre present their latest production, The Country Wife by William Wycherley, a hilariously bawdy, classic Restoration comedy where polite society is not nearly so polite once you examine it more closely. The play burst on the London scene in 1675, when the monarchy was restored after eighteen years of puritanical parliamentary rule which saw theatres close, being deemed little more than dens of debauchery.

William Wycherley was born near Shrewsbury, Shropshire and Shrewsbury International School has generously agreed to sponsor the show along with Global Investments (Far East) Ltd.

The Country Wife features an upper-class rake, Mr Horner, who pretends to be impotent. This leads foolish male aristocrats, such as Mr Pinchwife and Sir Jasper Fidget, to consider it safe to leave him with their wives. But while they are off attending to business, Homer is seducing their not so innocent and unwilling wives. When a naive young country girl, Margery Pinchwife, is introduced to London society, will she succumb to the sins of the city?

BCT newcomer James Laver plays the lovable rogue Horner. The cast includes new faces as well as some regular favourites such as Jonathan Truslow and Elise Meleisea. The Country Wife herself is played by the marvellous Nic Frances who almost stole the show in BCT's Pygmalion. It is directed by Severin Herbert, Head of Drama at Harrow International School.

The Country Wife is a riot of fun and typically British bawdy humour, full of double-entendres and the pricking of pomposity. If you think Benny Hill and the Carry On films rather than Shakespeare and Dryden, you might be nearer the mark!

We look back at the history of our Club in 1980 ...

The most notable achievement of this year was the launch in March of our new newsletter entitled 'Outpost' under the direction of General Committee member John S. Walker. This was printed 'in-house' with a small off-set printing machine we purchased and housed in a 'hut' just outside the side doors of the clubhouse (where the fire escape is now). It was well received especially by one wife of a member who took serious umbrage with the previously mentioned Ladies Advisory Liaison Group (see last month) and wrote pages and pages in Outpost condemning it.

For the past year the General Committee had been dogged with complaints about the poor quality and delivery of food from both kitchens. Management investigation revealed that the longer serving staff members were ignoring the advice and instructions from our relatively new Executive Chef Khun Pongsak (again, see last month's article). A bold step was thus taken to dismiss all six kitchen staff on 30th June and replace them all! We were taken to Labour Court over non-payment of a disputed final one month's salary — the Court subsequently awarded this to five of the six, as the sixth staff member was on 'her last warning'. Chairman Charles Stewart, who attended Court, was reported as saying to the GM "that's the fairest Thai court that I've ever experienced!"


Louis T. Leonowens company celebrated their 75th anniversary in this year by burying a time capsule monument at the Oriental Hotel — the Club, as requested, provided a copy of our Annual Report and Outpost and greeting and pictures from the General Committee. The Capsule was sealed in front of the Authors' Wing by guest of honour Colonel Dr. Thanat Khoman, deputy prime minister. One Club committee member present offered to buy drinks for those present when it is due to opened on 5th June 2055!

Our growing staff numbers created more disciplinary matters during the second part of the year with one Barman dismissed for falsifying chits and two gardeners given final

warnings for suspected theft. The General Committee thus appointed an Assistant Manager, Khun Adisak Asavakovit, previously of the International Social & Recreation Club in Soi Asoke, to help supervise our growing number of staff.

In an interesting tale in 'Outpost' was Khun Adisak playing the GM, Rupert Russell-Cobb, at tennis and winning the first game without the GM getting a point — a call was then heard across the net of "You're still on probation aren't you?" and Mr Cobb won the set 6-4!

The addition of 10 Associate members, the expansion of core nationality to Australian, Canadian and New Zealand citizens plus a strong recruitment drive amongst the Embassies did its job with membership at the year-end rising to 447, an increase of 15% over the previous year. The Club thus ended the year one member short of its previous membership record of 448 in 1973.

CHULA -LONGKORN DAY

October 23rd



"Phra Piya Maharat (The Great Beloved King)"

This day commemorates HM King Chulalongkorn (Rama V) who died on 23rd October 1910 and is regarded as one Siam's greatest monarchs. He was born on 20th September 1853 to HM King Mongkut (Rama IV) and HM Queen Debsirindra and educated within the Palace. Sadly at the age of 15 when accompanying his father on an expedition south of Hua Hin they both contracted malaria and HM King Rama IV died. The Prince was also unwell but was made King and crowned on 11th November 1868 under the regency of Chao Phraya Borom Maha Si Suriyawongse (after whom Suriwongse Road was named). The young King fully recovered from malaria and so at the age of 20, the age of maturity in Siam, he was crowned again on 16th November 1873.

HM King Chulalongkorn set upon many reforms of the Thai government by creating the Audit Office, the Council of State and the Privy Council and setting up seven Government departments. He developed local council administration with the establishment of monthons (regions), provinces, cities, amphoes, tambons, and villages. He also created the role of Crown Prince as successor to the Siamese

throne, set up the Royal Military Academy and was instrumental in establishment of the telegraph office, the telephone system, the post office, railways, newspapers, schools and banks as well as establishing the Ministry of the Capital to run Bangkok and bringing electricity to the Kingdom. King Chulalongkorn also abolished slavery in Siam. In 1897, and again in 1907, he visited the United Kingdom whilst on a tour of Europe and met with both Queen Victoria and Edward VII. He died on 23 October 1910 of kidney disease in Dusit Palace.

The Hindu festival of Dussehra or Vijayadashami is held to celebrate the victory of the Hindu God Lord Rama over Ravana, the ruler of Lanka who had abducted Rama's wife and it is normally celebrated only across South Asia. However the Hindu Temple in Silom Road, Wat Sri Maha Mariamma, on the corner of Pan Road also celebrates this on this day, so Silom Road southbound from Decho Road to the Holiday Inn and all of Surasak Road are *closed to traffic*—it is virtually only possible to access the Club from Suriwongse Road on this day.



PAVARANA DAY

October 30th

The period which is called Vassa, or Buddhist Lent, which started on Khao Pansa Day (August 2nd this year) officially ends on Pavarana Day. The word 'Pavarana' translates into 'inviting others to advise one' and comes from the practice started by Buddha at the end of the lent period, after hearing some monks had remained silent for three months, for them to speak out in open about what they liked or disliked about the monastic life so that improvements could be made within.



Opening Leads & Interference (by Helmer Nissen)

Sometimes, it seems very difficult to find the correct lead, while at other times it seems so obvious what to do. I still get surprised when some players are leading away from an ace against a trump contract, or playing 4th highest holding KQ76. Let's try a look at a hand from a recent tourney at the British Club:

The bidding went

Now you have to lead from this hand:

Ν	E	S	W	♦ J964
1♥	Р	Р	X	♥ J
1♠	2♦	2♥	Р	♦ AQ92
Р	3♣	3♥	all pass	♣ 10653

The reason for my reverse bidding in the minors was that I'd like to bid both suits if needed. But now I was on lead instead, and usually it isn't a popular choice to lead a singleton trump, but on this hand I think it is mandatory. Why?

Many things indicate that dummy must be having a singleton ♠: Partner's take-out double usually shows a 4-card ♠-suit, and both declarer and I have 4 spades. Another clue should be that dummy suddenly could bid twice on a hand holding 0-5 points.

When seeing dummy's hand I really liked my lead. 3♥ went two off.

I think many players would agree that the declarer made a mistake by bidding 14.

One day I was asked what to do when opponents interfere after an ace asking 4 NT. There are many conventions from which to choose, but here is my suggestion.

You have to think about what is the cheapest available bid at this high level. If the opponents interfere with a $5 \checkmark$ bid, and exactly $5 \checkmark$ was what you intended to bid, in this case I know many players who would double to show that "It was my bid". But what if your answer should be either $5 \spadesuit$ or $5 \spadesuit$?

PODI and PORI

4 NT (5♥)

If opponents bid a suit, what is the cheapest bid available? PASS!

Pass shows the first step, as if there had been no interference from opponents, 0 aces.

Double is the next step, showing 1 ace, while 5♠ would show 2 aces.

If your opponents doubled your 4NT, then the first available bid is again PASS, showing 0 aces.

Re-double would show 1 ace, and 5♣ would now show 2 aces and so on.

PODI - PO = Pass 0 aces, DI = Double 1 ace PODI - PO = Pass 0 aces, RI = Re-double 1 ace

To illustrate how this works, study the example below. You bid 4NT and opponent (a) does nothing; (b) interferes with 5♦; and (c) Doubles. How do you reply?

Why all this complicated bidding you may ask. To be able to double opponents when we don't have a slam, or to stay out of a slam when 2 aces are missing....
