



MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIRMAN



Chairman, General Committee

The main objective of this regular Outpost feature is to keep all Members abreast of the activities of the Club in general and to provide a further insight into other operational aspects.

Some highlights from mid August to mid September

- Revenue from August meant the Club's operations produced a financial surplus before depreciation of some 359,000 baht. For the first five months of this General Committee year this brings us to a surplus before depreciation of approximately 1,600,000 baht in total. These figures exclude membership joining fees.
- · Actually the Club's Cash in Bank position at the end of August stood increased from 29 million baht to some 30.5 million baht. We are now forecasting a Cash in Bank position of 31 million baht at the end of September.
- · Next, our Membership stands now at 1114, marginally down on our last report. As mentioned in the last Outpost, membership is always a key focus of Management and the General Committee monitors flows and trends carefully discussing any action needed at its monthly meetings.
 - Safety and Hygiene: The audit of our kitchens took place in mid August and the complete audit report is currently being evaluated by Management before presentation to the General Committee at the October GC meeting

General Club Improvements

Particular mention in last month's Outpost was made of some areas, outside of normal day-to-day general maintenance activities, that are in need of upgrading. Work in these areas has moved forwards:

• Actually the Staff House renovations were completed slightly behind schedule but on

budget at the end of August. There is a short article on these essential upgrades later in this Outpost Magazine.

- Rain has caused the first major floods of the year in the car parks and all our drainage systems, both at ground and roof levels, have been pushed through. After the rainy season has finished some of the car park areas will be lifted and all the parking bay demarcations will be repainted.
 - Electric lighting proposals for the multi purpose court have been resubmitted and hopefully a decision will be taken at the next GC meeting as to the way forwards.
 - Next on the maintenance list will be the Sala furniture which over the coming weeks will be cleaned down and upgraded. Meanwhile work on casting the new poolside manhole access covers has been completed. The review of the pool pump room has been carried out and as a result we will need to undertake remedial works to the concrete surrounds and beams.

CANCELLATION OF PROPOSED EGM

The EGM which should have taken place on the 15th September had to be cancelled and I must apologise to one and all for the lateness of this decision. That said the decision to cancel was not taken lightly and neither was it a decision which I took, or could take, alone. The decision was taken by all of the General Committee members, six in total, who did not sign up to the motion to call the EGM in the first place. The reasons for this cancellation were set out clearly in the email to all Members which was sent out on the 14th September.

"England Expects Every Man To Do His Duty"

Trafalgar Dinner is a Bangkok tradition - a black tie/uniform/national/ evening dress evening with cocktails, gourmet menu, fine wines, and a charismatic after-dinner speaker during the "passing the port" after the meal. The evening is open to gentlemen and ladies alike.

The Club first celebrated this event on 21st October 1960 and it became a tradition for many years under the auspices of the now defunct Bangkok

Naval Association. It was revived in the 1990s and again in 2011, and we have had three excellent dinners since then.

This year we are very pleased to welcome Captain Stuart Borland RN, the UK Naval & Air Advisor in Delhi.

Capt Borland joined the Royal Navy as a graduate engineer in 1984. Until promotion to Captain, he served at sea in every rank, in ships ranging from Amphibious Landing Platforms to Air Defence Destroyers and onto Aircraft Carriers. He has been fortunate to serve in



most of the World's oceans from counter-narcotic operation in the Caribbean to more challenging operations in the Gulf and amphibious operations in the Arctic. He has served in a number of staff appointments within the Navy, and with the Ministry of Defence in London and, although all these posts were interesting, he is not really comfortable sailing a desk. Consequently, when he completed his sea time as a Commander, he immediately volunteered for operational service

and was posted to the United States Embassy in Baghdad. Regular mortar attacks were something new to a sailor.

Latterly, Stuart managed to hold down a desk job for a couple of years in the UK before volunteering for Foreign Service and was rewarded with an appointment as the Naval & Air Advisor in Delhi. Working with the Indian military is just like meeting an old cousin. He is thoroughly enjoying his post while at the same time exploring as much of India as he can, learning Hindi and enjoying a real Indian curry.



Dear colleagues, partners, and stakeholders,

The Foreign and Commonwealth Office's Consular Strategy (2013-2016) focuses on improving the services we offer by concentrating on helping the most vulnerable people, and streamlining the notarial services offered by British Embassies and Consulates worldwide. We are now working on bridging the gap between implementing this strand of the strategy and helping British nationals comply with requirements set by local authorities.

British nationals currently in the UK, who intend to work, live, or study in Thailand may be asked to present their birth and/or marriage certificates as part of the requirements for a Thai visa. These must be 'authenticated' (also known as 'legalised') by the Royal Thai Embassy or Consulate where the certificate was issued. This process may also apply to people renewing a visa whilst living in Thailand. It involves the following steps:

Step 1: Contact the Legalisation Office, Milton Keynes, UK

To check if the document can be legalised and to apply online for this service please visit https://www.gov.uk/get-document-legalised

Before sending your document to the UK Legalisation Office, ensure that you pay the UK courier fee so that your documents can be forwarded to the Thai Embassy in London - enclose a pre-addressed envelope for the Thai Embassy, a completed application form (which can be found on the Thai Embassy website here) and the fee payment for the Thai Embassy.

Step 2: Have the document legalised by the Thai Embassy in London

Once the original document(s) have been legalised by the UK Legalisation Office the document(s) must be sent to the Royal Thai Embassy in London for the next stage of the process. If you have already paid the courier fee the UK Legalisation Office will send these for you. Further information can be found on the Royal Thai Embassy website. http://www.thaiembassyuk.org.uk

Contact the Royal Thai Embassy to inform them that your documents will be arriving.

Step 3 For use in Thailand the document(s) must be stamped by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Legalisation Division, Bangkok, http://www.mfa.go.th/main/en/services/16265-Naturalization-Legalization.html

Before undertaking these steps, British nationals are encouraged to contact the local authorities for confirmation on what is required.

Please share this information with British colleagues, prospective new members of staff, partners, or friends and their families who intend to work, live, or study in Thailand.

I appreciate the challenges faced by those living overseas of getting documents legalised in the UK, and would like to assure you that we are reviewing the way these services are provided and working with the Thai authorities to try to improve this process.

As announced already, Saturday 17 October will be the date for the Bruce Gordon Cup, if you still want to play please speak to the committee or Amnat as there may still be standby places left.





Bruce Gordon; (1934 - 2008)

Bruce Gordon was a stalwart of the British Club tennis section and from his first days as a new member in May 1991 until he sadly died in 2008, he actively promoted and encouraged all aspects of tennis and was always happy to help. Whether it was Junior's, Mix-In, Matches or Inter-Club, Bruce supported them all, often cajoling the players to give up their Saturday or Sunday to travel far and wide to represent the club.

In turn, the tennis section, particularly the morning tennis players and many of his club friends - Phairoj, Jesada, Steve Goode and others, supported him in his hour of need when at the age of 74 he was diagnosed with cancer and after surgery was admitted to Bangkok General Hospital. These members, who are still at the club today, immediately rallied round and put in place sufficient funds for Bruce to receive the best possible hospital care, which he received until he sadly passed away on 7 September 2008.



The Bruce Gordon Cup was donated to the Club for the purpose of holding an annual competition to promote tennis and in 2014 we successfully held another event to commemorate his legacy. Bruce Gordon should always remain an inspiration to us all, in how to behave on a tennis court, to enjoy the game at whatever age and for as long as physically possible – to go out there to have fun.

In memory of Bruce we say "for he was a jolly good fellow".
