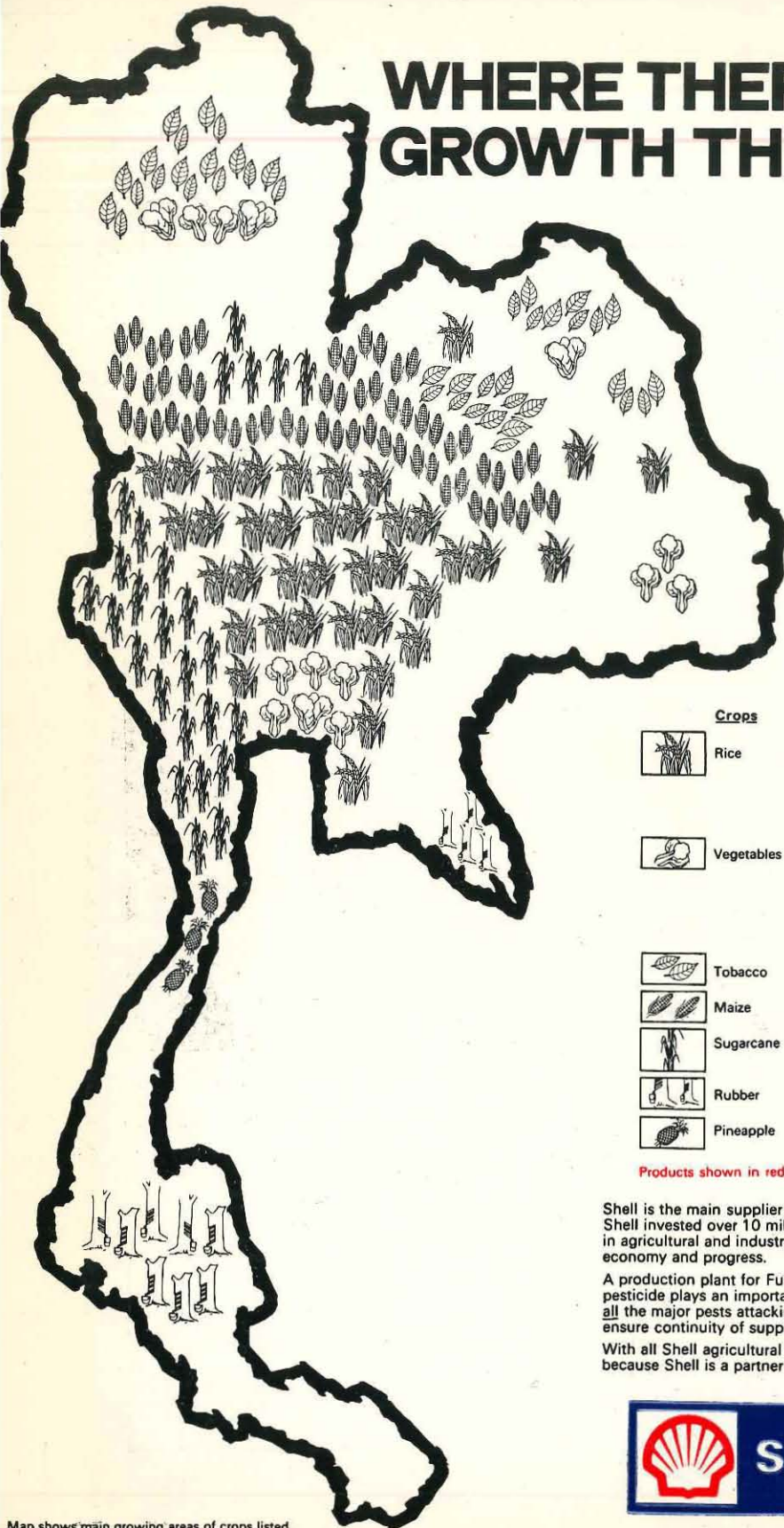








ตลอดระยะเวลา 75 ปี คาสโตรลได้ทำการผลิต ค้นคว้าและพัฒนาผลิตภัณฑ์น้ำมันหล่อลื่นทุก ๆ ประเภทอย่างไม่หยุดยั้ง เพื่อให้ได้มาซึ่งน้ำมันและการหล่อลื่นที่มีประสิทธิภาพนับแต่ ค.ศ. 1899 อันเป็นยุคที่เครื่องยนต์กลไกเริ่มเข้ามาใช้กันอย่างแพร่หลาย ขว และเขียว 2 ผลิตภัณฑ์ที่เป็นที่เลื่องลือและมีความก้าวหน้าของเทคโนโลยีในด้านนี้ควบคู่ไปกับความสำคัญของการผลิตน้ำมันหล่อลื่น ในขณะเดียวกัน ด้วยวิสัยทัศน์และความสามารถพิเศษของเขานั่นเอง ในปี 1909 ขว คาสโตรลจึงเริ่มแพร่หลายออกสู่ตลาด และในที่สุดก็เป็นที่รู้จักกันทั่วโลก



เมื่อปี 1924 นักบิน อเล็กซานเดอร์ กรังเจลี ได้ใช้เครื่องยนต์ของคาสโตรลในเครื่องบินของเขา ซึ่งมีความเร็วถึง 140 ไมล์ต่อชั่วโมง ด้วยน้ำมันเครื่อง คาสโตรล

จากกระแสรถเร็วเป็นต้นมา เวลล์ฟอร์ด มุ่งมั่นค้นคว้าและผลิตเครื่องยนต์น้ำมัน และการหล่อลื่นเท่านั้น ทั้งนี้เพราะ เวลล์ฟอร์ด ตระหนักดีว่าเคล็ดลับในการยึดอายุการใช้งาน และเสริมสร้างสมรรถนะของเครื่องยนต์นั้น ขึ้นอยู่กับคุณภาพในการหล่อลื่นของน้ำมันนั่นเอง



เมื่อปี 1925 นักบิน อเล็กซานเดอร์ กรังเจลี ได้ใช้เครื่องยนต์ของคาสโตรลในเครื่องบินของเขา ซึ่งมีความเร็วถึง 140 ไมล์ต่อชั่วโมง ด้วยน้ำมันเครื่อง คาสโตรล

ระหว่างสงครามโลกครั้งที่หนึ่ง คาสโตรลได้นำ คาสโตรล อีอาร์ ออกสู่ตลาด ทำให้เครื่องยนต์ปฏิบัติการสมรรถนะของกองทัพอากาศอังกฤษได้เปรียบศัตรูโดยสามารถบินฝ่าสภาวะอากาศที่เย็นจัดและบินได้ในระดับสูงกว่า

ในขณะที่เครื่องยนต์มีความเร็วสูงขึ้นน้ำหนักเบา ใช้เครื่องยนต์แบบรอบจัด คาสโตรลก็เป็นรายแรกๆ โดยเป็นผู้นำในด้านน้ำมันผสมซูเปอร์เทคเพนประสิทธิภาพในการหล่อลื่น ในปี 1953 คาสโตรลได้ผลิตน้ำมันหล่อลื่นประเภทมัลติเกรด ออกวางตลาดเป็นครั้งแรกของโลกนั่นคือ คาสโตรล 10

จนกระทั่งถึงสงครามคาสโตรลได้ก้าวต่อไปอย่างไม่หยุดยั้ง ผลิตรถน้ำมันหล่อลื่นเครื่องยนต์ เจท



ชัยชนะในปี 1960 ของนักแข่งรถชาวอังกฤษในรถแข่งของคาสโตรล

ซึ่งได้ชื่อว่าเป็นที่รู้จักมากที่สุดคือ คาสโตรล 90 และเข้ามาในปี 1960 ระบบขับเคลื่อนล้อหน้า และเครื่องยนต์ระบบไอเวอรี่เฮด แคมshaft ที่เริ่มเป็นที่รู้จักแพร่หลาย เครื่องยนต์ทั่วไปที่ในอเมริกาสูงขึ้นไปอีก คาสโตรลจึงได้ค้นคว้าปรับปรุง และปฏิวัติอุตสาหกรรมพิเศษ ซึ่งช่วยลดการสึกหรอในเครื่องยนต์ สารหล่อลื่นเหล่านี้หลังจากนำมาใช้ประมาณ 10 ปีราว ค.ศ. 1970 เป็นยุคที่รถทั่วไปมีความเร็วสูงขึ้น แม้กระทั่งรถยนต์นั่งขนาดครอบครัวก็สามารถวิ่งได้เร็วกว่ารถสปอร์ตรุ่นก่อน ๆ คาสโตรลจึงได้คิดค้น และผลิตน้ำมันสมรรถนะสูงขึ้น เพื่อคุณภาพสูงสุดของการหล่อลื่น คาสโตรล จี ที เอ็กซ์ จนเป็นที่รู้จักกันทั่วโลก



ในปี 1960 รถยนต์รุ่นนี้ ได้ใช้เครื่องยนต์ของคาสโตรล

ทั้งนี้ไปว่าเป็นน้ำมันเครื่องรุ่นนำของอังกฤษ ปัจจุบันชื่อคาสโตรลเป็นที่รู้จักอย่างกว้างขวางจนเป็นที่เปรียบเทียบกับเมืองอื่นที่นำมันหล่อลื่นที่มีคุณภาพสูง ก็หมายถึงคาสโตรล บรรดาเมืองอุตสาหกรรมประเทศ ทั้งในและนอกสนามแข่งต่างให้ความไว้วางใจและนิยมเลือกใช้แต่ คาสโตรล สำหรับรถประเภท ทูทูนาค สำหรับในประเทศไทยนั้น ท่านสามารถหาซื้อน้ำมันเครื่องที่ดีที่สุดได้จากร้านที่มีป้าย แดง ขว และเขียว



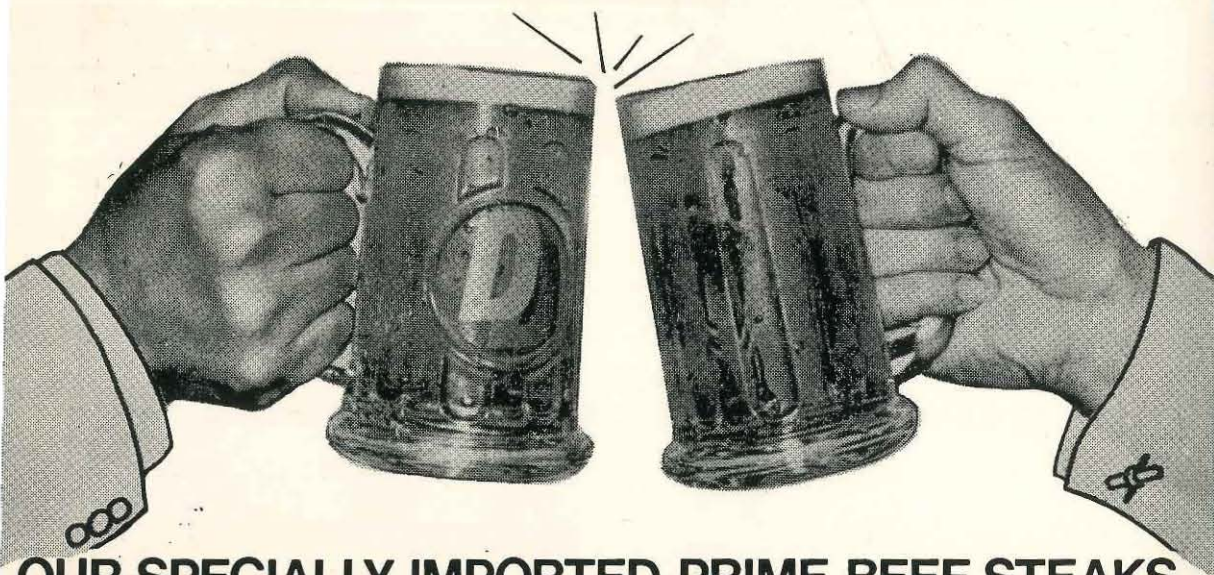
