

A CITY BIKE TOUR



When I read about the Bike tour of Bangkok, the early morning wake-up call was not part of my plan, but the pictures on the poster looked enticing! I threatened to cancel several times, but managed to arrive at the British Club in time on the appointed morning.

We were shuttled to River City mall where we joined a tour organized by Co Van Kessel. Still adjusting to the early morning start, I went through the motions of getting a bike and heading off in the direction of Chinatown. To my delight, we cycled though some scenic alleyways, and unique markets, which during the 8 years of living in Bangkok, I have never seen. In the early morning the markets were alive and the temples bustling with activity.

I was then surprised, that on arriving at a ferry pier, we were put onboard and taken across the Chao Praya River to Thonburi. The tour took us along spectacular elevated path that meandered along the river all the way to Wat Arun.

After cycling along for about 20 minutes, the tour group arrived at a canal where a long tail boat was waiting to take us through the back canals. I have always been intriqued by the Thai ingenuity and ability to organize "take-away", and here the bikes were loaded onto racks at the back of the boat.

It has been several years since I toured the canals and I fell in love with the quaint stilted houses, along with the unique life style all over again. The boat trip took us to the green belt of Thonburi, where we got back on the bikes. We cycled along another elevated walkway, through farms and orchards, which were picturesque, and also unexpected, being so close the metropolis of Bangkok.

The Bike tour brought us to a temple complex next to a canal where there was a local floating market,





not one designed to attract tourists. After a refreshing drink break, we continued along the canal, stopping at an open restaurant, where an extensive lunch of salads, chicken, and curries had been provided for us.

Back on the bike, I became a bit nervous, thinking that we were so far from Bangkok, but after a comfortable ride, we once again joined the long tail boat which to my relief took us quickly back to our point of departure on the river.

It was an amazing tour, well worth the early start. It was extremely well organized, and safe. I can highly recommend this outing as it gives the tourist a glimpse into a unique relatively unchanged lifestyle in the middle of a busy city.

Awarded The Design Mark



Bangkok Patana School is the first school in Thailand to have been awarded The Design Mark in recognition of its excellence in teaching design. This quality standards framework has been developed by the UK Government's Department for Education, The Design Council and the Design & Technology Association. As a Design Mark holder the school joins an elite list of only 51 other schools in the world, and just two outside of the UK, who are delivering the very best design education to their students.

Richard Smith, Head of the Design and Technology Faculty explains more. "The inspiration behind the school's application came from attending the first International Design and Technology Conference in South East Asia in 2012. I immediately recognised that the work we do at Bangkok Patana was worthy of this aspirational recognition and status. The process has spanned just over 18 months and has involved the members of the faculty evaluating our provision for, and practice in, design education in order to meet the criteria of the quality standards framework."

The school's application was scrutinised by two independent moderators, one of whom commented "I think it is the best application I have seen. You should be really proud of the work you and your team are producing, simply outstanding."

The attainment of The Design Mark reflects the strong design ethos embedded throughout the school, where design has been skilfully used on create an atmosphere that promotes learning. It also recognises the innovative practice undertaken by the faculty, such as working with industry leaders to make potential design scenarios real and its commitment to sharing good practice locally within Thailand and throughout the region. The excellence in design teaching is also reflected through the outstanding 2014 (I)GCSE results for Design & Technology, with 50% of Bangkok Patana candidates receiving an A*, and a further 29% achieving an A grade.



FLEET OF FAME The 2014 Trafalgar Dinner

Widely acknowledged as one of the greatest naval victories of all time, the legend of Vice Admiral Horatio Nelson leading the British fleet into a staggering conquest of the combined French and Spanish navies in 1805 is well-known to British children and many others worldwide.

64 Club Members, their other halves and guests attended this year's commemorative dinner in the Suriwongse Room

on Saturday 18th October. The evening started out with complimentary cocktails in the Wordsworth Lounge and on the 1910 Balcony. The cocktails were aptly chosen and included the Navy Blue and the Thai Trafalgar. Distinguished guests included British Ambassador HE Mark Kent and his wife Martine Delogne, the speaker for the evening Defence Attaché Colonel Chris Luckham OBE, and members of the US, Canadian and German embassies. After a light introduction from MC Jeremy followed by a warm welcome from GC Treasurer Bill Wilcox, the Royal and Loyal toasts were conducted by the Ambassador and everyone settled down for their repast amid. The menu covered lobster mousse, butternut and apple soup, Tilapia in Alfredo sauce, beef tenderloin in mushroom port sauce, and homemade shortbread with a lashing of homemade lemon curd. Each course before the dessert was accompanied by splendid wine, including Mouton-Cadet claret and Broken Hills Amanda's Brook.

Once the meal was devoured, the port arrived, and the speaker started. His knowledge about the battle and the vice-admiral were astonishing, and everyone was engrossed in his account of the famous event. His speech reached its conclusion with a call to sing, which was novel if slightly inaudible.

It was a terrific evening, and hats off to Khun Prem, Khun Laak, Khun Somboon and their respective teams for organising it so well and to such a high standard.





























ASIA BEER FEST

Well now that OctoberFest has been and gone we need to wait another year before the NextFest or do we

British Club Hat (B.C.Hat) was challenged to search Thailand and the surrounding countries to see what local beers were on offer.

After a quick trip to Pattaya-sur-plage where old favourites like Singha, Leo and Chang are still strong contenders it was passport in hand and airport bound.

The Indonesian island of Bali is a haven in it's own right but with a refreshing bottle of Bintang beer it is heaven. Visas on arrival at this destination make it an easy escape from the heat of Bangkok. Unless you are sitting poolside at the Club enjoying a cool Singha.

Sure you don't need to travel to Laos to get a Beerlao as this brew is readily available here at the Club but the lure of a Unesco World Heritage site at Luang Prabang and the thought of sitting riverside Mekong with BeerLao in hand was too much for B.C.Hat.

Again like Indonesia visas for Laos can be obtained on arrival. A visit to the Embassy of the People's Republic of China here in Bangkok had B.C.Hat visa ready within a day. Hainan, an island at the southern tip of China is more a local Chinese holiday destination and hence little or no English is spoken but as B.C.Hat was here on a beer mission there was little problem to point at beer bottles and nodding!

So our last trip takes us to Myanmar and again like China B.C.Hat had to collect a visa from the local Embassy of the Republic of the Union of Myanmar with little paper work involved. Yangon is currently an enormous building site like Bangkok, roads, office blocks, condos, malls but fortunately several of the old buildings are under preservation. A walking tour of downtown is not advised as the pavements are a little nondescript to say the least so B.C.Hat embarked on a three hour circular train trip around the city This railway system like all of Myanmar is narrow gauge which rattles and shakes like nobody's business. Once back at the terminus the cool refreshing local Myanmar beer was a welcome relief.

Await for B.C.Hat's next exploits till then pick up a beer and count the days till OctoberFest 2015.




We look back to the history of our Club in 2004 ...

Unfortunately the year itself did not start off too well ... whilst the Poolside building was having its roof repaired a huge storm hit late at night and basically wrecked it - severe damage was done to the changing rooms, leaking though into the Fitness Centre, Squash Courts and Thai Kitchen. Thankfully quick thinking security staff moved the Fitness Centre equipment out of the building to a place of safety so that was mainly saved. Months of negotiations with insurers finally paid out a six figure sum so repairs could be completed but it had an initial negative effect on recruitment and was a serious inconvenience to members.

The major task of the year for the General Committee was to find a new General Manager. Willem had left after four years, and the General Committee's first action was to appoint Barry Osborne (Operations Manager) as acting General Manager. Over 100 applications were received by the Club, and it took until the March to screen these down to a 12-person shortlist, and in May we arrived at the 'perfect' candidate. A long series of discussions took place on salary package but just as it looked like he would sign up, he took a different job! The General Committee then took the most popular of decisions, as Barry Osborne had been acting the role for so long, in July he was appointed General Manager, a role he stayed in until March 2010.

A General Manager leaving occasionally leaves you finding hidden bombshells. It was soon found that the Minute Book had not been kept up to date for most of the past year, that various committee documents, mainly Policies & Procedures, were not to hand and work on Thai version of our Constitution (it not being in keeping with the Thai Civil & Commercial Code as required by the Commerce Ministry) had not been completed (see below). It was also found that the Associate Member quota had been breached, so no new Associate members could join for the first four months of the year.

As well as losing a General Manager, our Financial Controller left the Club for better prospects and sadly her replacement resigned within weeks and it was several months before a second replacement was found. This elongated interregnum allowed members



who were habitual late payers to go unchecked so at one point club members were some 1.3 Million Baht overdue (that is accounts unpaid at least two months). Serious work was undertaken on this and a 500 Baht late payment fee started to be charged on those who did not pay the month the account is due (i.e. pay in November for October chits).

The AGM in March did not fare too well either as it was found out too late that the proxy forms mailed out with Calling Notice had missed off two-thirds of the agenda items (see insert). These had to be deferred to an Extraordinary General Meeting promised by end of June.

Thus on 29th June, an Extraordinary General Meeting was held to deal with the matters postponed from the Annual General Meeting as well as the constitutional matters arising from last year (see above). At the EGM itself: A motion attempting to re-organise the entire Club committee structure was defeated and all related motions on constitutional changes fell; a series of motions to align the Thai and English constitutions were passed; and finally a new rule was brought in to limit the number of terms served by a member of the General Committee to five. The latter rule was abolished earlier this year.

The Club year was not all doom and gloom. Membership ended at its highest ever figure of 1,110 after a late surge and the financial year showed a cash surplus (helped a lot by an insurance pay-out!) but nothing was going to prepare the Club for 2005 ... the male bastion of the Club was to be hit the first of two mortal blows.

Sadly the year in Asia did end in doom and gloom, and we must put on record the tragedy of 26th December when a Tsunami struck throughout the Indian Ocean region and 227,898 people died: more next month on the magnificent efforts of the British community and the Club to help those in Thailand hit by this near global catastrophe.



POOLSIDE ETIQUETTE

The basic courtesies of sharing a space


A number of Members have commented on how general behaviour and courtesy at the poolside area has degenerated over the last few years. This may be due to the Club being busier, a change in type of Member, or just coincidental incidents. But it's not satisfactory.

At busy times, the poolside area can accommodate well over 100 Members, guests and family members. They are not all swimming, some may be playing tennis or squash, some may be eating, some may be relaxing or exercising. Their differing objectives bring differing expectations, and clashes will occur if people do not make the effort to compromise on behaviour in order to ensure everyone can have a nice time and enjoy their visit. Being courteous and considerate will minimise other people's dissatisfaction, and exercising a bit of personal or parental control will make sure nobody goes away feeling their visit has been ruined unnecessarily.

Being aware of basic etiquette below and ensuring that quests, children and their friends are familiar with it, will go a long way to ensuring a pleasurable time and coexistence. There is no lifequard at the Club nor staff dedicated to police behaviour throughout the

day so it is up to everyone to keep an eye on what's going on for the benefit of all.

- Do not help yourself to more towels than allowed, nor save chairs or tables for friends who have not vet arrived unless truly imminent. If you've read a newspaper, return it for others to enjoy. Use the litter bins provided.
- Wear a bathing suit that will not cause offence and is in line with international standards, but respectful of other Members' age and nationality.
- Shower before using the pool, enough to clean off sweat, dust, and sunscreen which has not been rubbed in properly. Make sure plasters are waterproof or well adhered. Remember all of poolside is a no smoking area.
- Do not leave children unattended, or if you feel confident enough to do so, then check on them often and make sure their behaviour is not likely to disturb others. Kids aren't angels! If they are impolite or cause upset, be adult and nice enough to apologise. People will understand and respect you for it, just part of being a good parent.
- Do not urinate in the pool, and instruct children likewise.



- Keep noise and basic language under control. Many people want time to quietly relax, and are disturbed by screaming shouting and coarse language. What you think is ok for you may not be for another - and vice versa!
- There's no diving, and if jumping in, don't dive-bomb or cannonball near others in or out of the pool. Children should be taught to look before they jump in, and see who is around when playing in a group so as not to disturb. Splashing, playing, climbing on each others shoulders, can cause offence or difficulties for others who don't swim so well, so stay away from them! Running around the pool can be dangerous so don't overdo it when having fun.
- Leave the areas designated as lanes for serious swimmers, do not sit bounce or play with the lane dividers, and if you need a rest, swim to a quiet corner or at the edge away from others, so you can re-energise properly. Don't play in the lanes where people are swimming, and don't swim through or in front of groups of adults or children.
- · If there's a problem, try and politely sort it out by approaching others and talking to them. Keep tempers in check, despite the heat and irritation, as aggression is not a solution and will only lead to disciplinary situations.

Enjoy the poolside area, and please alert a member of staff or one of the Managers to any incidents if necessary.


you shall learn of this sick cancer running through the Fantasy Football League.

And now, because of bloody Fantasy Football, you sometimes wish that your real, and very dear, EPL







