

Every man aged 50 years or older needs to know the risk of developing prostate cancer. One of the easiest and most available methods of detection is the blood test known as Prostate Specific Antigen or PSA



MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIRMAN



Silom Wing: I was always told that the last 5% is the most difficult part of a construction project and certainly the Silom Wing is proving that way. The contractors scrambled to get the hoardings down so that Members and visitors could view the site during the Living in Bangkok event on 29th September and it was our plan to have a soft opening on 13th October. But alas that did not prove possible. Some finishes were simply not ready and on-going daily torrential downpours delayed the pouring of concrete and prevented the laying of poolside surrounds which require dry surfaces before adhesives can be applied.

Most feedback on 29th was very positive and we are all eager to get everything open before the busy festive season starts. As I write this, just two weeks before the planned official opening, a few days of sun would be very welcome and it is very much a 'fingers crossed' situation. But by the time you receive this copy of Outpost we should have stepped into the future and enjoyed a happy celebration. Lots of fun activities are being prepared.

Living in Bangkok: It was the first time for the Club to host Living in Bangkok, in fact the first time it had been held anywhere other than at Bumrungrad Hospital where it was created 20 years ago.

Organising an event of this scale in a new location was a major logistical challenge with huge unknowns. However, we were incredibly lucky to have a mostly dry day in this wettest of years, and everything was pulled off with aplomb. Over 80 'vendors' displayed their products and services and over 2,000 Members and visitors are estimated to have attended. Everyone seemed to enjoy the day; next year's date has already been set for and with this experience behind us it should just get better and better.

Clubhouse Brickwork: The other day an observant visitor pointed out that the newly exposed Clubhouse brickwork displays an historic style known as 'English Garden Wall Bond'. According to 'Heritage Directory', historic buildings feature patterns made by laying bricks exposing the longer face of the brick (stretchers) and the shorter face or the brick (headers) in different combinations. The English Garden Wall Bond was used from the late 18th Century featuring three rows of stretchers and one row of headers, rarely found apparently outside the North of England where it was common. Modern cavity walls have resulted in the monotonous use of stretchers although 'snapped' headers are used on new buildings in conservation areas to provide character.

There remains speculation where the bricks were made. We know that the original ironwork, drain down pipes, brass shutter hinges etc., were imported from England and maybe the bricks were also? But they could also have been brought in from British India. Whatever, it is great to see them again in their full historic glory!

Honours Boards: I have no idea when the first Honours Boards were hung in Club House but probably a very long time ago, a tradition featured in Clubs all around the world. They have their charm but are expensive to maintain and keep looking nice. It costs over 1,000 baht just to add one name to a board and the gold paint doesn't last well in the tropics. Our boards take up a lot of space, many names are barely legible and they already fill most of the available space. To be less kind, they really don't look very good!



The Chairmen's board became full last year and a decision had to be made about creating a new board. The General Committee decision was to break from tradition by replacing the wooden boards with gold lettering with printed and framed versions. This offered lots of benefits. They could be smaller, taking up less space, and updating them would simply require reprinting an A1 size sheet of paper at a cost of about 100 baht. At any time, layout, fonts and colours will be able to be readily changed and if new names are discovered from missing years in the past (there are many) they can easily be incorporated.



Our hope is to replace all of the other Loyal Society and Sports boards in the same style in the near future, thus creating more space for other pictures or hangings. Although all changes at the Club usually prove controversial we trust that most Members will approve.

And finally a public service notice ...

Voting in the UK: Did you know that if you have been on the electoral role in the UK in the last 15 years you are eligible to vote in UK General Elections, Referendums and, for now, the EU Parliament Elections? Did you know that you can register to vote online? And did you know that you must then reregister annually to retain your vote?

Well done if you have answered 'Yes', because lots of British expatriates do not know their voting rights or how to exercise them. There are no reliable statistics, but is estimated that less than one third of eligible expats voted in the last General Election.

Retirement Income Matters

UK Pensions

Many Brits retiring overseas may have acquired UK pension rights. It is possible to minimise the UK tax liability on this stream of income, applicable to company pensions (Final Salary/Defined Benefit, and Occupational Money Purchase) and individual pensions (Personal Pension Plans).

From April 2006 until April last year, for those with UK pension income in excess of the UK Personal Allowance (£11,850 currently), Recognised Overseas Pension Schemes (ROPS) were an option which could offer favourable income tax treatment. And historically, Guernsey and then Gibraltar were the jurisdictions of choice for Thailand residents.

Unfortunately this is no longer a viable option. Below we look at why.

UK Income Tax and UK Pensions

UK pension income can normally be paid anywhere in the world, and usually after 20% basic rate Income Tax is deducted at source, with the final Tax liability based on self-assessment tax returns and UK income tax rates and allowances.

Double Taxation Agreements

If one can obtain a Double Taxation Agreement (DTA) between the UK and the country of residence, UK pension income may be paid gross from the UK to be taxed locally instead. This will normally be possible if HMRC have proof that local tax is being deducted or that specific criteria are being met.



In certain countries, and in most parts of Asia, this can be difficult.

The **UK/Thailand** Double Taxation Treaty (DTT) specifically excludes an article to cover any other UK pension arrangements apart from UK Government (civil service) Pensions: "Treaty does not include an article dealing with Non-Government pensions. Also, no relief for UK State Pension."

In addition, Article 19 of the UK/Thai DTT covering governmental services states that any pension subsequently paid in respect of past governmental or local authority service can be taxed in the country where the individual is resident, provided the pensioner is a national and a resident of that country for the exemption to be applied.

Therefore, local tax treatment is only possible for a Brit in Thailand who has

a UK Civil Service Pension Scheme and has become a Thailand citizen – not a common situation.

<u>UK Pensions paid for service outside</u> the UK

Some pensioners receive occupational pensions from the UK, but have spent all their working years, or a substantial period of service, performing duties outside the UK.

HMRC ruling ITEPA03 charges income tax on all pensions paid from the UK.

However, the PAYE regulations set out special provisions that exempt the pension from PAYE where the pension arises from employment wholly carried on abroad. This applies only to non-resident pensioners.

When an employee has been non-resident and worked outside the UK for complete tax years, then the pension is exempt from the operation of PAYE. An employment is regarded as having been carried on abroad if:

1.1 the last ten years-service in respect of which the pension is paid was abroad

or

1.2 the service that was carried out abroad amounted to half of the total service in respect of which the pension is paid

and

1.3 covered at least ten of the last twenty years.

Investment Income

Offshore

For a non-UK resident individual, UK tax would not apply to any distributions received (dividends or savings). However, local tax may be deducted at source and it is unlikely it could be reclaimed.

UK

For non-residents, income from UK savings & investments is treated for UK tax purposes for non-residents is governed by a specific HMRC regulation.

Except for UK property income and trade investment income, the tax charge for non-residents on investment income arising in the UK is restricted to the amount of tax, if any, deducted at source. If the tax charge is limited in this way, the Personal

Allowance will not be available for other income. So non-residents without UK property or UK pension income may receive UK investment income, and the tax paid cannot be more than:

- the amount of tax that would be chargeable on income, other than 'disregarded income' (see below), but before the deduction of any personal allowances due;
- plus the amount of tax deducted at source from the 'disregarded income'.

'Disregarded income' includes:

- interest and alternative finance receipts from banks and building societies;
- dividends from UK companies;
- income from Unit Trusts/OEICs etc;
- certain social security benefits such as State Pensions or widows' pensions.

For those with UK Rent or UK Pension income, any UK tax liability on UK investments could instead be taxable based on the current UK Savings and Dividend Allowances. •

Bangkok, 8 October 2018

From 1 January 2019, the British Embassy Bangkok will no longer be providing British Nationals with letters confirming their income. This letter has previously served as a supporting document for obtaining a Thai retirement or marriage visa. The British Embassy Bangkok is stopping the certification of income letters because it is unable to fulfil the Thai authorities' requirements to verify the income of British Nationals.

British Nationals should now demonstrate that they have an amount of at least 800,000 THB in an account in Thailand for no less than three months prior to the visa application, or a monthly income of at least 65,000 THB transferred into an account in Thailand for a retirement visa. For a marriage visa, the amounts are 400,000 THB in an account in Thailand for no less than three months prior to the visa application, or a monthly income of at least 40,000 THB transferred into an account in Thailand. A bank statement should be used as the supporting document for obtaining a Thai retirement or marriage visa.

All British Nationals concerned should note that the last date for income letter applications is 12 December 2018.

NOTES TO EDITOR

- A) Requirements for a retirement visa:
 - Must be at least 50 years old;
 - Must have an amount of at least 800,000 THB in an account in Thailand for no less than three months prior to the application for a visa, or a monthly income of at least 65,000 THB;



The British Club has 396 reciprocal club in 55 countries around the world so checked them out before traveling overseas. Details can be obtained with Membership at reception.






FOOD SAFETY HYGIENE TRAINING

ere at the Club we take our food hygiene standards very seriously, we hold regular training sessions and participate in independent outside courses for all our chefs and food handlers.

In addition to this we also have an annual audit where an outside company comes and checks our kitchens, stores, prep areas and equipment. All the kitchen team and food handlers take a one-day training course and then sit a final exam - each time the level goes up and everyone that passes receives their next certificate, any that fail to pass repeat the training and take the test again.

We are in the process of upgrading all our equipment and storage areas and look forward to next years audit where we expect to achieve our best ever results.







CATS AT THE CLUB

everal editions ago we had an article about the cats at the club and we feel it is important that members understand how they are controlled. Therefore we are publishing it again.

There are currently five cats being looked after by the British Club. They have all been spayed and are in good condition.

Khun Rit from the fitness section is responsible for making sure that the cats are fed and, after consultation with management, to arrange for the cats to be taken to the vet if necessary.

A cat colony is needed at the club to keep the other stray cats away and to deal with vermin, which are rife in Bangkok. By having the colony we can also monitor the health of the cats.

Occasionally a cat will leave a dead rat behind the tennis courts to show that they are doing their job. Without the colony of British Club cats the club would have all the stray cats around the area wandering in and out of the club, they would hang around food areas and no one would have any knowledge of their health.

Members should remember that **the cats aren't pets** and **shouldn't feed them**. They are fed at the same place and time every day which stops them hanging around food areas.



urn back the clock 130 years. What would your life in Bangkok have been like in 1890? Better, worse, about the same? What would your main concerns be? How would you amuse yourself?

The 1890s were a pivotal year for Bangkok. The reforming zeal of King Chulalongkorn was transforming the cityscape, the modes of governance, and the society. The capital was growing, railroads were reaching into the interior, the Thais were facing foreign aggression. Heady times as the kingdom approached a new century.


The Bangkok Times newspaper had a ringside seat on it all, reporting on the new developments here and abroad. What claimed readers' attention? Fires, lawsuits, foreign intrigue, crime, new inventions like electricity and X-rays and the odd—and often frightening—ways they were employed. All were keenly observed by the Times reporters who also cast a somewhat jaundiced eye at humbug, sprinkling its

pages with droll humor and a dose of been-there, seen that. All of it made for entertaining as well as informative reading.

In his enormously-successful Bangkok Then and Now (four updated editions and 32,000 copies sold to date), Mr. Van Beek looked at a dozen aspects of this fascinating city. Among the book's most popular items were the short news stories from the Times' pages. For his new book, News from the 90s, he returned to the library and read every issue printed in the 1890s, excerpting the local and international stories that captured reader interest.

He will talk with us about the challenges of life in the period which, in many aspects, was a mirror of our own. Illustrated with ads from the Times' pages, as well as photographs of the period.

He will also offer signed, discounted copies of this and others of his many books.

his month seeing I didn't have time to check out the wines at the monthly Friday night wines tasting, I decided to take a closer look at the club's wine list and try something different. Not being so familiar with European wines, I decided check out a red from Spain the **La Vendimia, Rioja.**

I must admit, it did have a youth freshness and its nose was reminiscent of sour cherries and ripe peaches, nutmeg, pepper and caramel. As the wine makers say, the noticeable tannins and its juiciness make it a lovable, slightly rustic wine, that knows how to please with its fruity, yet spicy flavour.

YOUTH, FRESHNESS, REFINEMENT

The newest vines and an age-old alliance with three other families that contribute their product combine to create this young red wine which reclaims an old tradition, the union of the different areas of Rioja; the Mediterranean and the Atlantic.

"Second-year wine" is a classic concept used to explain that if the young wine is good, the following year in the bottle it will be even better. This is what La Vendimia offers: a red very floral, lively and versatile; stimulating, profound and with a certain tannic strength.

Its personality comes from the Garnacha and Tempranillo varieties in equal parts give it that special scope, which is both flighty and well defined at the same time. Meanwhile, its brief stay in oak vats and casks assembles its body and adds complexity.

BRIEF HISTORY

In the 1980s, Alvaro Palacios was drawn to the largely abandoned, ancient vineyards of Priorat. Located 60 miles from Barcelona, Priorat had been one of Spain's important pre-Phylloxera wine regions. And with its unique terroir of steep hills and terraces, Alvaro believed he could make wines that rivaled the best of Europe.

He acquired his first vineyard, Finca Dofí, in 1990. Then, in 1993, he located what is now regarded as the crown jewel property in Priorat, a precipitous, northeast-facing Garnacha vineyard on well-drained schist that had been planted between 1900 and 1940. Alvaro named it L'Ermita for a small chapel, or hermitage, that sits atop the hill.

So now you know all about it, be sure to try a bottle or two next time you are at the club.
