MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIRMAN

ilom Wing Official Opening: Saturday 27th October was an historic day for the Club with H.E. Brian Davidson, the British Ambassador officially opening the Silom Wing at 11.00am. After

months of rain, the cool season finally arrived and a nice gathering of Members was present on a beautiful morning for the ribbon cutting. The brief ceremony including recognition and thanks to our contractors and after everyone had been given an opportunity to tour

the project, a few celebratory glasses of bubbly and some tasty nibbles were shared on the squash courts balcony.

A programme of kid's activities was rolled out during the afternoon and there was a festive atmosphere as everyone enjoyed the new facilities. The airconditioned 'family' room proved a great hit, the 'games room' was kept busy all afternoon and kids loved the new pool. The feedback was overwhelmingly positive.

Of course there had been a mad rush to try to get everything ready in time, leaving a long list of finishes and snags needing to be addressed. Work began on these immediately after the weekend and hopefully by the time you read this everything should be more or less complete.

A couple of major items that were not ready for the opening were the retractable awnings to provide shelter along the front of family room and toilets, and shade over the playground equipment. The awnings have now already been installed and a sail over the playground will be erected shortly.

Unfortunately there were problems with several children blistering their toes in the pool. This is a bit of a mystery since for the last 12 years this lining material has been widely used in high-end resorts without any problems being reported. It is slightly abrasive so as to be non-slip and whilst lots of children have been spending hours in the water jumping in and climbing out without problem, others have suffered blisters.

Re-polishing the surfaces resulted in some improvement and now we are adjusting chemical levels, which may be contributing to the problem. We apologise for any inconvenience. If necessary we will have to change the lining but we hope this can be avoided. Meanwhile we are advising children to wear socks and are providing these free of charge.

Phase 2: Many Members are asking when we are going to complete the Poolside Redevelopment by building Phase 2. As reported previously, the designs are currently being finalised and costed and the Finance Sub committee is preparing financial projections. We

plan to bring these to an EGM for Membership approval early next year and, if approved, work could start very quickly and be completed in about 12 months.



High Season: Since the Silom Wing opened, the poolside has been very busy and in fact all our outlets have been packed at times. The Neilson Hays Garden Cafe has also been very busy serving mainly business lunches during the week and family users at weekends. We are expecting a very good end to our financial year on 30th November and a bumper festive season through into the New Year.

Reportings

As word gets out that the Club has more and more to offer, Membership is breaking new all time highs. We are 40 to 50 Members up on this time last year and we hit 1,133 Members last month against a previous high of 1,126. These are early days but with a programme to go on improving our activities and facilities we can expect to see better and better results.

A major challenge of course is to provide adequate services to meet Members' expectations. We have been understaffed for a while and getting up to speed is an immediate management priority. We have an excellent new F&B Assistant Manager, Khun Ern, who joined us this month and an urgent plan is being put in place to secure more casual labour at the weekends when usage peaks.

- Back of house: There is a lot of work that goes on behind the scenes that Members are not always aware of. Management, with General Committee support, have been working on a number of initiatives that should start showing results in the months to come:
- Management software: Our Management software
 is very dated but finding affordable solutions
 appropriate for a club operation has proven
 illusive. We think we now have what we are looking
 for which will improve all aspects of our
 accounting, F&B and membership data base
 management
- New Entrance: The new entrance/ gatehouse will open in the next few weeks, for the first time enabling us to effectively control who enters the Club. With the new software in place we hope to be able to move quickly towards an automatic card entrance system.
- Staff Provident Fund: Concerns some Members had had about the security of staff retirement funds will shortly be put to rest with the establishment of an independent, registered and professionally managed Provident Fund. Hopefully this will be in place by 1st January, offering staff potential fund growth as well as very significant tax advantages.

New Menus: Our menus have not been changed for quite a while but new Food and Beverage Menus are about to be rolled out in all outlets. This always creates a bit of controversy but we hope that the new dishes and tipples will bring a welcome change and look forward to the feedback.

War Memorial: A moving Remembrance Day Service was held a the British Embassy on Sunday 11th
November, particularly poignant this year since it was both the 100th Anniversary of the end of World War One, and the last such service to be held at the Embassy before the Wireless Road property is vacated.

Some time in the next few months the War Memorial will be moved to its new home at the British Club and from next year it will be the Club's honour to host the Remembrance Day Service. This will be quite a responsibility, but I am sure the Club will be able to bring it the dignity and style demanded of the occasion.





Where to place your Trust?

On 29 October this year, the UK Government confirmed that they will publish a consultation on how to make the taxation of trusts simpler, fairer and more transparent.

The 2014 consultation proposals on Inheritance Tax (IHT) charges did not result in any significant changes so it will be interesting to see the outcome, and also what impact the Office of Tax Simplification report (mentioned in our 25 October BKK British Club presentation) may have.

It is worth mentioning that historically most legislative changes have not been retrospective, so it may be sensible to look into your UK Inheritance Tax planning sooner rather than later.

5 Tax advantaged trusts

Trusts have been a useful tax structure for sensible tax planning since the Crusades. Crusaders were exempt from paying tax but placed their property under a trustee's care in their absence with the King's protection in case the trustee didn't want to return the property later.

Today, whether you're among the wealthy who have used Trusts before, or are indeed a Crusader, trusts may be useful for you. Here we look at 5 tax advantaged trusts.

1. Discretionary trust

The discretionary trust is a flexible form of trust, with trustee discretion as to how, when, and for whose benefit some, or all of the capital & income of the trust can be used. Beneficiaries or a class of beneficiaries are named in the trust deed and it is up to the trustees to decide who is to benefit.

They are useful where the person setting up the trust (the settlor) has identified a group of people he wishes to benefit, for example children, but is not certain which of them will need financial help in the future or what help will be required.

The transfer of assets into a discretionary trust is a gift and

therefore potentially chargeable to UK IHT depending on whether the settlor has made other gifts and used his annual allowance of £3,000. Up to £325,000 (the current UK IHT nil rate band - 2018/2019), can be put into discretionary trust every 7 years without a tax charge.

Any sum above this will incur an

immediate IHT charge at 20%, and a possible further 20% if the settlor dies within 7 years.

Beneficiaries can offset their annual personal allowance of £11,850 against income and receive a refund of any tax paid by the trust. After 7 years the settlor can initiate this process again.

2. Loan trust

Here, an individual (you) loans assets to a bespoke trust with a beneficiary trust running alongside.

The Loan Trust offers an alternative to giving away capital - it allows access to capital but any growth won't increase your estate value. The trust is set up by appointing trustees, of which you can be one, and you then make an interest-free loan to them with the capital you wish to invest. The trustees invest the loan in a single premium investment bond, and any growth on the capital is held outside of your estate.

The Loan Trust will not normally create any immediate UK IHT charge although any outstanding loan remains part of your estate for IHT purposes.

You can call this (interest free) loan at any time, and will usually receive up to 5% a year in "income", with the loan tapering down over 20 years.

3. Discounted gift trust

This trust is only for cash or using an existing Investment Bond, and offers an immediate IHT saving as well as income.

You gift a lump sum to the trust and an actuarial calculation determines your immediate IHT discount (IHT-free even if you die immediately after set up providing the balance is less than your unutilised nil rate band IHT). Your beneficiaries receive IHT-free capital on your death, but until then you receive up to 5% p.a.

In summary the Discounted Gift Trust allows for an immediate IHT saving whilst retaining the right to receive regular "income" payments. Following death, the trust can continue or be wound up according to the trustee's wishes.

4. Excluded property trust

The Excluded Property Trust is for those who are currently not UK domiciled or treated as UK domiciled and who want to mitigate IHT when they later become UK domiciled. This could be you or your spouse. The trust fund will not be subject to IHT providing it holds 'excluded property'.

The trustees have full control over the investments and are able to make payments to any beneficiary, including you as the settlor, at any time.

The trust can also provide IHT protection for beneficiaries, even if domiciled. they are UK investments will not form part of their estates until distributed to them, so any funds that remain in the trust will not be liable for UK IHT.

5. Split trust

Split trusts or retained benefit trusts are part gift for the beneficiary and part capital return for you, the settlor. They share many features with the loan and discounted gift trusts and are often made through an investment

There are many trusts for different situations: asset protection, personal injury payments, disabled persons, bereaved minors, persons 18-25, and second marriages.

If you are looking for a bespoke trust get in touch, and unlike the Crusaders you won't have to go on a crusade to get the tax benefits.

Club Membership and Usage

fter cleaning up our databases, last year in December we were able to present for the first time a comprehensive summary of our Membership demographics and usage by different categories. It is our intention now to repeat this annually as a way of tracking changes and monitoring the impact of any new policies and facilities.

Member Megan Benger has again crunched the numbers for us and we can now compare the Membership profile at the end of June 2018 with one year earlier, and Club usage over the 12 month period July 2017 to June 2018 compared with the year before.

As one might expect, the year on year changes are mostly not very significant but with the Silom Wing targeting young families now open and Membership levels already hitting new highs since this analysis was undertaken, we can expect this data to be a valuable baseline in the years comes. Some highlights of this year's figures are as follows:

1. Membership Profile

Numbers: 1,117 (1,096 in 2017) Members were included in this analysis with 753 (725) registered spouses and 607 (568) children, a total of 2,477 (2,391) individuals with membership rights. These increases are the most encouraging trends identified in this analysis.

Gender: 86% of our Members are male but, including spouses and children, 55% are male, 45% female.


Nationality: 62% are from the four Core nationalities British (49%), Australian (8%), Canadian (4%) and New Zealand (1%), whilst the top four Associate nationalities are Thai (13%), Indian (7%) American (5%), and French (3%) with 46 other nationalities (up from 39 last year) making up the remaining 11%.

Membership Type: 56% of Members have voting rights. 10% are Annual Members

Years of Membership: The average length of Membership is 12.7 years. 27% joined in the last 3 years whilst 15% have been Members for at least 25 years.

Age: The average age of our members is slightly lower than last year at 55.9 years. The 607 children of Members are evenly distributed across the age groups averaging 11 years.






2. Club Usage


A lot of Members use the Club infrequently and during the 12-month period July 2017 to June 2018, the average Member visited the Club just 2.63 times a month and spent an average Baht 2,222/ month. The average spend per visit was baht 1,143.




Reportings



Spend by Nationality: Of the largest nationalities, the Americans (average Baht 2,528/month) and Indians (2,400) were the largest average spenders, somewhat higher than the British (2,376).




Highest spenders: It is of course the Members who spent most that made the biggest contributions to Club income. The top 100 Club users (9%) contributed 45% of total member spend; the top 300 (27%) contributed 78%.



Non-users: Members from all categories and all lengths of Membership only use the Club one day or less per month





The Club is in good shape but the potential to do better is again only too clear to see. We must go on trying to attract more younger members and encourage existing members to visit the Club more often. The Silom Wing, new activities and on-going further developments are aimed at doing this. Next year's will hopefully show progress being made.

LEST WE FORGET

THE GUNS FELL SILENT to end the War to end all Wars, at the eleventh hour, on the eleventh day of the eleventh month of 1918. It was thus fitting that its centenary was celebrated on the same time and date in 2018 ... lest anyone forget the sacrifices made that we can, mostly, live in peace in our world.

In 1922, the British Delegation to Siam purchased land at the edge of town in a road now called Wireless, to relocate their building from Chareon Krung Soi 32 and although the whole site was not fully occupied until 1926, the first edifice constructed was the British War Memorial, or Cenotaph, in 1923. Inscribed upon it are the names of 25 British men who lost their lives in that first conflict ... the youngest, Roger Upton, being only 19 and the oldest at 45 being The Honourable Robert Ambercromby Forbes-Sempill, who in 1903 was the first Honorary Secretary of the British Club. The Cenotaph was paid for by public subscription.

On 11th November 2018, hundreds of men and women paid their respects to the fallen of both World Wars and conflicts since. A multitude of wreaths were laid, including one from the Club, laid by our Chairman, Jack Dunford MBE. Afterward as part of the centenary celebration peals of bells were rung and at 1pm (6am GMT) the Club's Pipe & Drum Band played 'The Battle is over' as part of a world-wide celebration of the time the armistice was actually signed.

As most know, the Embassy is relocating next year to AIA Sathorn Tower, and the good news is that the Cenotaph is to be relocated to the Club ... its natural British home. You are invited to Remembrance Day 10th November 2019 ... lest we forget.

75th Anniversary of the completion of the Siam-Burma Railway

n 17th October at 6.00pm a private ceremony took place at the Commonwealth War Graves cemetery in Kanchanaburi to commemorate the 75th anniversary of the completion of the Siam-Burma Railway. The service was attended by HRH Prince Richard, Duke of Gloucester, Khun Sirikitya Jensen, HE The British Ambassador, HE The Australian Ambassador, The Governor of Kanchanaburi Province and the British Defence Attaché among others.

The Pipe Band was contacted by Mick Newblatt of the Commonwealth War Graves Commission (CWGC), who is responsible for the the maintenance of the two cemeteries in Kanchanaburi. Although Mick kindly offered to obtain approval from London to pay our expenses, we immediately agreed to absorb the costs ourselves, since we admire the work the CWGC does all over the world. In fact, an uncle of mine, who was

killed as a newly commissioned 23 year old 2nd lieutenant in the fierce battle of Leros, Greece, in 1943 lies in a beautifully kept CWGC grave there.

Although it was a week day the band was able to muster three players to play at the service, Pipe Major Keith Walker, Lead Drummer George Morgan and a brand new Thai piper Mr Nutt, who acquitted himself admirably at his first major public performance. The band marched in the Royal British Legion's colours playing Scotland the Brave and during the wreath laying ceremony we played an extended version of the traditional lament, Flowers of the Forest. Finally we closed the ceremony by marching off with Auld Lang Syne and The Rowan Tree with the sound trailing off into the darkness.
