

SWIMMING NOTES

International Meeting. The British Club Swimming Group achieved notable success in the Bangkok Aquatic Club's (BAC) Invitational Meet at Soi 71, on 30 and 31 March.

The meet was won by the Thai Amateur Swimming Association Team. Their 60 swimmers scored 867 points. The host team BAC entered 75 swimmers and finished second with 644 points. The British Club with only 45 swimmers came 3rd with $500\frac{1}{2}$ points.

More significant is the fact that British Club swimmers improved their times in 91 events out of a total of 131 in which they competed. This is the greatest number of improved times ever recorded by the club.

Two club swimmers - Vivienne Price (7 and 8 year olds) and Karen Davidson (13 and 14 year olds) won the high point trophy in their divisions. Karen was top scorer of the meet.
