NEWSLETTER FOR JULY 1974

LONG TERM PLANNING COMMITTEE

Alterations and adaptation of the existing facilities are becoming increasingly expensive (as indeed is routine maintenance) and the possibility of making any worthwhile changes in the lifetime of a single committee is becoming more and more remote. Consequently, the Committee feels that a long-term plan agreed by the members is a necessary step to the improvement of our facilities and the rational use of our finances.

A small working party has therefore been formed to consider possible improvements to the Club in the time scale mentioned. They will shortly present their views to members by means of a circular which will enable members to comment and also to put forward their own ideas. Depending on the reaction of members, professional advice on the feasibility on any new proposals may be taken and a further report presented to the members, hopefully, before September or October. Members will again have an opportunity to express their views at this stage and the Committee hopes that a general view on the future development of the Club will have emerged.

It is certainly the intention of the Committee, and this must be emphasized, to be guided by the wishes of the members in this matter. No development work will be put in hand without obtaining approval as laid down in our Constitution and Rules. In the meantime, the present committee will not introduced further new developments but will concentrate on routine maintenance.
