


#### **Handicaps**

The Golf Committee has now adopted completely the Handicaping Rules of the USPGA. The main effects of this are as follows:

- a. Handicap limit is now 36 and not 24 as was previously the case.
- b. The 3/4 and 7/8 differences in Stroke and Medal Play are eliminated and full handicap (or difference in Match Play) is allowed in all cases.

New handicaps for 24 players and above will be advised as soon as possible.
