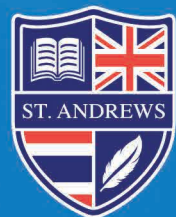

ACTS OF REMEMBRANCE

Sunday 13th November 2022 - Bangkok

The annual Remembrance Day Service organised by the British Embassy in Bangkok will be held at The British Club commencing at 1050hrs on Sunday 13th November. The event will not only commemorate British, Commonwealth, and allied personnel, but all those who have been affected in all conflicts. It serves as a reminder that nations who fought so bitterly against each other can come together to promote peace and stability in the modern world.

Wreaths will be laid at the War Memorial by Ambassadors or their representatives, by War Veterans' organisations and by representatives from associations and societies in Bangkok. Those attending the service are asked to gather from 1020hrs.

We would be grateful if you would reply either via this [link](#), through the QR code provided or via the email remembrance.bangkok@fco.gov.uk no later than 1 Nov 22 if you would like to attend. If you wish to lay a wreath, they are available from the British Embassy for a donation of 1500 THB each. Please indicate on your response form if you require one. All funds raised will go to the Royal British Legion Poppy Appeal. There will be an opportunity for personal wreaths to be laid following the service.

If you are unable to attend in person, you may wish to consider sending a representative. We are able to offer 4 official seats per party, and others who are interested to attend are most welcome to do so. We would ask that they e-mail separately and attend in a private capacity.

Parking is very limited and will only be available for pre-registered VIPs. **VIP Address** The British Club Bangkok, 189 Suriwongse Road, Bangrak. **Public Address** The British Club Bangkok, Silom Road Soi 18, Bangrak. Travel by public transport is recommended for all other guests.

Following the service, light refreshments will be served on the back lawn.

Suriwongse Room

The Suriwongse Room has been in need of refurbishment for some time, but with funding set aside for the poolside redevelopment and the need to repay Member loans the amount of funds for other capital expenditures has been limited, and other projects such as the Veranda took precedence. I am delighted that this year we have been able to replace the air conditioning in the Suriwongse room. Five new units suspended from the ceiling replace the three floor standing units, providing more btu's and increasing the floorspace for functions. Some redecoration has also been done, but there are plans to further improve the decoration in the new year, after the busy season for usage of this room.

Proxies

Rarely does an AGM or EGM go by without some members complaining about the impact of proxies. This year's AGM asked the new General Committee to look at the issues again.

A proxy is where one member, who cannot or does not want to attend a General Meeting but who wants to exercise their vote (the proxy donor), can give a proxy to another Member who is attending the meeting (the proxy holder) to vote on behalf of the donor. Many members appreciate the proxy facility, which is allowed by the Thai Civil and Commercial Code. Attempts to remove proxies have always failed by substantial majorities.

The ire of Members regarding proxies more likely relates to the way that third parties have organised the collection and distribution of blank proxy forms with the result that the proxy donor does not know who is holding their proxy, which is inconsistent with Article 22 (a) which requires the proxy donor to "appoint" the proxy holder.

An Extraordinary General Meeting is to be held on 15th November, where Members will be asked to add some wording to the Article to clarify that the donor is required to enter the holders name on the proxy form and lodge the proxy form at the Club in person or by email prior to the meeting.

Of course, another way to solve the issue is to have electronic General meetings, and electronic voting, but we are not ready for that yet!

My overseas holiday

My wife and I took refuge from all the rain for our first overseas trip in two and a half years at the end of September, visiting Perth, Western Australia. We did one day tours to the Pinnacles and Rottnest Island, and a three-day tour to Margaret River, as well as finding our own way around Perth and Freemantle shops, markets, eateries and drinkeries.

The hospitality industry there seems to have a similar problem to Thailand, a lack of staff.

The solution in many cafes and some restaurants is to make you queue at a counter to place your order and pay for it, then give you a vibrating buzzer that goes off when your order is ready for collection. I couldn't help but imagine what the Members reaction would be if the British Club introduced a similar system at the Sala or Sails!

Sadly, I don't have any photos of these queues, but here are a couple of the locals. The one on the right is a Quokka, only found in Western Australia. They are actually much smaller than kangaroos.

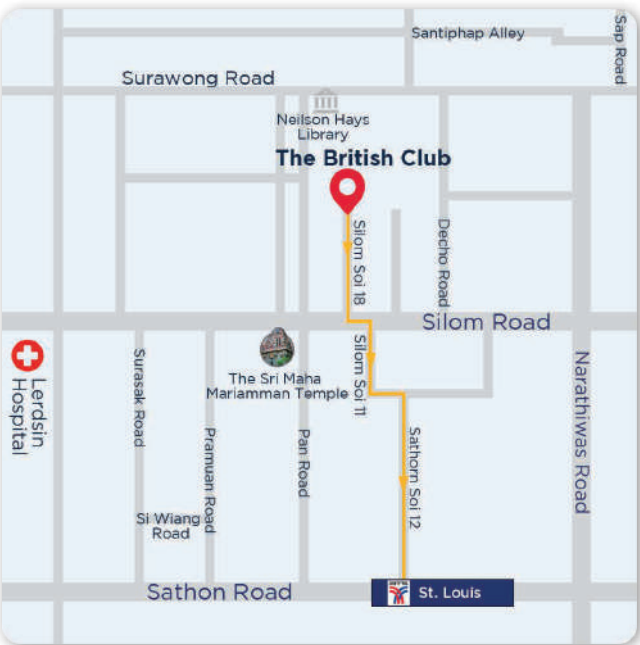


Peter Corney

The UK “mini budget”

On 23 September the new UK Chancellor, Kwasi Kwarteng, delivered a ‘mini-budget’ to deliver Liz Truss’s much hyped return to traditional Tory tax-cutting policies. There was, however, nothing ‘mini’ about the announcements; the tax ‘giveaways’ are the biggest seen in 50 years.

There was a great deal of expectation ahead of Kwasi Kwarteng’s first budget statement, so what did the new Chancellor announce?

NATIONAL INSURANCE

As previously announced, the uplift of 1.25% in National Insurance contributions – which applied from 6 April 2022 – has now been cancelled from 6 November 2022 and the replacement ‘Health and Social Care Levy’ won’t go ahead. The government has stated that funding for health and social care spending won’t be affected by the planned tax cuts.

TAX

In a genuinely surprising move the planned aim to reduce the basic rate of Income Tax has been brought forward, and from 6 April 2023, it will be reduced from 20% to 19%. In addition, and somewhat controversially, the Chancellor also reduced tax for the wealthiest in society, abolishing the 45% additional rate of tax from 6 April 2023, with a 40% rate tax applying to anyone earning more than £150,000. This change reverses the additional rate first introduced in April 2010. In a subsequent U-turn, the abolition of the 45% rate of Income Tax was later reversed.

Other changes scheduled for next April have also been scrapped. The planned, and rather hefty, increase in Corporation Tax from 19% to 25% has also been rolled back. Other abandoned changes include the planned increase in the rate of Diverted Profits Tax from 25% to 31% and the expected reduction in the Corporate Tax surcharge rate for banking companies. In addition, the rates of dividend taxation will be reduced by 1.25% to their previous levels of 7.5%, 32.5% and 38.1%.

Reforms of the ‘Off-Payroll Working’ rules will be reversed. From 6 April 2023, UK workers in the public and private sectors who provide their services via an intermediary such as a personal service company will once again be responsible for determining their employment status and paying the correct amount of tax and NI contributions.

SUPPORTING INVESTMENT

In a welcome move we now have confirmation that the Annual Investment Allowance will be set at £1 million permanently. This is a tax relief for businesses for the purchase of business equipment and had previously been temporarily raised from £200,000 to £1 million.

There will also be new investments zones set up around the UK with enhanced tax reliefs for Stamp Duty Land Tax, Capital Allowances (to help businesses make capital investments), Structures and Buildings Allowance and reliefs for employers’ NI contributions. The limits for investing in the Seed Enterprise Investment Scheme, which provides tax reliefs for investing in small start-ups will be doubled to £200,000 from 6 April 2023 and it will also be available for investors to claim tax reliefs for Income Tax and Capital Gains Tax.

From 6 April 2023 the share option limit for the Company Share Option plan (CSOP) scheme has been doubled from £30,000 to £60,000 and there will be fewer restrictions on the types of shares that can qualify for the scheme.

PROPERTY

An immediate reduction in Stamp Duty Land Tax (SDLT) was announced, including doubling the nil-rate threshold from £125,000 to £250,000, increasing the level at which first-time buyers start paying SDLT from £300,000 to £425,000 and allowing first-time buyers to access this relief on property purchases up to £625,000. It’s clear the government wants to ensure that the UK property market remains buoyant.

OTHER ANNOUNCEMENTS

- Planned increases in Alcohol Duty Rates, scheduled from 1 February 2023 have been scrapped with a previously announced new Alcohol Duty System being introduced in August 2023.
- A new digital VAT-free shopping scheme for non-UK visitors will be introduced as soon as possible.

The result of this ‘mini-budget’ is a package of tax giveaways that are going to cost around £45billion. This is in addition to previous spending promises aimed at protecting households and businesses from higher energy bills. Liz Truss’s new government is going to be spending more than they had originally planned. Former Tory Prime Minister, Theresa May, famously once stated that “there is no magic money tree” and it’s clear that the government will be borrowing a great deal more money than anticipated. And with rising interest rates the cost of borrowing money is going up as well. It remains to be seen whether these cuts are enough to prop up the UK over the long-term, early signs in the currency markets suggest a lack of confidence that these moves are the right ones.

UK INHERITANCE TAX

In the last five years, prompted by the Financial Secretary to HM Treasury, Phillip Hammond, the Office of Tax Simplification (OTS were an independent arm of the Treasury) carried out two reports in recent years on the UK’s IHT system, because they feel it may be too complex and outdated.

It came as a surprise then to the tax profession that as part of this “mini-budget” Kwarteng disbanded the (OTS), choosing instead to delegate this responsibility to the Treasury and HMRC when the next Finance Bill receives Royal Assent. The OTS’ final acts will be the publication of a report on the taxation of property income in October and the gathering of evidence on its hybrid and distance working review.

There was little or no mention of UK IHT in this ‘mini-budget’ and whether the two things are connected is difficult to say. Undoubtedly this will come back on the radar in future budgets as the government’s UK IHT tax take becomes larger with increasing asset prices and in particular property.

As always, seeking the appropriate advice remains an important factor in order to meet individual requirements and expectations.

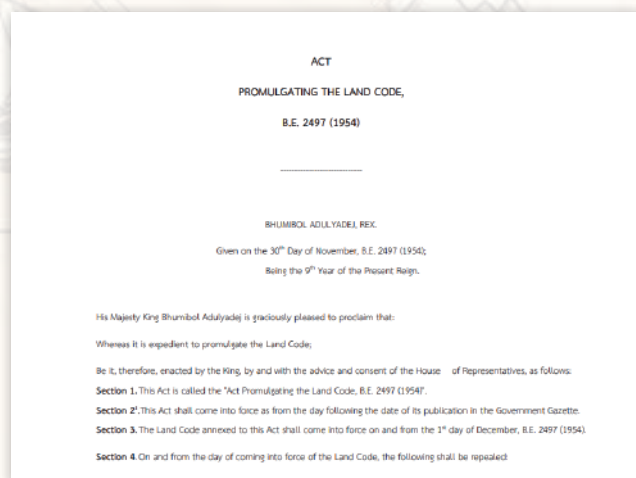
We continue the story of the British Club Bangkok ... 1954

The Land Act

The Act Promulgating The Land Code received its Royal Assent on 9th November and replaced the Consolidated Land Act of R. S. 127 (1908). This Act essentially forbade aliens, that is non-Thai nationals, from owning land. At the time, it also prohibited Thais who were married to an alien, or who had an alien as their natural parent, from owning land. The latter restrictions were changed after the 2007 Thai Constitution was enacted.

As the Club was a registered Association under the Civil & Commercial Code, and our General Committees individually registered with the Special Security Police, it was allowed to continue its ownership of the Club's land. The deeds, called Chanotes, were still mortgaged to the Hong Kong & Shanghai Banking Corporation in 1954 (see *Past Participle December 1921*) and remained with them until 1965.

Interestingly, the Consolidated Land Act of R. S. 127 had been translated to English in 1912 by British Club member Richard Craig, who later became Club Chairman (see *Richard Dudley Craig ... the story* on the Club website under About Us – History – Club Official Documents & Photographs)

Loss of a Member

British Overseas Airways Corporation (BOAC) flight 781, a de Havilland Comet 1 encoded G-ALYP, on the last leg of its journey from Singapore to London, took off from Rome Ciampino Airport but suffered a mid-air explosion, later found to be caused by structural failure, and crashed into the sea off Elba Island in the Tyrrhenian Sea, off the coast of Italy.

One of the 35 dead was Mr. J.P. Hill, a Club Member, who worked for BOAC in Bangkok and was travelling home on leave following a trip to Singapore.



▲ de Havilland Comet 1 G-ALYP

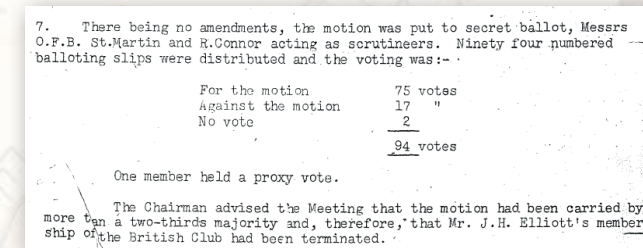
Order Matters

Probably the most dramatic event in the Club during the whole year was on Tuesday 9th March, in the evening. A member, Mr. Joe H. Elliott, and his guest, who turned out to be his brother, got exceedingly intoxicated whilst playing Billiards in the Billiards Room [now the location of the Churchill Bar]. They were making a lot of noise by banging their cues on the wooden floor, then threatened the Butler, and finally assaulted three General Committee members who had come down from the Bridge Room, to find out what was going on! [The Bridge Room was where the Silom Room and the General Offices are now.]

The member was called in front of the General Committee to give an account of his behaviour but failed to turn up. Upon his second failure to appear an Extraordinary General Meeting was called, to which 94 mem-

bers turned up and the said member was expelled by 75 votes to 17 with two abstentions. Good order was restored.

The 'expulsion' clause was only ever used once since in the Club's post-WWII history (so far) ... in 2019 ... but that is another story!

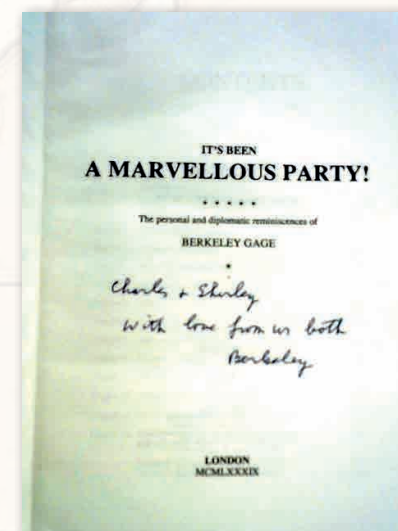


▲ Expulsion

Honorary Members

In a change of policy, instead of asking the British Ambassador to join the club as an Ordinary Member, it was agreed to bestow an Honorary Membership upon each British Ambassador to Thailand. Thus on 18th March, Berkeley Everard Foley Gage CMG became the first incumbent to take up the honour. Sir Bernard (as he became in 1955) was a career diplomat educated in Eton and Trinity College, Cambridge, and Thailand was his first posting as Ambassador. He served for over three years before moving to Peru. His nickname was "Through a Glass Berkeley" which is very well detailed in his autobiography 'It's Been A Marvellous Party', published in 1989. He died in 1994.

In addition, on the same day, in order to avert a dilemma, whereby the Chairman of the Shell Company of Thailand, would suddenly not be a Club Member, as the new incumbent, Mr. J.W. Beveridge, was a citizen of Eire. It was agreed to "award" him an Honorary Membership but request he still paid the joining fee and subscriptions!

Service

1954 was yet another turbulent year on the General Committee – whilst Charles Mabbatt was elected Chairman yet again (see *Past Participle, April 2022*) and chose no vice-chairman again. He went Absent in the May, and was replaced by Peter Kirrage (see *Past Participle, June 2022*).

William Brownsey remained as Honorary Secretary and whilst Mr. B.A. Kilpatrick was elected as Honorary Treasurer again, he went Absent in July and was replaced by a directly co-opted Honorary Treasurer in the form of Mr. R.E. Bentley of the Anglo-Thai Corporation. Mr. Bentley went on to serve five more terms as a committee member.

Mr. B. Beaumont, of the Hong Kong & Shanghai Banking Corporation served this term only as did Mr. B.S. Kent from the British Embassy. The 1954 new line-up was completed by Mr. E.A.G. Wheeler, of Henry Waugh & Co., who served this and the next term.

Club News

The Club's accounts give an interesting reflection on our operation in this era:

- Club activities (Billiards, Bridge, Bowls, Cinema, Dances, Stag Nights, and Tennis) brought in 79,507 Ticals but lost 3,139 Ticals
- 'The Bar' had drinks sales of 363,530 Ticals with a surplus of 85,509 Ticals and 'snacks' took 37,449 Ticals with a surplus of 1,172 Ticals.
- Total Club income, with F&B reported net of cost and tax, for the year 1953-54 was 230,145 Ticals, half of which was subscriptions, with a surplus of 18,890 Ticals.

There was also concern that, once again, some non-members were coming in as guests far too frequently so, an Extraordinary General Meeting was called on 25th February:

- Guests, who were themselves eligible for membership, were now permitted to use the club only twice a year.
- The definition of Country Membership was changed from "outside Bangkok" to a distance of 20 miles (32 km) from the Club to reflect the confusion over "Bangkok" and its boundaries – Thonburi, the east bank of the Chao Phraya River, was, in 1954, actually "outside Bangkok"! Also quoted was "the ease of travel now enjoyed by Bangkokians".

The AGM reported that we had 235 Members, of whom nine were up-country Members plus 31 ladies who enjoyed 'Ladies Privileges' in the Club.

The increase in membership over the past year had increased the staff workload, so No.1 Boy ('head waiter') was promoted to Assistant Butler in April, on a salary of 800 Ticals per month.

The chairman, Charles Mabbatt, donated a cup for the inaugural annual Ladies Singles tennis competition. The Ladies Doubles tennis competition was also started at this time, and the Cup awarded gained the name 'The Bobbee Cup' by 1957.

1954 ended off with the staff being given new 'uniforms' to wear. All serving staff received long sleeve, white shirts with long white trousers, whilst all non-serving staff had Khaki shirts with Khaki shorts. This did not apply to the Assistant Permanent Manager or the Butler who both had suits and presumably not to the Butler's wife!

Line 2 delete "two"
Lines 7 and 8 delete from "No guests" to "month" inclusive and insert "No persons who are eligible to become Ordinary or Country Members of the Club or who belong to the family of anyone eligible to become an Ordinary or Country Member of the Club, shall be introduced as guests more than twice (S.G.M 14/10/47 and S.G.M 14/6/48 but that Rule ended with the words "in any one calendar month" which is now deleted, EGM 21/8/51 passed the additional words "but not more than six times in any one calendar year" and these words are also deleted.)
Then continue with line 8 from "Members" as printed.

In Other News

Brigadier John Radford OBE became the British Military Attaché in Bangkok and joined the Club on 16th January. He had received his OBE in January 1952 when serving with The North Staffordshire Regiment (The Prince of Wales's).

Group Captain D.J. Devitt became the British Air Attaché in Bangkok and joined the Club on 6th June; and Commander J.S. Kerans RN became Naval Attaché

and joined the Club on 31st July.

On 6th September 'Channel 4 Bang Khum Phron' commenced test operation as Thailand's first television station, operated by the Thai Television Company. It started its full service less than a year later. In 1974 it was moved to 'Channel 9'; in 2002 it was rebranded as 'Modernine TV' before becoming 'MCOT HD30' in 2015.

On 8th September Thailand signed the Southeast Asia Collective Defence Treaty, or Manila Pact, and thus became a founding member of the Southeast Asian Treaty Organization (SEATO). The UK, Australia and the USA were also founding members,

Wellington Club, Wellington, New Zealand

Visited in November 2019

Paul Doust and Prasit Jangkamol (a.k.a. Jack)



The Wellington Club is New Zealand's oldest private members' club, and we had a chance to visit it just before Covid struck. After that, for a long time Covid restrictions made New Zealand inaccessible, but as of 12th September New Zealand has had no vaccination or testing requirements for incoming travellers.

Since the Wellington Club was founded in 1841, the club has occupied the same plot of land which is now in the central business district of



Wellington. These days it occupies the top 3 floors of a 7-story building which it owns, and it makes money by renting out the lower floors. Membership of the club is by invitation only, with members drawn from the upper echelons of Wellington society including politicians, judges, and senior civil servants.

The present clubhouse was opened in 1990 by HRH The Duke of Edinburgh, and has a very smart and modern appearance. Both men and women can join the club, and when we visited, the club had around 1400 members. In addition to a bar and restaurant, there's a gym on the top floor, a squash court, a billiards room, a reading room, a business centre, some function rooms, and accommodation is also available. The club is closed at weekends, except for the accommodation and the fitness centre. Because the catering facilities are closed at weekends, the club provides a list of local restaurants for anyone staying in the accommodation. Most of the time the dress code is business casual, but on the 5th floor men have to wear a jacket and tie after 6:30pm.

The club hosts a lot of events. While I was there, I attended an interesting talk by Len Cook CBE who had been a permanent secretary in both the UK and New Zealand civil services, and after the talk I got chatting to some of the club's members. They told me that bridge is a popular card game in the club, so I told them that if one has a bridge partner, it's possible to play bridge every day of the week in Bangkok. In any case, all the members and staff who we met made us feel welcome, so the club is well worth a visit for any British Club Bangkok members visiting Wellington.

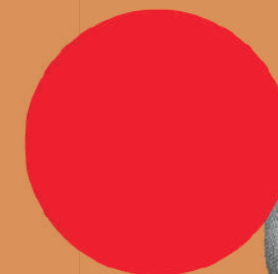
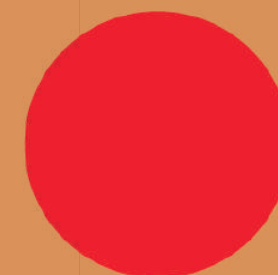

Obituary
Peter Corney

23rd August 1947 – 26th September 2022

Peter Robert Corney was born on the 23rd August 1947 in Hobart, Australia, the second eldest of 5 boys. Peter joined the Royal Australian Navy at the age of 19 where he embarked on a career that would see him promoted to the rank of Lieutenant Commander and Captain three patrol boats. During his time in the Navy Peter graduated from the University of New South Wales and developed his keen interest in sports including Running, Hockey and Squash. It was Squash that would become his passion and he continued to play into his later life. The Navy allowed Peter to travel the world and he spent time in both the USA and UK. It was perhaps in the UK where Peter started to fully appreciate his joy at Australian Cricket or Rugby teams beating the English and he continued to show passionate but good natured support of Australia in all sports against all opposition.

Peter came to Thailand in 1990 to work for ACA Pacific and joined the British Club in January 1991. He quickly became a key member of the squash section as Captain and then as Chairman. During his time as Chairman he was the driving force behind the organization of both internal and external tournaments and competitions, devoting hours of his time in the process. Peter was an active club member and served on the General Committee three times in 1999, 2005 and 2013.

Peter was a very kind and generous individual. He could regularly be seen feeding and looking after the British Club cats and was involved in many good causes in Thailand including his active support of a local orphanage and sponsorship of a number of university places.

Peter returned to Australia in 2020 due to health issues and took up residence in Fairfield in the Western suburbs of Sydney. He began volunteer work and spent three days a week working in support of Vietnam War veterans. He had a good network of close friends, both old and new, that he socialized with regularly.

Peter passed away on the 26th September 2022 after complications with surgery. He leaves behind his partner Khun Nirun (Run) and many close friends from the British Club.

The following message was read at the funeral service held for Peter a couple of week ago and goes some way to express the fondness with which he will be remembered by his friends at the Club:

Peter you were our Captain, our Chairman, a fellow squash player and our dearest friend. Your energy, enthusiasm and the interest you took in people were recognised and appreciated by everyone from the squash beginner to the best players and spread outside of the British Club to the wider squash community in Thailand. Always looking for things to laugh about your sense of humor and playfulness never grew old. Although your body eventually told you it was time to slow down and eventually give the game up you kept supporting and advising squash players, receiving thanks and respect as a result. You have left us with a lot of fond memories, both on the court and off. We will miss you Peter, you were one of the good guys.
