

Almost 400 members and guests attended this party on the back lawn, with kids' activities, international buffet, live music, and burning of the Guy. Some frantic by tradition are drunk sitting down, to avoid hitting our running around with extra tables, chairs and food ensued, but generally the value of Keep Calm, Enjoy Yourself, prevailed, with the party concluding with spectacular pyrotechnic 'fireworks.'



Remembrance Day

Sunday 13th November 2022 was the fourth time that the Remembrance Day service has been held at the Club, since the War memorial was re-located from the grounds of the old British Embassy in Wireless Road. The service was conducted by the vicar of Christ Church, with music from Shrewsbury school choir and the British Club Pipe Band. Wreaths were laid by senior diplomats from many embassies plus representatives of the Royal Thai military, the Royal British Legion Thailand, international schools, loyal societies, and other community organisations, and of course the Club itself.

The War Memorial lists those who lost their lives during the First World War, but the remembrance service includes all those who have died in other conflicts since, including the current conflict in Ukraine. After the service, all attendees were invited by the British Embassy to the back lawn for light refreshments.

With the security measures necessary and the quietness required for the service, normal entry to and use of the Club had to be restricted during the morning. A thank you to the Members for their adherence and understanding.



Golf Section Dunlop Cup

It was great to catch up with the British Club Golf Section at Soi Dao Highlands Golf course for the annual Dunlop Cup competition on 29th and 30th of October. Soi Dao is some 300Kms or four hours plus drive, close to the Cambodian border about 40Kms north of Chanthaburi.

The course is a fantastic design and in very good condition, with each hole providing a different challenge. The on-site accommodation and catering are run by Chatrium, who served an impromptu Saturday night dinner under the stars.

Yurachatr and I were on holiday in UK over ten years ago and played at Bakewell Golf Club in Derbyshire. At the end of the round, we asked to go into the Bar for a drink, and the lady who answered the door said sorry the steward was at a funeral, but noticing a small Thai flag on my golf shirt asked if we were from Thailand. If you're thinking about a UK return, it's crucial to plan ahead and understand the key issues which may affect you. This will help reduce the chance of a significant, and perhaps unnecessary, tax bill.

Because of the UK's complex tax system, it's important to give yourself plenty of time; ideally 6-12 months before beginning the process.

Unfortunately the luxury of time may not be an option. Nevertheless it's important to understand the consequences of your return to ensure it is the right decision for your personal circumstances now and in the future.

WHEN TO RETURN

Although there's no perfect time, an understanding of the UK resident system is a good place to start. This will allow you to be aware of when you're likely to become a UK tax resident it's sometimes not as straightforward as it may seem!

If you return in the middle of the tax year and have been receiving overseas income, obtaining UK split-tax year treatment will be important. This allows you to split the tax year in two - one part applying to when you're UK resident, and one when you're not.

DO I NEED TO TELL HMRC WHEN I RETURN?

Telling HMRC that you're returning to the UK is very important. It can be done personally, or by your tax adviser. It's always a good idea to seek tax advice before your return. and this could be part of an overall package of a pre and post UK Tax Advice service.

CONSIDERATIONS FOR A UK RETURN

There are lots of things to consider, but the key points to focus on are:

- Seek UK Tax Advice and use a professional qualified UK
- Check your UK banking arrangements if you don't have a UK bank account speak to your previous UK bank
- Understand foreign pension provision can it be withdrawn before your return?
- Review currency exchange rates if transferring significant amounts research the most efficient way of doing so
- Review investment funds they could be taxed differently
- Find a home give tenants the correct notice if you have a UK property or do your research if moving to a new home
- Plan healthcare needs NHS hospital treatment is free for those resident in the UK and applies immediately if you're returning permanently
- Research schools explore the options and be aware that children must be physically present in the UK to enroll
- Check your insurance consider your general (motor, home), and personal (private medical insurance, life assurance and critical illness) cover; personal insurance is normally cheaper in the UK
- Make sure your UK driving licence is still valid this is especially important if you've been absent from the UK for a long period

Returning to the UK is a big step so do plan ahead both personally and financially. Over the years we've helped many people relocate to the UK, so please get in touch to discuss your plans.

The lowest ever recorded temperature in Bangkok was 9.9°C (49.8 °F) on 12th January 1955. Five days beforehand, on the 7th, it was 'claimed' that it "snowed in Chiang Rai" – the only snow recorded in Thailand ever!

Bangkok's first Public Lending Library was built in 1955, in Lumpini Park. The Lumpini Public Library was fully opened on 24th June the following year. In 2018, it was restyled 'Lumpini Park Learning Library'.


On 1st May, Christ Church in Convent Road, celebrated its building's Golden Jubilee celebrations with The Rt. Rev. Henry Wolf Baines, the Bishop of Singapore, in attendance for ten days of celebration. Christ Church's Curate, Revd. Walter Henry Fowke, was replaced in the October by Revd. John Logan Gilmour. Nine years later, Mr. Fowke would write the book "A Century of Worship, 1864-1964" for the Mission's centenary.

Commander J. E. E. D. Haward RN became a short term Naval Attaché, joining the Club on 8th August, replacing Commander J.S. Kerans RN, and leaving on 31st December; thence Commander Bruce John Bevis Andrew DSC RN became Naval Attaché and joined the Club on 13th December.

The Gran Teatre del Liceu in Barcelona is the city's opera house, and the Círculo Del Liceo is a private member's club in the same building. Founded in 1847, it's the oldest private member's club in Spain that's retained its original location. The club's long history has enabled it to accumulate a unique of collection of art, the most notable of which is a set of 12 oils paintings by the Catalan artist Ramon Casas which are displayed in a special room on the 1st floor. Many of the club's rooms are decorated in an art nouveau style, and all the rooms on the ground and 1st floors feel very elegant. As one might expect in this kind of setting, the dress code is formal, with jacket and tie required for men. However, apart from a billiards room, there's no gym or sports facilities, and no accommodation either.

The club is open for lunch and dinner Monday to Friday, but it's closed at weekends unless there is an opera in the Gran Teatre del Liceu, in which case the club opens before the opera and closes afterwards. Originally the club was men only, but these days women are allowed to join too. The club has around 1700 members, and all



members' names are displayed in lists on the wall in the hall on the 1st floor. There's a bar on a mezzanine level between the entrance level and the 1st floor, and at the front of the building on the 1st floor there's a dining room. On the higher floors there's a library, a room for playing cards and a small auditorium with a TV.


We were in Barcelona last July, so one weekday evening we booked dinner at this club. On arrival, we found our way into the club via the right-hand side door at the front of the opera house, and then by ringing a doorbell a few steps up the staircase. Although the concierge didn't speak any English, he was expecting us and made us feel welcome. Apart from staff, there was no one else on the ground floor, in the bar at mezzanine level, or in the rooms on the 1st floor. However, the staff were preparing for a small drinks event in one of the 1st floor rooms, and we did see some of the club's members watching an opera on the TV in the small auditorium on one of the higher floors.

With the summer weather, our dinner was served on the roof terrace instead of the dining room. Although the dress code for men is jacket and tie, there was just one other table dining on the terrace with us, and several of the men on that table were not wearing ties. On seeing this Jack took his tie off too, and because it was warm we asked the waiter if we could take off our jackets too. The waiter said that we could, but about half an hour later, a more senior waiter asked us to put our jackets back on! Luckily it was cooler by then. In spite of dress code confusion, we had a lovely evening. As expected, the wine list was almost 100% Spanish, but unlike some of the other private member's clubs in Spain, I was happy to see that vintages were specified for the more expensive wines. Recommended for any British Club members visiting Barcelona, especially for members who love art and opera.

Thanks to David Quine for giving me one of his balut mats to use as a mouse mat. I can't write these reviews every month without the right equipment!

Summary of Results Tennis Survey

Many thanks to all who completed the survey including 67% male and 33% female respondents. Their length of time at the club varied widely, thus providing a cross-section of opinions. Members were generally very supportive of the court quality and the suitability of the tennis balls but suggested improvements could be made to the maintenance and floodlights. Mix-ins were praised but some felt that the committee should look to make adjustments to their organisation. The vast majority of members agreed that there were plenty of opportunities to play tournaments and competitive tennis. Interestingly, members wanted more tennis socials to be organised as they reported that they much enjoyed the social events that they attended.

There was some interest in providing kids fun tennis activities, family tennis events and even some support for developing a Junior Tennis section. A number of members were keen to develop Senior tennis leagues, events or matches with one member challenging the bizarre 'over 40s' definition of seniors, when they were actively playing at 76! Members were generally happy with the communication from the Tennis section, welcoming emails and Facebook updates but some felt that a Line group would much improve communication.



Common positive themes reported included: the club being welcoming and friendly, the quality of the courts, mix-in, good players and coaches, tournaments and events, meeting friends and even 'drinking' being mentioned. The committee also welcomed suggestions for improvements such as maintenance, a doubles league, a ladies league, modified mix-in times, more opportunities to play with upper level players, healthy snack availability and more social events.

Finally, and of great interest to the British Club hierarchy, on a scale of 1 to 10, 97% of respondents said that they would highly recommend the club to others and 83% stated that they were highly satisfied with the club and its provision, rating it between 8 and 10. *Thank you to all members who took part in the survey.*






