

In what can be a confusing (sometimes treacherous) landscape, this article outlines some of the options for British expats looking for non-cash investment.

There are several options and the main ones are:

STOCKBROKING ACCOUNT

Stockbroking is typically offered by well-established companies advertising their services in print and online. Most countries have options although there are some major global providers who will allow accounts to be opened without some of the frequent country-specific problems.

This option is a cost-efficient approach to investment, usually allowing access to any listed investment instruments on the main exchanges worldwide. The standard service provides accounts on an execution-only basis, so no advice is offered, and you can only have access to an account with which to purchase investments.

GENERAL INVESTMENT ACCOUNT

A general investment account offers access to investment funds, and some direct securities (this is company-specific). Typically, this is a common method of individual investing in the UK.

Some international providers allow accounts to be established by Thailand residents (on a case-by-case basis). A limited number of UK account providers will allow this. It's a competitive marketplace currently so these accounts are generally cost-efficient with the standard annual product charge typically less than 0.25% per annum.

As they are mostly used by advisory companies, general investment accounts aren't frequently employed for execution-only investments.

OFFSHORE LIFE ASSURANCE INVESTMENT BOND

This method is used regularly by 'offshore' advisers normally allowing investment in the main currencies and listed investments through most dealing exchanges. For non-UK residents the more complicated taxation structure isn't applicable. However, for UK residents they are a tax deferral vehicle, but may have a tax liability after a certain period of time of withdrawing value, or at specific events.

Whilst this approach can offer flexibility, the range of charges can be prohibitive, with significant surrender penalties if you choose to close early.

They can be useful for Estate planning as a few providers have their own trust companies providing off-the-shelf arrangements with little or no cost. As corporate trustees there's also a higher likelihood they'll remain in place for the life of the arrangement.

DISCRETIONARY PORTFOLIO MANAGEMENT

Historically these options are used by institutional investors, high net worth individuals or charities. Whilst most larger global asset management companies still have high minimum investment levels (\$1 million typically) there are some that offer lower levels, from \$500,000.

Discretionary management means the portfolio is controlled without consulting you on investment decisions, with changes based on factors agreed with you at the outset. They're usually cost-efficient and available in most of the main currencies, although some have country-specific criteria.

Choosing the right investment approach is important in what can be a confusing landscape. Seeking professional advice is vital to help ensure that you make the right choice for your personal circumstances

Letter From Tim Vongswang – The General Manager



THE GM's SPOT

Interesting times are ahead for our little community as the Narai Group begins construction on a new building complex next to our club. At the time of writing this message we currently do not have all the details of Narai's plans however the following information is what we currently know and will keep all our members posted as and when we find out more.

The development which still reauires permission from the aovernment's 'Planning Department', will consist of two buildings, each having their unique features and facilities. The first building is a grand 26 floor structure boasting five floors of basement carparks which can accommodate up to 310 cars, 250 hotel rooms, restaurants, shops, offices, and banquet rooms. The second building in the complex also consists of 26 floors with four floors of basements parking for up to 207 cars, 150 hotel rooms, restaurants, shops and offices. The project is estimated to take 48 months to complete.

Naturally, with such an ambitious building project, there comes concerns about the impact it may have on our club. Fortunately, the Narai Group, is receptive to the local community's concerns and have scheduled a meeting in June to discuss the Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA). Although the club's management are working with the Meindhart engineering company as consultants we do have other comments we wish to raise with the Narai group at the community meeting. Some of the questions regarding the construction's alternate plans we will be asking are ; soil subsidence, noise, vibrations, air pollution, guarantee's that they will follow the EIA rules, plans for workers living areas, contraction schedules, plans on delivering building materials (and workers), flooding, sun reflection from the glass facade and if any dangerous materials such as Asbestos will be used.

In the mean time if the aforementioned information is causing any stress, please note that we have just completed a mini facelift to our performance studio situated on the second floor of the Silom wing where we are offering weekly group exercise classes including, Aero boxing and yoga. If this isn't enough please do visit our fantastic Personal Trainer Noah who you can find in our gym.

We continue the story of the British Club Bangkok ... **1962**

On the Rise!

Membership continued to rise, with the reported 1962 year-end figure being 302 and this spurt of growth lead to a weird train of thought ...

The Committee had concluded that further development on our land was not possible due to the size constraints and lack of funds, thus we should sell the Club if at all possible. It was 'thought' that we would be allowed to buy any land that had been in British ownership prior to the 1954 Land Act with permission of H.M. The King. It was noted, however, that our land was still mortgaged to the Hong Kong & Shanghai Bank.

Luckily, the idea was only theoretical!

However, following up the question of the future of the Olub the Chairman reported that discreet enquiries had been made at the Land Office and, although nothing was given in writing; there would appear to be no diffioulty regarding the sale of the flub property if it were decided to do so, or the purchase of another property that is already British owned. Land fax would have to be paid retrospectively but it was believed this would not be as excessive as at first believed.

For two days in March the Club extended to the crews of HMCS Assiniboine (DDE235), HMCS Ottawa (DDE229) and HMCS Margaree (DDE 230), all St. Laurent-class destroyers, use of the Club facilities during their visit. The plaques of HMCS Margaree and HMCS Ottawa are on display in the Churchill Bar.

Later in the year, the Club extended to the crew of HMS Tiger (C20), a Tiger-class conventional cruiser, use of the Club facilities during their visit. The ship's homegrown Band *'The Federals'* appeared on Thai Television. The plaque of HMS Tiger is on display in the Churchill Bar.

The Bangkok Naval Association ran its Trafalgar Dinner at the Club on 21st October.

Things Done!

It was agreed, from feedback at the Annual General Meeting, that candidates for election to the General Committee should have their names displayed on the notice board two weeks ahead of the meeting but this would not preclude nominations from the floor.

The General Committee decided to allow members of the Voluntary Service Overseas organisation, to have use of the Club's facilities whilst in Bangkok

The General Committee agreed to allow officers and men from the Golden Arrow (SWB 8) Detachment from the 19 Signals Regiment to have use of the Club's facilities whilst in Bangkok during August 1962.



Things left undone

In February, when it was proposed to put to the AGM to have 'associate members' within the Club, that was to have members other than "citizens of the United Kingdom and such other persons who are of British descent, as the committee may decide". The Committee decided that "no resolution be put"!

In the same vein it was requested that British ladies married to non-British men should be able to obtain 'Ladies' privileges' - again the Committee decided that "no resolution be put"!

In the August, the Committee considered a proposal to build a Squash Court at the Club to increase the number of sports played - this was deferred! -

ed to present a resolution in respect of changing the rule for Henorur to the Arnual General Meeting. It was further agreed that no resolution of Associate Memberning would be presented to the Arnual General Keetin of Ladise privileges for Pritish Ladise married to non-British as discussed and it was decided that no resolution in this respect vented to the Annual General Meeting.

Service


John Donofield, of Pronesiam, became chairman in 1962 (see Past Participle, January 2023). Mowbray Mackie, of the Mercantile Bank, became Vice-Chairman (see Past Participle, May 2023). D.R. Davies, of the Tiuss Pradit Company, became Honorary Secretary, for six months during his only service on the committee and was replaced, upon going Absent, by Don Johnson (of the Squash Cup fame), also his only committee service. J.A. Anderson, of the Mercantile Bank, became Honorary Treasurer and did two more terms of service.

David Carpenter, of the Shell Company of Thailand, would serve this one term. J.E. Robinson, of the Singer Sewing Machine Company, served part of this term plus two more and was replaced by Brian P. Tomkins, of the Mechanical Equipment Company, who would go onto serve six terms.

An unusual single term was served by Commander Ross Swan, who was the Naval Member of the Military Planning Office in SEATO (South-East Asia Treaty Organization) Headquarters in Bangkok. Commander Swan was promoted to Rear Admiral in 1978, appointed as an Officer in the Order of Australia (AO) in 1982 and retired from the RAN in 1983.

1962 also saw the first of two terms of service by Dr. J. Paddy Dickson, originally of the Bangkok Nursing Home. Paddy had a long and distinguished career in Thailand, became an Honorary Member of the club in 2014 and the Club website picture archive is blessed by a large number of photographs he took in the 1960s (see below). His obituary is in the December 2021 edition of Outpost.

Club News

In April, the refit of 'The Bar' (now Veranda restaurant) was completed with a new bar, new refrigerator, and a new central ceiling fan and all the Naval plaques re-gilded. This cost 90,000 Ticals. We also introduced a draught beer for the first time, namely 'Singha' although not initially popular it took a few months before we sold enough to warrant receiving credit from Boon Rawd Brewery. Whilst the launch of the new Bar was received very well by members there were complaints that the Club kept the old bar stools which were uncomfortable.

Outgoing Club Chairman, Mr John H.W. Marshall donated a Cricket Trophy for a cricket competition of "the British Club versus the RBSC (Royal Bangkok Sports Club)". Sadly, the Club lost the first match.

Although initially very popular, the Bowling Alley had fallen into disrepair, the Committee decided to spend some 63,100 Ticals on repairing the Alley and especially levelling the floor which had warped. A new ball was purchased, old balls repaired, and three members donated new balls.

Unfortunately, "no good deed ever goes unpunished" because once the Bowling Alley was back in full use, the Club received a complaint from the Royal Thai Police related to the noise it generated!

In Other News

Colonel P.B. Winstanley MC was appointed British Military Attaché and joined the club on 18th April. He had previously been the commanding officer of the 2nd Battalion, 6th Queen Elizabeth's Own Gurkha Rifles.

In June, the installation of the new sewer in 1961 and subsequent widening of Silom Road led to the Silom Tram Line being closed. In the October, the line along Rama IV Road also closed.

The Reverend Edgar James Pulman left Christ Church in Convent Road which was then served by diocesan clergy until 1963. Commander E.F. Pritchard was appointed British Naval Attaché and joined the club on 11th October.

The Victory Hotel opened at 322 Silom Road, roughly where the expressway now meets Silom. This was the first hotel of the now Narai Group. The Narai itself was still six years away.

Although Canada commenced ambassadorial relations with Thailand in November 1961 it was not until 17th December 1962 that the Club offered the Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary, H.E. Charles Eustace McGaughey, an Honorary Membership. Strangely it is not recorded in the minutes whether it was accepted!

Club Financiero Génova, Madrid

Visited in June 2022 Paul Doust and Prasit Jangkamol (a.k.a. Jack)

The Club Financiero Génova is a business oriented private member's club that was founded in 1972, and inaugurated in 1973 once the membership had reached 500. The club is on the top floors of the Centro Colón office block in central Madrid, and has its own lift to take members up to the 14th floor which is where the reception is located.

The club has a bar, a restaurant, a lounge area, a couple of meeting rooms, and a long narrow terrace running along outside the bar and lounge. Breakfast, lunch and dinner are provided from Monday to Friday, but the club is closed at weekends. Additionally, on the roof of the building which is the level above the narrow terrace, there's large deck with 360° views over Madrid. On the deck there's a swimming pool, and although I couldn't see any changing rooms, there is an internal spiral staircase from the deck which leads directly down to the toilets adjacent to the bar. However, there were no other sports facilities and no accommodation. The dress code is specified as business attire for both men and women. For men that means that jackets are compulsory, and even polo shirts are banned. However, jackets may be removed on summer nights.

We first visited the club early one evening. Although the concierge who greeted us said he couldn't speak English, he was happy with our letter of introduction



which was written in English. Very few people were in the club, but that was in the middle of the June 2022 Nato summit which was held in Madrid. During the summit, the authorities were discouraging people from coming into central Madrid because of all the security precautions. However, the following evening when we went for dinner at 9pm there were a couple of functions taking place so the club was quite busy. We normally like to eat dinner earlier than 9pm, but in line with Spanish culture, the restaurant doesn't open until 9pm.

For our dinner, we were seated outside on the narrow terrace, from where we had great views looking east over Madrid. We had a good meal but the wine list, which was 100% Spanish apart from a few Champagnes, was both disappointing and amazing. It was disappointing because wine vintages were not specified, the staff didn't seem to understand why vintages are important, and some of the wines listed were not available even though the wine list was electronic and accessed via QR code. However, the amazing thing was how cheap the wines were, because it seemed to me that the wines were almost being sold at cost price. Overall, we were well looked after, so when British Club Bangkok members are in Madrid they should consider visiting this club.

EVENT REPORT:

"Voting rights for Brits living abroad", Wednesday, 17th May 2023:

Long-term Club Member Bruce Darrington who had obtained a detailed non-political presentation on the topic from a UK Political Party, was introduced by Section Chair Terry Adams in front of a small, but very interested and later vociferous group of section and club members.

Bruce opened his presentation by outlining the key aspects of the UK's "Elections Act 2022" as passed by the UK Parliament. The important change for all British Citizens living overseas is that they now have the right to vote in local and national elections irrespective of how long they have been based outside the UK. He went on to note



that the totality of UK Citizens eligible to vote was 3.4mn as at Dec 2021, a total of some 7% of the total voting population, equivalent to Wales and Northern Ireland combined, so far from an insignificant number! He went on to describe the registration process involved, which would be 'challenging' for many expats.

Bruce then turned to processes used by other countries in allowing their overseas citizens to vote, and he broadened this with an announcement of facts unknown to all the Seniors Section and Club Member attendees: That France (21 constituencies, 6% of total MPs) and Italy (8 constituencies, 1.3% of total MPs) have MPs solely elected to represent Overseas Constituencies. This was a stunning revelation as UK Citizens living overseas have no such representation in the UK Parliament at all, unless registered to vote in a UK Constituency! Discussion and debate continued somewhat heatedly, until the event was brought to a conclusion in the usual way and all repaired to the Churchill Bar!



ABBREVIATED EVENT REPORT:

Day Trip to Ayutthaya and the "Golden Treasure Exhibition", Thursday, 25th May 2023:

Following a 'Team Breakfast' at the Sala, a smaller than usual group (owing to 5 regulars being overseas) boarded our luxury 22-seater minibus for the easy ride up to the ancient Thai Capital. Nisa Young, our effervescent and efficient 'Trip Captain' for the day, handed out bottles of cold water together with the Itinerary Notes prepared by Noah Shepherd, notes which set out not just the planned five stop timings but also important historical information on each of them.

The first stop was to the ruins of Wat Rachaburana, built in 1424 and sacked by the invading Burmese in 1767. We were first of all struck by just the sheer size and scale of the ruins and the huge land area they covered. Then on to the adjacent 14th century Wat Maha That, famous for the highly revered Buddha image entwined in the roots of an ancient banyan tree.

After walking for so long in such high temperatures and sunlight, the aircon of the minibus along with Nisa's cold water, brought welcome relief as we travelled the short distance to the Chao Sam Phraya National Museum. We were directed to a brand new 2-storey building that was fully airconditioned where we paid our entrance fees of Baht 30 for Thai Citizens and Baht 150 for foreigners.

Located on the 2nd floor, the "Golden Treasure Exhibition" covered all 8 rooms in superbly displaying 2,244 pieces of 15th century gold ornaments and artefacts. Over many years Fine Arts Department teams dug under some temple ruins, including under Wat Maha That,

and found what is now this magnificent collection and display of gold and silver ornaments and artifacts.

Without exception, all of our group thought the exhibition to be 'stunning and an absolute must visit when in Ayutthaya'!

A leisurely, very tasty and filling lunch was taken at the Ruan Rub Rong Restaurant located on the Pasak River, not far from its confluence with the Chao Phraya River.

We then boarded the minibus to travel to the nearby St. Joseph's Catholic Church located on the banks of the Chao Phraya River. First con-









structed by the French soldiers stationed in Ayutthaya in 1666, it too was destroyed by the invading Burmese in 1767, was rebuilt in 1831 by French Missionaries, and has been often renovated since into the beautiful exterior and interior which we were very pleased to be able to see.



The final stop was to the tranquil and very shady 'Japanese Village' tourist attraction, a memorial to the historic Japanese enclave established there in the 16th century alongside those from Portugal, France, Holland. An interesting but perhaps one-sided 10-minute video was shown in a small auditorium showcasing Thai-Japanese trade relationships in the 16th century.

The journey home against the traffic was short, swift, and comfortable! A few of us repaired to the Jubilee Bar to 'wind-down' after what transpired to be a really fabulous and memorable trip!

(An interesting side note: Representing 'England' in Ayutthaya at that time was The Honourable East India Company together with their staff, employees, and families. The Company had been given license to trade with Siam by King James II. According to Wikipedia, following arguments and much worse over trade routes



to India, in August 1687 Siam declared war against the Company, whose employees and families, aware of recent atrocities by both sides near to India, promptly fled Ayutthaya never to return. No peace treaty was ever signed to end the war, but the Siamese revolution of 1688 rendered the issue moot as King Narai was overthrown).
