

Increasing healthcare costs, changes in circumstances, redundancy or feeling 'trunky' are just some of the reasons why people consider moving back to the UK.

If you're thinking about a UK return, it's crucial to plan ahead and understand the key issues which may affect you. This will help reduce the chance of a significant, and perhaps unnecessary, tax bill.

Because of the UK's complex tax system, it's important to give yourself plenty of time; ideally six-12 months before beginning the process.

Unfortunately the luxury of time may not be an option. Nevertheless, it's important to understand the consequences of your return to ensure it is the right decision for your personal circumstances now and in the future

WHEN TO RETURN

Although there's no perfect time, an understanding of the UK residence system is a good place to start. This will allow you to be aware of when you're likely to become a UK tax resident - it's sometimes not as straightforward as it may seem!

If you return in the middle of the tax year and have been receiving overseas income, obtaining UK split-tax year treatment will be important. This allows you to split the tax year in two - one part applying to when you're UK resident, and one when you're not.

DO I NEED TO TELL HMRC WHEN I RETURN?

Telling HMRC that you're returning to the UK is very important. It can be done personally, or by your tax adviser. It's always a good idea to seek tax advice before your return, and this could be part of an overall package of a pre and post UK tax advice service.

CONSIDERATIONS FOR A UK RETURN

There are lots of things to consider, but the key points to focus on are:

- \bullet Seek UK tax advice and use a professional qualified UK tax adviser.
- Check your UK banking arrangements if you don't have a UK bank account speak to your previous UK bank.
- Understand foreign pension provision can it be withdrawn before your return?
- Review currency exchange rates if transferring significant amounts research the most efficient way of doing so.
- Review investment funds they could be taxed differently in the UK.
- Find a home give tenants the correct notice if you have a UK property or do your research if moving to a new home in a new area.
- Plan healthcare needs NHS hospital treatment is free for those resident in the UK and applies immediately if you're returning permanently.
- Research schools explore the options and be aware that children must be physically present in the UK to enroll.
- Check your insurance consider your general (motor, home), and personal (private medical insurance, life assurance and critical illness) cover; personal insurance is normally cheaper in the UK.
- Make sure your UK driving licence is still valid this is especially important if you've been absent from the UK for a long period.

Returning to the UK is a big step so do plan ahead both personally and financially. Over the years we've helped many people relocate to the UK, so please get in touch to discuss your plans.

Letter From The General Manager



THE GM's SPOT

This month I thought it may be interesting to mention a few house and grounds maintenance points that have just been carried out.

Firstly, our new gardener Khun Neung, who started with us last month, has begun to tidy up the gardens and planted new plants and trees, removing dead wood, and, although there is a lot more work to be done especially around back lawn, we should see small but steady improvements over the next few months.

Talking about clearing dead wood, the Bangkok Metropolitan Administration (BMA) spent two days at the club cutting and trimming the trees in time for the real rainy season and with that season in mind, we also had all our drains dredged and was quite surprised to see how much 'gunk' was exhumed ... if you think your job is hard spare a thought for those guys! We have also purchased new urinal flushing systems for the main changing rooms which now flushes more water for longer, this should clear some lingering issues we had.

Secondly, our brilliant engineering team has just started

working (at the time of writing) on a new bike parking area which will be a great improvement on the current tents we have. Hopefully, we will get permission from our neighbours to plant trees along the back wall and, with some lighting, the project should look quite nice and round off the front aspect of the Club.

Thirdly, over the past couple of months, a company called "Esson Energy" has installed some complementary electrical measuring systems to gauge which areas of our new phase 2 are consuming more energy than is, perhaps, required. The initial results show that our fitness centre consumes 25% of the area's electricity and the kitchen 21%. We have now a much better understanding of the peaks and troughs of gym usage and have therefore been able to set a more precise schedule for the air-conditioning units.

Enough of this back-of-house update ... at the front of house, to help you keep cool during this rather hot summer season keep an eye out for some of our refreshing F&B promotions ... have a good August!





BC Survey 2023 ... the results

The General Committee would like to thank the 205 members who took the time to respond to the annual Membership Survey, providing useful feedback and opinions about member experiences and future developments.

79% of respondents were full members, 82% were family members, 79% were male and 53% were using the club more than once/week. The largest responses from 1–5-year members (30%) and 20–30-year members (20%). See Figure 1.



Food

- High praise was received for the Veranda's dining experience by 93% of respondents and Sunday Brunch (88%), with pizzas (88%), healthy options (88%) and vegetarian food (87%) also being highly commended.
- Members also positively commented on the 'best in Bangkok' burgers; the need to improve the consistency of the food quality; to vary the menus and desire to bring back the food delivery service.
- There was a request for a more creative and healthy kids' menu and desserts, weekly healthy options, food specials, the addition of Japanese items, and a review of the business lunches and their availability.

Beverages

- The range of alcoholic drinks and range of ales and beers were highly applauded by 98% and 94% of respondents respectively.
- Members report that the wine provision (86%) and pricing (87%) have improved since last year.
- Members did request a wider range of single malt whiskeys and gins, Guinness to be served in the Churchill Bar, adding kids Robinsons squash to the menu and an improvement in the quality of coffee being served.

Events

- There was widespread support for the events held over the past 12 months. The majority were rated as Outstanding, Excellent or Good by over 80% of respondents.
- Bonfire night, the Christmas events and Mother's Day were most highly praised as was the Great British Fair.
- The kids' activities were positively mentioned, coupled with a request to extend provision to entertain 2–3-year-olds.
- The issue of non-member guests being allowed to attend events was raised, together with suggestions for prioritising members first. Support was also voiced for more senior events, live music, movie nights and the introduction of a farmers' market.

Club Development

- 75% of members supported the promotion of sustainability and an active attempt to reduce the use of plastics and 62% want to see live music or concerts being held at the British Club.
- 56% of members supported charity events being held.
- There was limited support for Ladies nights (13%), monthly speakers (37%), Day trips (24%) and meeting the GC (13%).

Consultation about the Churchill Bar

- 11 of the 205 respondents suggested that it should not be changed at all and 7 stated that money should not be spent on it. 3 members suggested that a refurbishment should involve a return to the pre-2000 bar and horseshoe layout!
- Some members wanted no music and the TVs to be removed whilst others wanted to watch the sport in the bar with the sound on!



- Some liked the standing chairs and tables, others said to remove them!
- One member talked about upholding the dress code, whilst 6 wanted the dress code to be removed with tailored shorts being allowed after 6pm.
- There was a desire for a warmer and more modern look (7) and the bar to be livelier (5), and a layout to encourage communication (3).
- Members supported the old-fashioned pub interior with dark furniture and a long bar (3), whilst others wanted to see a traditional English pub theme (11), with alcoves (2) and an upgrade of the interior and furnishings (4).

Sports

- Members requested improvements to be made to the BC App to allow for tennis court and coach bookings to be made in unison, and a tech solution to be introduced to sign out and in towels.
- One member wanted to introduce BC themed towels.
- There were requests for a pool table, improved beginner tennis and squash sessions, the introduction of touch tennis, a practice wall, heavier dumbbells, stretching machines, downlights in the weightlifting area of the gym, punch bags, more fitness group classes and yoga, and day passes for the gym.
- A couple of members wanted to see swimming pool rules being reinforced, and members to be reminded that the Kids Stop and Games Rooms are noisy spaces for children to do what they do best - make noise! Other suggestions included starting a pool and darts league, adding shades for the tennis courts and swimming pool, and installing a golf practice net.

Maintenance

 A number of issues are being deal with immediately by management..

Staff

- Overall, there was high praise of the BC staff with a number of staff being mentioned by name for their courteousness, kindness and care.
- A couple of members requested a return to full table service to all outlets.

 Concern was expressed about the difficulties staff had in taking and recording orders on the system.

Technology

- Several members discussed the improvements that they would like to see to the Members App. They would like to be able to view sports, coaches and events bookings, upcoming events, weekly specials, their account details, and bills, as well as their food orders, the progress of their orders and their spendings real time.
- There was a feeling that the F & B staff could be technologically supported far better in their roles.

Improvements for family members

There were requests for improvements to the provision for our younger members, to include a soft play area in the Kids Stop, more toys and accessories, beanbags and pool toys, more activities for the 9-13 year olds, a water fountain at the kids poor area, a family bathroom poolside and more aircon/dry space for families, especially during the hot or wet times of year.

Miscellaneous suggestions

- Several members mentioned the need for decoration of the Clubhouse inside and out, with a renovation of the Wordsworth room and much needed upgrade of the toilets, as well as better use of the 1910 bar.
- The use of the Silom Wing was raised with members asking whether it could be repurposed and used better. The concept of co-working spaces was also raised in an attempt to provide members with a more flexible and modern area for out-of-office working.
- Finally, other suggestions included covering the multi-purpose court, relocating the turtles, opening the little gate next to the smoker's area in front of the clubhouse, and installing solar panels and EV charging.

This year's survey has already led to discussions and improvements in several areas. The BC Management and General Committee are carefully reviewing the member feedback and looking to address and consider all the suggestions made. We thank all respondents to the survey for their contributions and suggestions.



Operations Unknown

This month it was my pleasure to pop down and catch up with one of our membership partners and friends, the team at **Aurum Art Gallery**.

For all the people reading this article that haven't heard of the gallery yet, give us a short intro to what they can expect when visiting?

Aurum Gallery is an independent contemporary, urban and street art gallery based in Bangkok, Thailand. Conceived and curated by internationally acclaimed British DJ, musician, actor and artist, Clifford Price (MBE) aka 'Goldie'.

We are located at Warehouse 30, a trendy community project of restored World War 2 warehouses in the creative district of Charoen Krung. Housed in a 500sqm open space, Aurum Gallery showcases some of the world's biggest artists in contemporary, urban and street art including Belin, Ben Eine, Bio, Bisco Smith, Ces, Crash, Goldie, Helio Bray, James Bullough, Mad C, Mikael B, Mr Cenz, Nick Walker, Simon Berger, Vhils, Voyder and more.

Displayed alongside international heavyweights from the art world, Aurum Gallery is also celebrating a growing and exciting pool of local talent such as 2Choey, Asin, Benzilla, Jecks, P7 and A Kid From Yesterday to name a few.

What makes Aurum Gallery different from others in Thailand?

Incorporated in to the gallery is a live workshop space that can showcase artists in action and provide master classes and events allowing art enthusiasts and aspiring talent to be completely immersed in the process of creation.

Having opened in July 2020, and during the backdrop of the Covid-19 pandemic, Aurum Gallery has already established itself as one of the best art galleries in South East Asia and a 'must see destination' that is spear-heading contemporary art in Thailand.

Subway Train

Where were you when you came up with the idea to open a gallery and why Thailand?

Initially gaining exposure for his work as a graffiti artist, Goldie became well known for his pioneering role as a musician in the 1990's. He is an artist whose ferocious creativity shows no bounds.

His versatility as a visual artist and his relationship with incredible artists around the world, sparked the idea and inspiration to establish a space to showcase contemporary works for himself and his peers.

An inspiration to many, he was awarded an MBE for services to music and young people.

Goldie now resides in the South of Thailand when he's not on tour and witnessed the birth of Bangkok's creative district and wanted to be part of it.

What is the story behind the New York Subway Train?

At the heart of the gallery, is a one-of-a-kind permanent installation, a full-size gold leaf and graffitied New York Subway Car that symbolises a cohesion of cultures, acknowledging the golden age of graffiti art and drawing inspiration from traditional Thai fine art techniques.

The train is a symbolic collaboration between international and local street artists. The intention for this is to be an ever-changing canvas by inviting artists to re-paint it from time to time.

The current mural represents old school wildstyle graffiti lettering by Goldie, with his signature phrase 'Tru Gold' alongside characters at each end of the train by local Thai Artist Jecks.

Who is in the team that runs the Gallery?

Goldie is the owner and curator and is always on the lookout for established and emerging contemporary artists from across the globe.

Leon Wilkinson is the creative director and is the main man at the controls.

William Brunsdon and **Spun Ngoensritong** manage the gallery on a daily basis, taking care of exhibitions and events.

Ron Baker is front of house and is the smile you see when you walk through the door.



What has been your most successful display or show so far?

Our first solo artist exhibition, 'Shattered' by Swiss contemporary glass artist Simon Berger featuring over 40 unique works. The artist was in attendance for his debut Asian show and created a stunning live performance piece at the opening event.

With a fascination with human faces, the artist explores the material of glass which he hammers, lacerates, cracks and engraves portraits that play with light and transparency, plunging the gaze into a meander of lesions that he calls 'Morphogenesis'. As the pioneer of this technique, he has become one of the most talked-about and collected artists in the 'urban contemporary' art scene.

The captivating glass works on display are a sight to behold along with our exclusive window installation at the gallery entrance, a giant 8-panel glass portrait.

Describe the most unusual attraction you have?

The most unusual piece on display in the gallery is the 'Moona Lisa' by Nick Walker, as it never fails to amuse viewers.

The story goes that artists Nick Walker, Banksy and Paul Insect were in conversation when Banksy mentioned that you can 're-make/remix/redo or modify any person, thing or piece in the world except the 'Mona Lisa' as it had 'already been done'.

To disprove Banksy, Nick Walker set upon making the 'Moona Lisa', initially starting out as a street art mural before transforming into a painting, prints and then finishing its cycle off in the form of a life-sized bronze sculpture.

Who are your clients and visitors?

We have a wide range of visitors keeping the gallery busy, from artists, collectors, students, expats and tourists.

What price ranges do you sell your artworks for?

We have a great selection of art books and prints which start from USD100, these are always a popular choice for introducing aspiring collectors to the art world and make beautiful gifts. Original works from our esteemed collection range from USD1,000 to USD180,000. We really do have something for everyone, including Tee who I'm sure has got his eye on the 'Moona Lisa'!

What can we expect from the gallery over the next 12 months?

We have some exciting new shows for the rest of 2023 along with amazing new artworks arriving on a regular basis from local and international artists Asin, Robson, Andres Scholtz, 2Choey and more.

We continue the story of the British Club Bangkok ... 1963

Credit where credit is due!

The most significant event of the year was the introduction of the "Chits System". From the Club's re-founding in 1946, members had to buy pre-paid coupons for use in the Club. From 1st October 1963, following an EGM on 12th September, members could sign for drinks and then be presented with an account on 20th of each month for payment to the Permanent Assistant Secretary by the last day of the month.

Rules were also brought in for fining late payers and removing from membership those who failed to pay! Non-Members could deposit cash ahead of any event to which they were invited. The constitution was

amended accordingly. The General Committee agreed a 'cash-at-end of visit system' for officers and men from the Golden Arrow (SWB 8) Detachment (see Past Participle, October 2022), as they were frequent visitors.

Minutes of the Extraordinary General Meeting held at the ritish Club on Thursday; 12th September, 1963 at 5.30 plm. ere being a quorum present, the Chairman called on the rary Secretary to read the Notice convening the meeting, and the genda for the meeting. The Chairman commented briefly on the reasons for calling the meeting as contained in his Circular to Members, No. 15/1963 of 2nd September, 1963, and called for a Seconder of the Committee's otion. Mr. J.K. Simpson seconded the motion that Rules 53, 55 and 56 be amended. The motion passed unanimously.

Chits!!

Board

This was the year of the "commissioning" of our first Chairman's Board for the Clubhouse reception. This took over two years to undertake due to our loss of records during the Japanese occupation of 1941 to 1945. In a stroke of luck, Mr. John Fisher, Counsellor at the British Embassy, supplied the Club with a list of chairmen from 1912 to 1947, found at the Embassy. Sadly, this list recorded that the first chairman was W.E. Adam in 1912. which led to the belief, on part of the Committee, that the Club's founding date was 1912. This original Chairman's Board was replaced in 2002 having run out of room for adding new Chairmen, and then all boards were replaced by updatable framed pictures in 2018.

1. Name Boards It was decided to set up a Board on which the names of former Chairmen of the British Club would be inscribed. The Chairman said that he had access to certain records and would endeavour to produce a list of names for such a board.

The Bangkok St. Andrew's Society was, however, luckier than the Club in having most of its records since 1890 thus when the Chieftain's board was commissioned. also in 1963, along with the Presidents' boards for the Bangkok St. George's Society and the St. Patrick's Society Bangkok, the St. Andrew's board was complete. Only three Loyal Societies ... The St David's Society in Bangkok was not founded until 1976.

Continuing their service were J.A. Anderson, William Brownsey, Dacre Raikes, and Brian Tomkins; Serving this one term was R.M. Tesh, from the British Embassy; and co-opted for part of this term were G.B. Mattacks, of Louis T. Leonowens, and W.K. Young, of Thai Glass.

Club News

Our Butler, Yee Daeng, was taken seriously ill during the early part of the year and allowed to stay in the Staff Quarters. As a direct consequence of this illness, the

Committee agreed that all servants should undergo a full medical and a full medical would also be undertaken on all servants joining the Club in the future.

By the April, it was mutually agreed that the Butler was too ill to work thus he was retired. He was given a retirement gift of 16,500 Ticals, a month's salary for each year he worked for us, plus over 10,000 Ticals from a subscription fund coming from members. As a result of his retirement the No. 1 Boy, Sumeth Sumethrataniya, was promoted to Butler with effect from 1st June.

The Committee decided that disciplinary matters and other complaints about servants would now come under the Bar Committee leaving the Permanent Assistant Secretary responsible for day-to-day operations.

At the Annual General Meeting, the Chairman, John Donofield. announced to the that the General Committee were close to selling the Club and making an offer on a property on South Sathorn Road, 'Frankfield', then the home of the Borneo Company General Manager. This came as an enormous shock to those in attendance! Mr. Donofield continued that his matter had been raised at previous Annual General Meetings and would, of course, be subject to Members' agreement at an Extraordinary General Meeting called for that purpose (see Past Participle, September 2023). It was reported that, although the site was only 2.5 acres, thus far smaller than our existing land, it was in a better location and a better shape to develop.

The American Club Hong Kong was founded on 6th July 1925, and grew from small gatherings of Americans who met to socialize. Since 1985 the town clubhouse has been located on the 48th and 49th floor of Two Exchange Square in the 'Central' district on Hong Kong Island. Those floors are the top two floors of the building, so on a clear day the club has excellent views of Victoria Harbour. The club has around 3000 members, of which around 50% are Voting Members, and 50% are Associate Members i.e. non-American citizens. The club also has a country branch which overlooks Tai Tam bay which will be reviewed on another occasion.

The club has gym facilities, one lounge, two bars, three dining areas, but no accommodation. The Harbor Lounge on the 48th floor has an outside terrace, which is the only area in the club where smoking is allowed. Next to the Harbor Lounge is Billy's Bar, the centrepiece of which is a 135 year-old wooden bar, originally from Billy's Restaurant in New York City. You have to walk through Billy's Bar to get to McKays Steakhouse, which is open for both lunch and dinner but closed on Sun-


days and public holidays. Also located on the 48th floor are several private dining rooms as well as The Clipper Restaurant, which is only open for lunch and closed on Saturdays and public holidays. There's also a sports bar/restaurant called Forty Niner (being located on the 49th floor), and next to Forty Niner is the gym. The dress code is smart casual on the 48th floor, but just casual on the 49th floor. A fee is payable if one wants to use the gym.

Arriving at Two Exchange Square, one goes up a couple of escalators and ends up in an area where there are three banks of lifts going to different levels of the building. To choose the floor that one wants to go to, one tells the lift system the desired floor before entering any of the lifts. The system then tells you which lift to use. To get to the American Club, one chooses floors 47-49, and on arrival on the 47th floor one changes lift to one of the two lifts that go up to the club. The reception where one registers for a temporary membership card is on the 48th floor.

The American Club (Town), Central, Hong Kong

Visited in March 2023 by Paul Doust and Prasit Jangkamol (a.k.a. Jack)





allowed admission to the club for 14 days twice a year.

While we were in Hong Kong we used the club's facilities on two occasions. After we'd registered for our temporary membership card, we had a nice snack in the Forty Niner sports bar/restaurant. There are lots of TV screens in this area, in particular a giant screen behind the bar which was showing an American baseball game while we were there. The following day we took advantage of the Happy Hour in Billy's Bar, when drinks were discounted 50% between 17:30 and 19:30. With the discount, a glass of a decent 10 year old St-Émilion was just HK\$55 and seemed particularly good value. We asked whether there was any availability for dinner in McKays steakhouse that night, but unfortunately it was fully booked, both for that day and for the following day. In any case, the facilities at this club were all first rate, so with good harbour views and great dining facilities this club is thoroughly recommended.



EVENT REPORT:

"Practical Steps to Prevent Vision or Sight Loss", Wednesday, 12th July 2023:

A full house in the Wordsworth Lounge even required additional chairs as long-term Club Member Bruce Hemminsen, who skilfully intermingled his own not inconsiderable personal sight endangering experiences with his subsequent research into the subject from his background as an industrial chemist, set out his very interesting presentation.

Bruce set the scene by informing of the world-wide prevalence and significant growth in eye diseases as the global population ages, but countered that up to 75% of vision loss is both preventable and treatable. Going through the various types of vision loss conditions, he set out the actions that people can take to prevent or mitigate the various types of vision loss. Interestingly, the stopping









of smoking was a common theme! Photographs of the effects of the various diseases as seen by the affected person, really brought home his messages of the disease effects and the need for prevention.

Bruce concluded his presentation setting out latest developments for eyesight recovery, including work on "The Bionic Eye". An interesting Q&A followed before Bruce was thanked in the usual manner for an exceptionally relevant and interesting presentation. Attendees were then handed a gift from the Seniors Section, being a two-sided card setting out 10 steps in a suggested eyecare regime.

THE JEWEL IN HISTORIC AYUTTHAYA'S GOLDEN CROWN

A Seniors Section visit to the "Golden Treasure Exhibition" on 25th May 2023

Ayutthaya was once a magnificent city and was capital of the Kingdom of Siam from 1351 to 1767. It flourished as a trading hub and grew into one of the world's wealthiest and most cosmopolitan cities. Its strategic location allowed it to control crucial maritime trade routes, attracting merchants from Asia, Europe, and the Middle East. The city's prosperity was reflected in its many grand temples and palaces adorned with intricate architecture and artwork, bustling markets, and extensive waterways that facilitated transportation and trade.

In its heyday as a trading capital, the local population was supplemented with traders, court officials, mercenary soldiers (including some 300 warriors (not Samurai) from Japan) in the King's Army, together with their families. Estimates put that foreigners were, at around 25%, a significant proportion of the total population of some 400,000 people living in Ayutthaya at its peak.

However, Ayutthaya faced numerous conflicts with neighbouring kingdoms, and in 1767 it fell to and was destroyed by the invading Burmese army, leading to its decline. Today, Ayutthaya stands as a UNESCO World Heritage Site, preserving the remnants of its glorious past.

Since 1969 the Fine Arts Department of Thailand has been undertaking renovations of the ruins, scaling up the project after the site was declared a Historical Park in 1976. This has resulted in the discovery of thousands of ornaments and objects, most made of pure gold, others of silver, together with various pottery items, all testament to the wealth of the city during its prime. All of these formed the basis for the construction and opening in November 2022 of a new fully airconditioned wing at the Chao Sam Phraya National Museum to house "The Golden Treasure Exhibition" covering all



8 rooms on the 2nd floor, displaying 2,244 pieces of the above-mentioned items.

To us as visitors, the exhibition very much achieved its aim to highlight the rich heritage of Ayutthaya and provided a glimpse into the city's glorious past, its history, the cultural influences that shaped the Kingdom, and its contributions to Thai culture.

Without exception, all of our group thought the exhibition to be 'stunning and an absolute must visit when in Ayutthaya'!




