



Greetings once again!

Beginning of a new year is an ideal time to set some resolutions for the year. Here are some to consider:

1. Write a will

It's never too early to plan for the future. Drafting a will can ensure your assets are managed according to your wishes and that your loved ones do not face added stress.

2. Plan your funeral

While it may seem grim, planning your funeral in advance can relieve your loved ones of the burden during a difficult time.

3. Sign up for Travel Advice

Stay informed about the latest travel advice in Thailand or the country you are travelling to.

4. Check your insurance

Review your policies to ensure they're up-to-date and provide adequate coverage for your health and travel.

5. Visa renewal and passport validity

Ensure your travel documents are in order and your visa is valid. Renew them if necessary. Detention at Thai Immigration Detention Centres can be grim

6. Emergency contact details in passport

Update the back of your passport with the contact details of your emergency contact.

7. Travel with medications legally

If you're traveling with medication, make sure you're aware of the laws and their use in your destination country by consulting the Travel Advice for that country.

8. Accessible Financial Information:

Keep your financial information secure yet accessible in case of emergencies (ie pin numbers, National Insurance numbers).

Foreign, Commonwealth & Development Office (FCDO) is available 24/7 to assist British Nationals. The Bangkok team is always ready to respond during working hours and with emergency cases out of office hours which are escalated to the team by the London team.

On 15 September 2023, the Thai Revenue Department issued Departmental Instruction No. Por 161/2566 ("DI No.161/2566") as a guideline to assist tax officers in determining the personal income tax implications of foreign-sourced income brought into Thailand by Thai tax residents.

Thai Tax Residents are any person residing in Thailand for a period or periods aggregating more than 180 days in any tax (calendar) year. A resident of Thailand is liable to pay tax on income from sources in Thailand as well as on the portion of income from foreign sources that is brought into Thailand. A non-resident is, however, subject to tax only on income from sources in Thailand.

Previously, Section 41 Paragraph 2 of the Thai Revenue Code was interpreted differently: the assessable income derived by a Thai tax resident from employment, a business carried on overseas, or from a property situated overseas, would have been subject to Thai Personal Income Tax (PIT) only if the said taxable income was brought into Thailand in the same tax year.

However, the new interpretation means that foreign-sourced income brought into Thailand will be subject to Thai personal income tax upon bringing it into Thailand in any calendar year from 1 January 2024.

There was further guidance from the Revenue Department on Foreign Sourced Income on 20 November 2023, when they issued Departmental Instruction no. Paw.162 ("DI Paw.162"). This provides clarity that the Departmental Instruction Paw.161/2566 ("DI Paw.161") shall not apply to any foreign-sourced income earned by Thai tax residents before 1 January 2024. As such, Thai tax residents will not be required to include foreign-sourced income earned before this date in personal income tax returns, even if it will be brought into Thailand from 1 January 2024 onwards.

ASSESSABLE INCOME

Employment income whether the income is paid within or outside Thailand. There are no concessions to foreigners or short-term residents.

Capital Gains. Most types of capital gains are taxable as ordinary income except shares in Thai listed companies or the sale of securities listed on ASEAN stock exchanges. Capital gains and investment income earned by a resident from sources outside Thailand are not taxable unless remitted to Thailand in the year of receipt. And capital losses may not be offset against capital gains under Thai laws.

Dividend income, Interest income and the value of most Gifts are also "assessable income".

EXEMPT INCOME


Certain types of income are exempt from PIT. In respect of income from employment, money derived in the form of *per diem*, traveling expenses, and certain fringe benefits such as medical treatment are exempt. The exemptions also include maintenance income derived under moral obligation. Provided certain conditions are met, gains or benefits from registered provident funds, retirement mutual funds, long-term equity funds, and national saving funds including amounts derived from insurance or social security funds, are also tax exempt.




The Club recently signed an agreement for the Ascott & Somerset hotel chain to become a membership partner and exchange exclusive offers with each other.

In the April, the Annual General Meeting had given feedback that Membership should be widened to include those in the British Community who were not UK citizens. Unfortunately, a General Committee attempt at adopting a resolution to put to Members, went round in circles and then deferred ... this prompted the Chairman, Godfrey Sommerfield, to have minuted "If Moses had been a Committee, the Israelites would still be in Egypt"!

An attempt to allow the General Committee authority to allow "Membership for all of British descent" was passed by an Extraordinary General Meeting in early June but heavily defeated at the confirmation EGM held in late June. No successful attempt was made at changing the "British" definition of Membership until an outrage was reported in the Australian Press in 1974 ... but readers will have to wait until Past Participle in July 2024 to read all about it!

It was agreed to postpone a decision until the next meeting. Mr. Sommerfield remarked that if Moses had been a committee the Israelites would still be in Egypt.

THE BRITISH WOMEN'S GROUP: A BRIEF HISTORY



Castle Club, Rochester, England

Visited in May 2022 and June 2023 by Paul Doust and Prasit Jangkamol (a.k.a. Jack)

The <u>Castle Club</u> has its origins in a book reading club called "The Rochester Book Society" which was founded in 1797. The book reading club merged with the <u>Castle Club</u> in 1918, which had been founded independently in 1865. Since 1908 the <u>Castle Club</u> has been located in "The Esplanade House", a double-fronted house near Rochester Bridge with great views over the River Medway. The house was formerly the home of one of its members, and was originally rented from the Bridge Wardens, a charity that runs Rochester Bridge. However, in 1989 the club was able to buy the freehold from them, and has owned the house ever since.











The club is a traditional men-only gentleman's club, and although the club has female staff, female guests are not allowed. The club functions mostly as a weekday lunch club, with dinners on a Thursday every other week. and with various other events organised each month. Lunches and dinners are convivial, with everyone sitting together on the same table or tables depending on the number of diners. The dining area is at the front of the house on the ground floor, behind which there is a small bar area. At the back of the house on the 1st floor there are 3 cheap single guest bedrooms, plus a library that still contains some books from "The Rochester Book Society". At the front of the house on the 1st floor there are a couple of function rooms, one of which has a snooker table which often gets used on Tuesdays. However, the club has no other sports facilities. The majority of members are retired, but over the years the number of members has been quite stable, averaging round 144. The club's dress code is jacket and tie, or black tie for some dinner events.

We first visited the club one afternoon back in May 2022. However, without any information being available to reciprocal members on the club's website, we arrived too late for lunch and only casually dressed. Nonetheless, the members who were there at the time made us feel welcome, including the club's president that year who gave us a brief tour of the club and bought us a drink at the bar. We discovered that the club has 10 reciprocal clubs, and apart from British Club Bangkok, only one other reciprocal club is outside the UK.

We next tried to visit in December 2022, but unfortunately our visit had to be cancelled because a funeral of one of the members was scheduled for the day of our visit, so the club was to be closed. But finally last June we had a successful visit. We took two friends as quests, because these friends have a house not too far from the club, and we all went for lunch on a Monday. The member who had been the club's president when we visited in May 2022 welcomed us all and hosted the lunch, during which he gave a short speech to welcome us. 



EVENT REPORT:

From ChatGPT to the age of Artificial Intelligence: Thursday, 11th February 2024

A large turnout for this lunch event in the Suriwongse Room commenced the Section's new year programme in great style: from the room layout, table settings, food service and quality, through to a really interesting presentation from our most distinguished speaker.

Terry Adams' introduction of the speaker lasted over 5 minutes as he set out a very long list of the speaker's achievements and accomplishments; from university excellence at the highest level, through international business successes, to a long list of organisations and institutes in Hong Kong and beyond both public and private, where she had contributed to their successes, plus finding the time to mentor students at Hong Kong University where she was an Adjunct Professor. Based in Bangkok for several years this remarkable lady, who knows so many people of influence here and regionally, keeps very much abreast of all matters technology and especially the burgeoning developments in Artificial Intelligence (AI), the subject of her presentation.





The Speaker was our own Seniors Section Member and also Committee Member Barbara Meynert; how she finds the time to do all that she does remains a mystery!

Barbara took us through how Chat GPT had changed the Al landscape forever, how it developed, and how it uses the vast data from the internet. She noted that Al is currently driving massive changes to innovation and new industries. How it is adding economic value to the world, currently estimated to be US\$4.4tn pa which will grow exponentially. She set out details of the new Al industries and importantly but perhaps worryingly how 'Al Nationalism' is currently evolving.

She set out a number of the downsides of AI before moving on to the future of AI as it is quickly advancing to reach the same level of intelligence as us humans, known as 'AGI'. Once AGI is reached AI will grow exponentially as compared to humans, leading to 'Super Intelligence' that AI will have but humans will not yet have.

Barbara suggested that there will soon be a need to balance the fear of Al against the benefits to humanity, but questioned who will do the balancing?


In the final part of her talk, Barbara noted that 'the age of Al' has already begun, Al apps are accelerating in terms of their numbers, scope and scale; the world will be changing with Al applications being developed and used in every human activity. We are just at the start of what Al can do. In concluding Barbara said that Al will change the world as we know it and could be bigger for humanity than anything that has come before!

There were so many questions which Barbara answered with aplomb.

An enthralling presentation that was enjoyed by all. In closing and thanking the Speaker Chairperson Terry said he wasn't sure as yet whether to be 'enthralled or terrified' but hopefully that the former would prevail!




