GASTROSCOPY

Gastroscopy is a minimally invasive procedure that uses a thin, flexible camera (endoscope), which is inserted through the patient's mouth - to diagnose any abnormality with the patient's food pipe, stomach and upper part of the small intestine (duodenum). The procedure takes about 10 - 15 minutes.

COLONOSCOPY

Here's quick recap of last month's Consular assistance.

In March, 112,620 British travellers visited Thailand, marking an 17% increase from February. Bangkok Consular team handled 151 new cases. The majority involved welfare issues and medical emergencies. Additionally, there were 21 road traffic incidents and some arrest and detention cases concerning illegally working in Thailand. We continue to remind all travellers to adhere to local laws and customs through on Travel Advice on GOV.UK.

We wish you a pleasant time in Thailand and look forward to connecting at our upcoming events.

UK Spring Budget & Domicile Changes

Last month I wrote about Domicile and UK Inheritance Tax. On 6th March Jeremy Hunt was quick to begin his UK Spring Budget with a reminder of some of the momentous challenges which the Conservatives have faced including the pandemic, global financial crisis and energy shock.

After a nod to these challenging headwinds, Mr Hunt mentioned the country's direction of travel, noting that UK growth is building with predictions that inflation will drop below 2% by the summer. Despite the optimism, it was clear there was a little room for manoeuvre, but an early reference that lower taxes create higher growth suggested some announcements were due.

In what seemed something of a repeat of the Autumn Statement, the Chancellor shared a handful of tax raising measures – abolishing tax breaks for non-doms and those letting second homes as holiday properties, and increasing taxes on cigarettes and vapes – before announcing a range of tax cuts including another reduction in National Insurance.

One of the main announcements was based around non-doms – that is, for UK residents whose permanent home is overseas there will be new rules governing tax, which will take effect from April 2025. Last year 68,800 non-doms were living in the UK, with around 37,000 claiming the special 'remittance basis' tax status (Source: www.gov.uk). A consultation on the reform of Inheritance Tax (IHT) and the desire to move to a residence based regime was also announced which could bring further major changes for non-doms in the future.

DOMICILE

As mentioned before, when it comes to working with British expatriates a major consideration is their domicile status, since it drives the extent of their UK Inheritance Tax (IHT) liabilities. Determining this and developing advice around this has been hugely important. Many people are unsure if UK IHT rules apply to them. Currently if you are domiciled in England, Wales, Scotland or Northern Ireland, UK IHT applies to your global assets. If you are domiciled elsewhere, UK IHT is only charged on assets held in the UK.

Of great interest for those long-term Brits overseas is that as part of the recent Budget the UK Government outlined that they will consult on plans in due course to move to a residence-based regime for inheritance tax (IHT), including consulting on a ten-year exemption period for new arrivals and a ten-year 'tail-provision' for those who leave the UK and become non-resident.

This could mean that in the future there is no need to plan for acquiring a 'Domicile of Choice' to sever UK links for UK IHT. This remains to be seen of course and as usual it is sensible to seek professional advice and review your circumstances and plan-ahead as best as possible whilst understanding the evolving landscape in which we find ourselves.

the British Club Bangkok ... 1972

“Financial crisis!”

A sudden increase of interest rates, from 7% to 11%, by the Chartered Bank triggered a financial crisis in the Club. By the March, the Honorary Treasurer sought an emergency meeting of the Committee as the Club's debt of 650,000 Baht was becoming unmanageable. This debt was 350,000 Baht still owed on the 1965 Swimming Pool loan of 750,000 Baht (see *Past Participle*, October 2023) and 300,000 Baht taken of our subsequent 500,000 Baht overdraft facility

In the June, an Extraordinary General Meeting was called for two immediate measures, which were approved:

- To increase monthly subscriptions from 125 Baht for all Members to 150 Baht for single members and 200 Baht for a married member.
- To increase the entrance fee from 600 Baht to 1,200 Baht.

It was also agreed, at the meeting, that the title deeds of the Club, would not again be pledged to secure any overdrafts, loans and credits advanced to the Club, until all other financial avenues were explored by the Committee. This “policy” was, however, not added to the Club's Constitution until 2019.

“That the title deeds of the Club presently deposited with the Chartered Bank as security for the Fixed loan, shall not be pledged to secure all overdrafts, loans and credits advanced to the Club, until all other financial avenues as are available, are explored by the Committee”.

Our Naval Year

In the February, the Royal Yacht Britannia sailed into Bangkok under escort of HMS Cleopatra (F28), a Leander-class frigate, and HMAS Swan (DE50), a River-class destroyer escort. The Club extended to the

various crews' use of the Club facilities during their visit. The plaques of HMS Cleopatra and HMAS Swan are on display in the Churchill Bar, as is a cap from a sailor on board HM/Y Britannia from her next visit (see *Past Participle*, June 2026).

In the June, the officers and crew of two Royal Naval ships from the 3rd Frigate Squadron - HMS Diomed (F16), a Leander-class frigate and HMS Lowestoft (F103), a Rothesay-class frigate - were entertained at the Club. Interestingly a few years later both ships fought in the third Cod War where they were both rammed by various Icelandic ships as was the main tactic used by the fisherman. The Diomed ended her life in the Pakistan navy as PNS Shamsheer whilst the Lowestoft was used for torpedo practice by the Royal Navy and was sunk.

The Manager reported that within six weeks of purchasing new poolside towels in May, six had been stolen and a number torn into strips to form sweatbands. The Committee were truly horrified!

In the July, Committee member John Price was awarded 6,000 Baht to buy equipment for the newly constituted Cricket Section.

Also in the July, the Squash Section organised the first Club Squash League.

For the August and September, the Club was able to hire a Colour TV in order that Members could watch the Munich Summer Olympics on Thai TV3 ... it cost 700 Baht to hire for the six weeks!

9.3 Mr. Traugott mentioned that in response to requests from Members the Club had purchased towels for their use. However, during the first week, six towels were removed and a number of others torn in half apparently for use as sweat bands. The

Raising Funds

In an attempt to assail the financial difficulties, the Committee looked at leasing part of the Poolside area to the Narai Hotel, for car parking. This was the area which now contains the Silom Wing.

The Narai proposed 250,000 Baht "tea money" on a 30-year lease with monthly rental. This was negotiated down to a three-year lease!

However, our legal advice was that, as a foreign entity, we could not lease out parts of our land, thus the idea was abandoned.

The committee of 1972 was mainly new people ...

Colonel Hugh Docherty OBE was elected as Chairman and served four consecutive terms in the role. He had served in the British Army, and then with SEATO (the South-East Asia Treaty Organization) before retiring to the UK, where he served as secretary for the Anglo-Thai Society. His obituary can be found in the November 1999 edition of Outpost.

Mr. William G. Hay, of the Chartered Bank, was Vice-Chairman in his only term of service, similarly Mike Natrass, of Commercial Union Assurance was Honorary Secretary in his only term of service. Continuing his service was Mr. A.M. Fletcher as Honorary Treasurer, who went onto the Absent List during the year and was replaced by Mr. Blair Littlejohn, of the Chartered Bank, in the first of two terms of service.

Also, continuing their service was Mr. J. Brown, who left for Mexico in the April; Mr. M. Ross Clark, being co-opted back; and Mr. Anthony K.D. Townsend (see *Past Participle, April 2024*).

The new boys were Mr. Des Barry, serving with SEATO, in his only term of service, and the first of two terms each of Mr. John Price, of the Regional Postal Training School, Mr. J.N. Robinson, of Dunlop Thailand and Mr. John Wood, of the United Milk Company.

The question of 'guests' using the Swimming Pool had been raised monthly from June as a means of increasing revenue. In the October, the Committee finally agreed to allow guests to use the swimming pool but for a trial period only, and only at weekends.

New Committee ruling to be circulated. Guests are with immediate effect permitted to bring guests who are eligible under the Rules, at weekends. This is a temporary measure to test whether the facilities can support a larger number.

In Other News

In the February, H.M. Queen Elizabeth II, H.R.H. Prince Philip, The Duke of Edinburgh, and H.R.H. Princess Anne conducted a Royal Tour of Thailand. Sadly, the Club was not on their itinerary.

Col J. S. Houston MBE became the British Military Attaché but there is no record that he joined the Club.

The Sibunruang building was opened on the corner of Silom and Convent Roads. At seven storeys it dwarfed all the local shophouses. It was demolished to make way for the Park Silom complex which opened in 2023.

In the June, Khun Somsak Terphatanakul opened his second 24-hour western-style supermarket, this one in Patpong. It was shortly after rebranded as 'Foodland'.

In the October, Gordon George Riddell became the Canadian Ambassador and became an Honorary Member of the Club.

In the December, the Royal Thai Government merged the newly created Metropolitan City Municipality (see *Past Participle, April 2024*), with all the other local administrative bodies in greater Bangkok to create the "Bangkok Metropolitan Administration" (BMA). 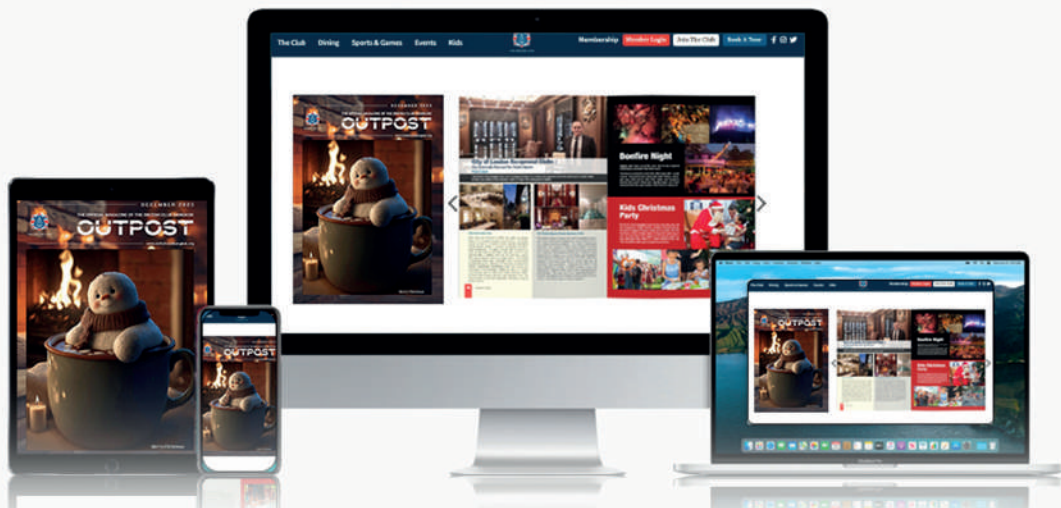

The Caledonian Club, London

Visited in January 2023 and April 2024 by Paul Doust and Prasit Jangkamol (a.k.a. Jack)



The **Caledonian Club** was founded in 1891, and named after Caledonia which is another name for the Scottish Highlands. Originally the club was owned by a proprietor. However, on the owner's death in April 1917, the members purchased the club's assets and formed a private club under the leadership of the **8th Duke of Atholl**. He appealed to members to make it the representative national club and headquarters for Scots in London. Originally it was a club for men only, but these days full membership is open to women too.

There are various facilities at the club including a bar, a restaurant, a drawing room, accommodation, a large number of function rooms, a business centre in the basement, and an outside terrace which is open in the summer. The bar is notable for its huge collection of malts whiskys,



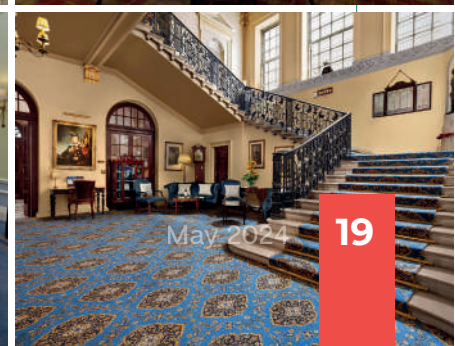
numbering around 225 last month, and according to one of the barmen it's the biggest selection available anywhere outside of Scotland. A selection of Scottish gins and ales are also available. The dress code for men is jacket and tie, with ladies being required to conform to the same standard, although the dress code doesn't apply before 10am in the morning. The club has no sports facilities, but the club's members do have access to the Belgrave Square Gardens nearby which has tennis courts.

The club only became reciprocal with the British Club Bangkok in 2022. We first took the opportunity to visit it when we were back in the UK for Christmas that year. We tried to get a dinner reservation on several dates before Christmas, but the restaurant was fully booked on all the dates that were convenient for us. Booking 4 weeks in advance we were able to get a dinner reservation for mid-January 2023, and even then it turned out that the club was very busy with lots of events taking place, so it was hard to find room for our coats in the cloakroom. However, visiting last month, the club was less busy and dinner reservations were available at relatively short notice.

On both occasions when we dined in the club, Alex the maître d' looked after us very well. On one occasion he recommended the haggis as a starter, and with a twinkle in his eye suggested that we have the "gravy" to accompany it. The "gravy" turned out to be a nice shot of whisky. He also explained that during the Covid lockdowns, some club members who were staying in Scotland had the club send some haggis back to them in Scotland, because Covid restrictions were preventing them from buying it locally. The club has a good value wine list, with no corkage charge for bringing one's own wine on Tuesdays. After dinner last month,

Alex pointed out to us the stuffed ram that sits outside the bar. The silver ornament behind the ram's head turned out to be the lid of a snuff box, and the snuff inside is available free of charge.

Overall, we were quite impressed with the club. Now that I live in Bangkok, I rarely get to drink the wine in my London wine cellar, so I will certainly return for dinner with friends to take advantage of the free corkage on Tuesdays. The club has a lot of events, including a Burn's night in January. If I'm ever in London in late January I'd love to go to the Burn's night, but given how busy the club can be, no doubt one would have to book a long time in advance.

GAP briefly updated us on the progress of YoungHappy since he enlightened us a year ago with an exciting workshop on how we can easily get far more out of our Smartphones using just a few of the then new apps. YoungHappy currently assists over 30,000 Seniors in Thailand to enjoy their lives, make friends, and definitely improve their own understanding of their

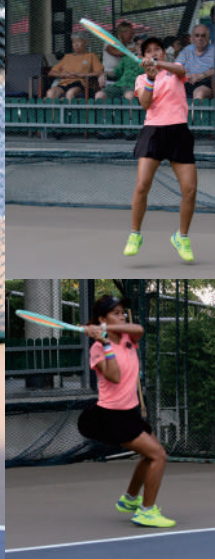
