

It's not worth the risk – jail warning for passengers flying to the UK after increase in cannabis arrests

28 August 2024

The National Crime Agency is warning travellers arriving into the UK from Thailand, Canada and the United States that they face jail sentences if caught attempting to bring cannabis into the country, after a huge increase in arrests.

So far this year, 378 people have been arrested in connection with investigations into cannabis smuggling by air passengers.

An estimated 15 tonnes of cannabis was detected and seized at UK airports in the same period – already around three times more than in the whole of 2023, when approximately 5 tonnes of cannabis was seized and 136 people were arrested.

The 2024 total is a staggering increase on the two tonnes seized in 2022.

More than half of those arrested in 2023 (71) had flown in from US airports, 24 from Thailand and 24 from Canada.

Around half of all arrests (184) this year related to cannabis that originated in Thailand, while 75 arrests related to cannabis originating from Canada, and 47 to cannabis from the US.

People travelling with the drugs as couriers reported being told by their recruiters that they were only risking a fine if caught. However, the maximum sentence for cannabis importation in the UK is up to 14 years in prison.

This year 196 people have already been convicted and handed sentences totalling almost 188 years.

Passengers were most often found to be carrying between 15 and 40 kilos of cannabis inside their checked-in luggage.

In one case, however, 51-year-old Spanish national Fernando Mayans Fuster was caught at Manchester Airport with eight suitcases containing 158 kilos of the drug, after arriving on a flight from Los Angeles in May this year. This is believed to be one of the largest passenger seizures of its kind at Manchester Airport.

Mayans Fuster was jailed for three years and four months at Manchester Minshull Street Crown Court on 19 July.

On 9 August, 11 British passengers were arrested at Birmingham Airport after a total of 510 kilos of cannabis was found inside 28 suitcases. All the passengers had travelled from Thailand, transiting at Paris Charles de Gaulle Airport. They have been bailed until 9 November pending further NCA investigation. Their cases are believed to be linked.

In some instances, officers have recovered electronic trackers with the drugs, believed to have been placed in there by organised criminals at source so they could follow the illicit loads.

NCA experts say the trend is being fuelled by these organised crime gangs who have access to cannabis grown overseas in locations where it is legal, and recruiting couriers to transport it to the UK where it can generate greater profit for them than growing the drugs themselves.

The NCA continues to work with law enforcement partners in both the UK and overseas to target high-risk routes, seize shipments of drugs and disrupt the criminal gangs involved, denying them profits.

NCA Director General of Threats James Babbage said:

"In some cases it is unclear whether the mules knew what the potential penalties are but in most cases they were operating on behalf of organised criminal gangs.

"We would appeal to anyone who is approached to engage in smuggling to think very carefully about the potential consequences of their actions, and the risks they will run.

Notes to editors:

All statistics for 2024 relate to the period 1 January - 12 August 2024.

During 2023 the most common nationalities among couriers were British (56), US (51), and Canadian (16).

Of the 378 people arrested this year – the vast majority of whom were air passengers caught smuggling cannabis through UK airports – British nationals accounted for the highest proportion, followed by Malaysian (93 arrests), Canadian (64), and American (40). A small number of other nationalities were also stopped.

Returning to the UK?

Helping you to plan ahead and understand the key considerations which may affect you

Increasing healthcare costs, circumstance change and redundancy are all some of the reasons that people consider moving back to the UK.

The years of UK political turbulence since the 2016 UK referendum vote, and the last few years of changing leaders and political parties, seem insufficient to keep the homebirds away.

For whatever reason you are thinking about a move back it is crucial to plan-ahead and understand the key considerations which may affect you. This will help lessen the chance of exposing yourself to a significant and perhaps unnecessary tax burden.

Planning your return to the UK

Because of the complex UK tax system relocating is highly important and careful planning is essential. In general, the more notice the better and if possible 6-12 months is normally an ideal timescale to begin the process.

The luxury of time may not be an option for all. Either way you need to understand the consequences of a return when planning as it needs to be right for your personal circumstances both now and into the future.

If you come back to the UK after living abroad, you will usually be classed as UK resident again. This means you pay UK tax on: your UK income and gains, as well as any foreign income and gains. This may not be the case if your permanent home (domicile) remains outside the UK.

You would have remained UK resident anyway if you were abroad less than a full tax year (6 April to 5 April the following year). This means you will usually pay UK tax on foreign income for the entire time you were away.

When to return

There is no ideal time but understanding the UK statutory residency laws is a good start. This will make sure you know when you are likely to become UK tax resident as it is sometimes not as straightforward as it may seem. If you return mid tax year and you have been receiving overseas income, obtaining UK split-tax year treatment is going to be important.

Split Tax Year

You will be resident in the UK for the whole of a tax year, but that year may be split into a UK and an overseas part. This means that when returning to the UK you may be able to split the tax year into one part when you are UK resident, and one when you are not.

There are 8 sets of circumstances when an individual might meet the criteria for split year treatment for a particular tax year. Three cover situations when an individual might go overseas part way through the tax year, which are cases 1-3. Five cover situations where an individual might come to the UK part way through a tax year, which are cases 4-8.

If, in a year in which you are UK resident, there is an actual or deemed departure from the UK, then you will need to consider whether any of the split year cases 4-8 apply.

You must consider all cases of split year that might apply to you. Each has its own set of conditions, and you need to meet all those conditions for the case to apply. If more than one case applies to you the priority ordering rules show which case of split year will apply and what date the year will be split from.

For more information, please refer to the HMRC RDRM12000 guidance on Residence, available on the official UK government website.

If you return to the UK within 5 years

You may have to pay tax on certain income or gains made while you were non-resident. This doesn't include wages or other employment income. These rules (called temporary nonresidence) apply if you return to the UK within 5 years of moving abroad (or 5 full tax years if you left the UK before 6 April 2013) and you were a UK resident in at least 4 of the 7 tax years before you moved.

Chapter 6 of HMRC's guidance note to the Statutory Residence Test is where you can find more information.

Do I need to tell HMRC when I return?

Informing HMRC that you are returning to the UK is very important. And it can be done personally, or by a tax representative/adviser.

It is always recommended that pre-return tax advice is sought, which could be part of an overall package of a pre-and post UK tax advice service.

Considerations for a UK return

There are many and the following are some of the main ones:

- Seek UK tax advice from a professional qualified UK Tax Adviser. This is arguably the most important to make sure you understand when you may become UK tax resident.
- Seek tax advice in Thailand to make sure that you leave without any tax liability remaining.
- UK Bank account do you still have one? If not speak to your previous UK bank first as in the absence of any recent credit history it may be awkward to open a new account with a bank where you have no history.
- Understand foreign pension provision clarify if it be withdrawn prior to a return and prior to becoming UK tax resident, and in particular, can benefits be taken as a lump sum.

- Review currency exchange rates if transferring significant amounts find an economical way as there are many options available these days.
- Review investment funds they could be Reporting or Non-Reporting which are taxed differently in the UK. The former liable to Capital Gains Tax (CGT), the latter Income Tax (IT). At time of writing UK CGT rates are lower than UK IT rates so this can be important.
- **UK property** give tenants the correct notice and refer to the current landlord responsibility rules that apply in the UK as part of the 2023/2024 Renters' Reform Bill changes.
- Healthcare in the UK NHS Hospital treatment is free for those ordinarily resident in the UK on a lawful and properly settled basis, it applies immediately for someone returning permanently.
- Schools research what schools are available, children must be physically present to enroll.
- **Insurance** consider all your insurance, general (motor, home), and personal (private medical insurance, life assurance, and critical illness). Personal insurance is normally cheaper in the UK as there is a wide and competitive marketplace.
- Driving license/eligibility check your UK License is still valid if your UK absence has been more than a few years.

This is a complex matter, and mistakes can be costly. Returning to the UK is a big step so plan ahead both personally and financially. Progeny have helped many people relocate to

We continue the story of the British Club Bangkok ... **1977**

"Associate Membership"

The Club's constitution required two Extraordinary General Meetings to be held to approve the introduction of "Associate Membership", that is membership for nationalities other than Australian, British, Canadian and New Zealander.

The first was held on 27th January which was minuted as 'passed' but without the numbers actually being recorded. The confirmation EGM on 28th February passed the motion by 177 votes to eight, with most votes being proxy votes. The motion, having passed the two-thirds threshold, was submitted to the Ministry of the Interior to become part of the constitution.

Our first Associate Member, and also our first Thai Member, elected in the June, was Khun Pravit Purananda. Educated at Cheltenham College, Khun Pravit worked initially for the British Overseas Airways Corporation (BOAC) then British Airways until 1978 when he set up Prestige Travel with four prominent Club members. A member of Bangkok South Rotarians for over 28 years, he was their President 1978-79. Sadly, Khun Pravit passed on in 2009 aged 70.

Our Naval Year

At the end of January, for a few days, the Club extended to the crew of HMAS Vendetta (D08), a Daring-

Sporting Matters

In the March, the inaugural round of the Ladies Golf Gestetner Eclectic golf tournament was played.

In the June, the Darts Section (aka the 'Lillywhites') held a Queen Elizabeth II Silver Jubilee darts competition with Darts Captain Brian Heath winning the Castrol Cup. The tournament became an annual event until 1986 when a separate Ladies cup was inaugurated, and the Castrol Cup became the Men's trophy.

In July, the inaugural Club Squash Handicap Championship was held, designed to complement the Don Johnston Cup in the annual calendar. This Championship was later renamed after Tom Annas, a long serving Squash player who passed away in 2014. Also in this month, the Australian Junior Tour Group from the Lawn Tennis Professionals Association of Australia played a series of Exhibition Matches then battled against members of the Club. Sadly, there was no record kept of any of the scores!

In the August, the Golf Section played the inaugural tournament of the Davidson Cup, donated by James Davidson, between the Captain's team and the immediate Past Captain's team.

December was busy ... the Golf Section played, for the first recorded time, the "Kiwi Cup" against



members of the New Zealand community. The trophy was presented by H.E. Richard Taylor, the New Zealand Ambassador, and it was, in fact, a sheepskin rug as he could not find a sheepskin cup!!! Finally, the newly created Thailand Squash Racket Association organised the first Thailand Squash League with ten teams: four from the British Club Bangkok, four from the Royal Bangkok Sports Club, and two from Vajiravudh College.

The Long-Range Plan

In the February, an Extraordinary General Meeting was called to discuss and approve the Long-Range Plan of the Club. Thirteen projects were agreed and at the Annual General Meeting at the end of the month, a 2 million Baht overdraft was agreed to fund some of these.

To this end, in early March 'The Bar' [in 2024: Veranda] was closed for a full refit and a temporary bar was opened, with temporary air-conditioning, in the 'Reading Room' [in 2024: Pool Room]. The 'Reading Room' itself was moved upstairs to the 'Cinema Room' [in 2024: the Suriwongse Room]. In June, the refit was completed, and the Bar re-opened with the temporary air-conditioning left in the now located back Reading Room.

Sadly, this was the only work done in this year as it became obvious by October that the Club was generating insufficient cash surplus to fund any further work.

LONG RANGE PLAN

The following Resolutions were passed at the Extraordinary General Meeting held on Thursday 10 February 1977.

- " The Long Range Plan Schedule of Projects is accepted as the basis for the long term development of the Club."
- The initial phases of the Long Range Plan are to include the following projects:
 - a. Improvements to the Clubhouse Bar.
 - b. The building of a new Office and Store complex.
 c. Conversion of the existing Office to a Reading Room and Library.
 - d. Renewal of the mains supply wiring system.
 - e. Relocation of the Poolside kitchen, stores and ground floor toilets.
 - f. Conversion of the Reading Room to a Billiard Room.
 - g. Construction of a Ladies Toilet and Changing Room in the Clubhouse on the ground floor.
 - Room in the Clubhouse on the ground floor.
 h. Conversion of the Billiard Room to a Reception
 - and Special Functions Room.
 - Construction of a new Mechanical and Store room on the first floor rear balcony of the Clubhouse.
 - j. Improvements to the Clubhouse Dining Room.
 - k. Improvements to the Clubhouse Kitchen.Improvements to the Clubhouse Entrance
 - 1. Improvements to the Clubhouse Entrance Hall.
 - m. Construction of two all weather Tennis Courts."



Service

Mr. Nigel Overy continued as Chairman [see Past Particle, March 2023] with Mr. Charles S. Stewart again as Vice-Chairman [see Past Particle, August 2024]. There was no Honorary Secretary appointed, and Mr. Walter G. Ford served as Honorary Treasurer, in his only term of service. However, Mr. Ford took 'home leave' for two months in the summer, so Mr. Peter Adcock was co-opted to act up as treasurer. Mr. Adcock had first served on the committee in 1966 [see Past Particle, November 2023] but in an anomaly, upon Mr. Ford's return he remained on the committee which then had eleven persons for the rest of the year.

Continuing their service were Mr. John P.D. Gandy from the previous year; Mr. Ivan W. Garfoot who also served in 1968 [see Past Particle, January 2024]; and by co-option, Mr. Tom L. Barratt who would serve six terms [see Past Particle, September 2023]. Completing their service were Mr. Geoff S. Smith and Mr. M.F. de Vries, the latter of whom resigned in the May.

The first "new boys" were Mr. Arthur W. Hawtin in his first of three terms, and Mr. Les V. Vize in his first of two terms, the second as Vice-Chairman. Then finally there were Mr. R.A. Sheddon who served part of this term then went Absent and Mr. J. Weymouth who was co-opted and served this term only.

Club News

In the January, the General Committee agreed to allow core nationality Missionaries use of Club as Temporary non-fee-paying members – today they are classified as 'Concessionary Temporary Members'.

Also in the January, the General Committee bestowed upon Lt. Col. (Retd.) Hugh Docherty OBE an Honorary Membership for his service to the Club, including four years as chairman.

The General Committee agreed in August that all books of coupons, sold to non-members who are authorised to use the Club, would be surcharged by 10 Baht. Thus, a standard coupon book with coupons worth 90 Baht would now cost 100 Baht!

In the November, Royal Automobile Club became the Club's first Reciprocal Club in the United Kingdom.

In Other News

In the February, the Suriwongse Road became a oneway street from the junction of Naret Road to Charoen Krung Road. The General Committee thus closed the Suriwongse Gate mid-evening but kept the Silom Gate open. Col A.D. Crabtree became the British Military Attaché in the May and joined the Club in the November.

1977 was the Silver Jubilee year of H.M. Queen Elizabeth II and thus a series of celebrations were the order of the day. First of all there was a Service of Celebration at Christ Church conducted by Revd. Canon John Taylor OBE; then there was a Garden Party at the British Embassy lead by H.E. Sir David Cole, the British Ambassador and catered by the Club; and finally there was a Family Day including a huge Swimming Gala at the British Club.

On 30th June, SEATO (the Southeast Asia Treaty Organization), the SE Asian version of NATO, based in Bangkok, ceased operation after 23 years.

The JEATH War Museum became the first such museum at the River Kwai site in Kanchanaburi. The acronym stands for Japanese, English, Australian, American, Thai and Holland, being the nationalities involved in building the bridge.

The American Club (Country Branch), Tai Tam, Hong Kong

Visited April 2023 by Paul Doust and Prasit Jangkamol (a.k.a. Jack)

The American Club in Hong Kong is one club with two branches which are called the Town Club and the <u>Country</u> <u>Club</u>. When the Town Club was reviewed in the <u>August 2023 edition of Outpost</u>, a review of the Country Club was promised on another occasion, so here it is.

As mentioned in the review last year, the American Club was founded in 1925, but the Country Club only opened its doors in July 1987. The club is perched on a cliff with great views over Tai Tam bay on the edge of Stanley, and is around a 25 minute drive south-east from the Town Club. Either branch can issue temporary membership cards given the letter of introduction from British Club Bangkok, together with the other documentation that the club requires. However, only two temporary membership cards can be issued per year, and once issued the card is valid for 14 days.

The Country Club has lots of facilities. The sporting facilities include an indoor fitness centre, 6 outdoor tennis courts, and a 30 metre outdoor swimming pool. The pool is 1.2 metres deep at one end, 2.4 metres deep in the middle and 1.4 metres deep at the other end. The catering facilities include the Tides coffee bar which has both indoor and outdoor seating, the large indoor Bay Café which has a sushi bar attached, an outdoor sports bar called Ricks, and the Southside Pool & Grill which is outside next to the swimming pool. All those catering facilities



are very informal but there's also a slightly more formal restaurant called The Fireside which restricts access for children on some days of the week. Additionally the club has a wine shop, a ballroom for hosting events, and a Spa called 'Elements'. The spa costs HK\$ 400 per hour for a private sheltered outdoor area which has a steam room and a jacuzzi overlooking Tai Tam bay. However, the club has no accommodation, although it does have a yacht called Screaming Eagle that can be hired. The dress code throughout the club is casual.

The club also has a couple of facilities aimed at children. For younger children there's The Eagle's Nest, which is a 10,000 square foot three-storey play space with plenty of toys, arts and crafts. For teenagers there's Chill & Joe's which has big screen TVs, loads of video games facilities, a pool table, and a counter where soft drinks and snacks can be bought using a junior supplementary member card. We were told that there tend to be a lot of children in the club at weekends.

We had our temporary membership cards issued at the Town Club, so on arrival at the Country Club the security immediately let us into the club where we spoke to the receptionist. To our surprise the receptionist turned out to be Thai and had grown up in Bangkok. She was on her own and so she was unable to leave the desk to show us round the club, but she gave us a rough idea of where all the facilities were. We had brought our swimming gear and had been hoping to relax outside by the pool, but by the time we arrived it wasn't an appealing prospect because the weather had become a bit rainy. When we were looking round the club, the Bay Café had been quite busy with families eating lunch, but by mid-afternoon there were plenty of free tables. We settled for afternoon tea on a table by the window with great views of Tai Tam Bay.

The American Club's Country Club branch has a very comfortable and friendly atmosphere, and apart from all the facilities, is also a great place for entertaining children and teenagers.

EVENT REPORT:

Trip to the National Museum and the Museum of Contemporary Art: 29th August 2024

A small but very lively and interested group left the Club for the short journey to the National Museum at Sanam Luang where we met our volunteer guide Peter. Stopping first in front of the 'Long Song' pavilion (built during the reign of King Rama 1 and moved to its current location from the Grand Palace), Peter explained in detail the various historical, religious, and cultural characteristics of the design in this beautiful Royal Pavilion. We then moved on to the highly significant religious and historical Buddhisawan Chapel (Not a Temple as there are no Monks assigned to reside there) and its sacred and revered buddha image the 'Phra Phuttha Sihing', believed to have been brought to Thailand from Sri Lanka during the Sukhothai Period. Peter spent quite some time explaining the various ancient murals located around the interior chapel walls as they depicted the various lives of Buddha as set out in the **Jataka Tales**.



We then moved on to the Royal Funeral Chariots exhibition hall where we enjoyed a brief sit down as Peter explained the history of the various stupendously attractive and huge exhibits. We marveled at the designs and workmanship on display before moving on to visit the Praphat Piphitthapan Building that on 2 floors showcased Thai archeology from the 13th century Lanna Period through to the Rattanakosin (Bangkok) Period, before our allotted trip time was up. We ended the tour by thanking Peter for imparting his truly extensive knowledge in such an engaging and interesting manner.

Boarding our minibus took us on the short journey to the Rongros Restaurant, located riverside opposite Wat Arun (The Temple of the Dawn). Whilst a little cramped for space, this slight impediment was far more than overcome by the restaurant's super ambience and quality service, but particularly by the truly excellent, tasty, and abundant food that was served.

The journey from Sanam Luang almost to Rangsit only took some 30 minutes and we arrived at MOCA right on our scheduled time, thus allowing 90 minutes to explore the 5 floors of exhibits on display at this privately owned museum. The wonders commenced when we alighted from the minibus to see the shape and design of the exterior of the building before entering, and these wonders endured as we travelled downwards from the 'International Collections' set out in the 5th Floor, through the 4th Floor collection of works from the most renowned and famous Thai national artists. The 3rd Floor showcased themes of imagination and fantasy as composed by contemporary Thai artists. The 2nd Floor was dedicated to 'Religion, Faiths, and Beliefs' with displays of over 200 Ramayana and other Asian masks, and on the 1st Floor we saw the permanent exhibitions of important National Artists. We gathered together in the excellent Coffee Shop and enjoyed their specialty beverages and very tasty cakes before we embarked on the minibus for the journey back to the British Club.

EVENT REPORT:

"A New Era in Thai Train Tourism": 16th September 2024



Section Chairperson Terry introduced our youngest ever speaker, Khun Wanwit Niampan, the Assistant Chief of the State Railways of Thailand's Foreign Relations Department, who was making his first ever presentation to an audience in English.

With an almost flawless diction and a large and well spoken English vocabulary, using an excellent series of slides with superb photographs and graphics all in the English language, he quickly took us through the events that lead from the establishment of the first railways in Thailand in the 1890's (thanks to a toy train set that Queen Victoria sent to King Rama V in 1866 which piqued the King's interest!). Then through to the current status of train lines covering the country, the passenger services and hardware provided, the track extensions currently being built and those planned in the near future through massive state financial investments. He then turned to the types of passenger carriages that are currently available, and then highlighted a number of popular train trips to tourist attractions located around the country , including their current pricing.

Khun Wanwit then turned to the very recent introduction of two key "Tourist Trains" - The Japanese donated and refurbished KIHA-183 4-carriage diesel multiple unit sets, of which 2 sets are currently in use and a 3rd undergoing trials. Proudly turning to the brand new "Royal Blossom" luxury tourist train comprising 5 carriages with multiple seating options and including an observation and refreshment car at the rear. All are superbly finished with all conveniences to a high standard, and also provide a good number of seating options including private rooms for 6 people. A second "Royal Blossom" train has only just been put into service. He noted that at present, all these new 'Tourist Trains' are fully booked within hours of tickets becoming available, such is the current high levels of interest and popularity.

His closing slides highlighted the availability for organisations to hire complete "Saloon" coaches that can be added to any scheduled train. These "Saloon" coaches had various fit-outs from conventional seating through to a boardroom style.

Khun Wanwit, in addition to accepting some British Club mementos of his outstanding visit, deservedly received many complimentary comments on not only the quality of the information imparted, but also on his impressive presentation skills.

What resonated most with the 30 attendees was Khun Wanwit's absolute passion for all things 'railway and trains' in Thailand. We could all see that his childhood trainspotting hobby had, after his university education, turned into a career, and that with his gift in so ably articulating his message that was so well received, he would go far as his career with the SRT progressed.



You would have to agree that USTA is more credible than I could ever be, so I quote, "Multiple studies have found that tennis is the healthiest sport in the world, adding some 9.7 years to tennis players' lives when compared to sedentary individuals...and more longevity than other sports. Additionally, playing tennis can lower the risk of heart disease by up to 50%, and improve balance, mental acuity, speed and sense of social connection, showing that getting out on the tennis court



can improve your quality of life in many ways." These conclusions emerged from a longitudinal study in Denmark called Copenhagen City Heart Study (CCHS), that followed 8500 persons for 25 years and found evidence backing the claim that tennis adds 9.7 years to a person's life. ²

Now to all those with slightly sceptical bend – what about the other sports? Here are comparisons from the same research: Health club activities – 1.5 years; Calisthenics – 3.1; Running/Jogging – 3.2; Swimming – 3.4; Cycling – 3.7; Soccer – 4.7; Badminton – 6.2; and Tennis – 9.7 years! The choice is yours. An interesting finding was that sports with social interaction or fun with others like tennis, lead to greater benefits and thus longer life expectancy. This aspect will be explored further in the future from another huge research study.
